June 9, 1999 - ** COMMITTEE VOTE ** HR1167. Indian Health Services Contracts/Substitute Amendment. Miller, D-Calif., substitute amendment that would clarify that the bill refers to all procurent regulations; clarify that Indian tribes administering their own programs are eligible to receive reduced rate pharmaceuticals; and clarify that tribes choosing to store their records at the Federal Records Center are not automatically making those records subject to the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act. Adopted by voice vote June 9, 1999. (Congressional Record p. D639)

June 9, 1999 - ** COMMITTEE VOTE ** HR1167. Indian Tribe Health Services/Vote to Report. Direct the secretary of Health and Human Services to establish and carry out a program within the Indian Health Service to give Alaskan and Indian native tribes self-governance. Give an additional 50 tribes that meet the eligibility criteria, along with those already involved in the pilot program, self-governance. Specify that the qualified applicant pool would consist of each Indian tribe that has successfully completed the planning phase, has requested participation in self-governance by resolution or other official action by the governing body and has demonstrated, for the previous three fiscal years, financial stability and financial management capability. Require each eligible tribe to complete a planning phase that would include legal and budgetary research and internal tribal government planning relating to the administration of health care programs. Require the participating tribe and HHS to enter into a written compact to set forth general terms of

the government relationship. Require a written funding agreement with each Indian tribe participating, authorizing the tribe to plan, conduct, administer and receive full tribal share funding, include shares of Indian Health Service competitive grants, carried out for the benefit of Indians. Allow Indians to redesign or consolidate programs in any manner the tribe deems to be in the best interest of the health and welfare of the community, only if such action does not have the effect of denying eligibility of service. Prohibit the secretary from waiving, modifying or diminishing the trust responsibility of the United States with respect to tribes and individuals. Direct the secretary to transfer to the Indian tribe all funds provided for in the funding agreement, to be determined in an amount equal to the amount the Indian tribe would have been entitled to receive under self-determination contracts. Authorize such sums as are necessary. As amended in the nature of a substitute. Reported favorably to the full House by voice vote June 9, 1999. (Congressional Record p. <u>D639</u>)
