

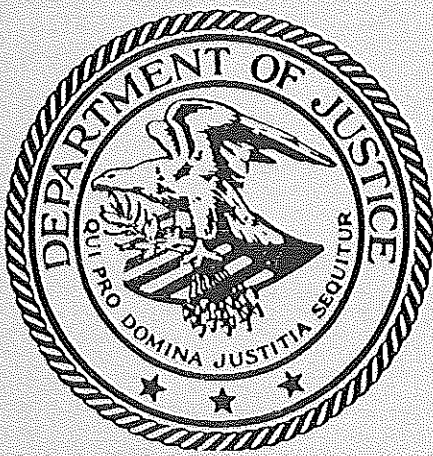

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UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS' STATISTICAL REPORT
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1957

During Fiscal Year 1957, United States Attorneys succeeded in reducing the number of court cases pending in their offices for the third successive year, maintained a high rate of collections, and reported a substantial increase in the amount of money saved in suits against the government.

23,344 cases were pending at the close of the year which is a reduction of 909 from the 24,253 pending as of June 30, 1956, and is the lowest amount pending since June 30, 1941 when 20,869 cases were pending.

The total number of cases and matters pending totalled 50,080 and represents a 33.2 per cent decrease from the 74,972 cases and matters pending as of August 31, 1954 when the Department's backlog drive was commenced.

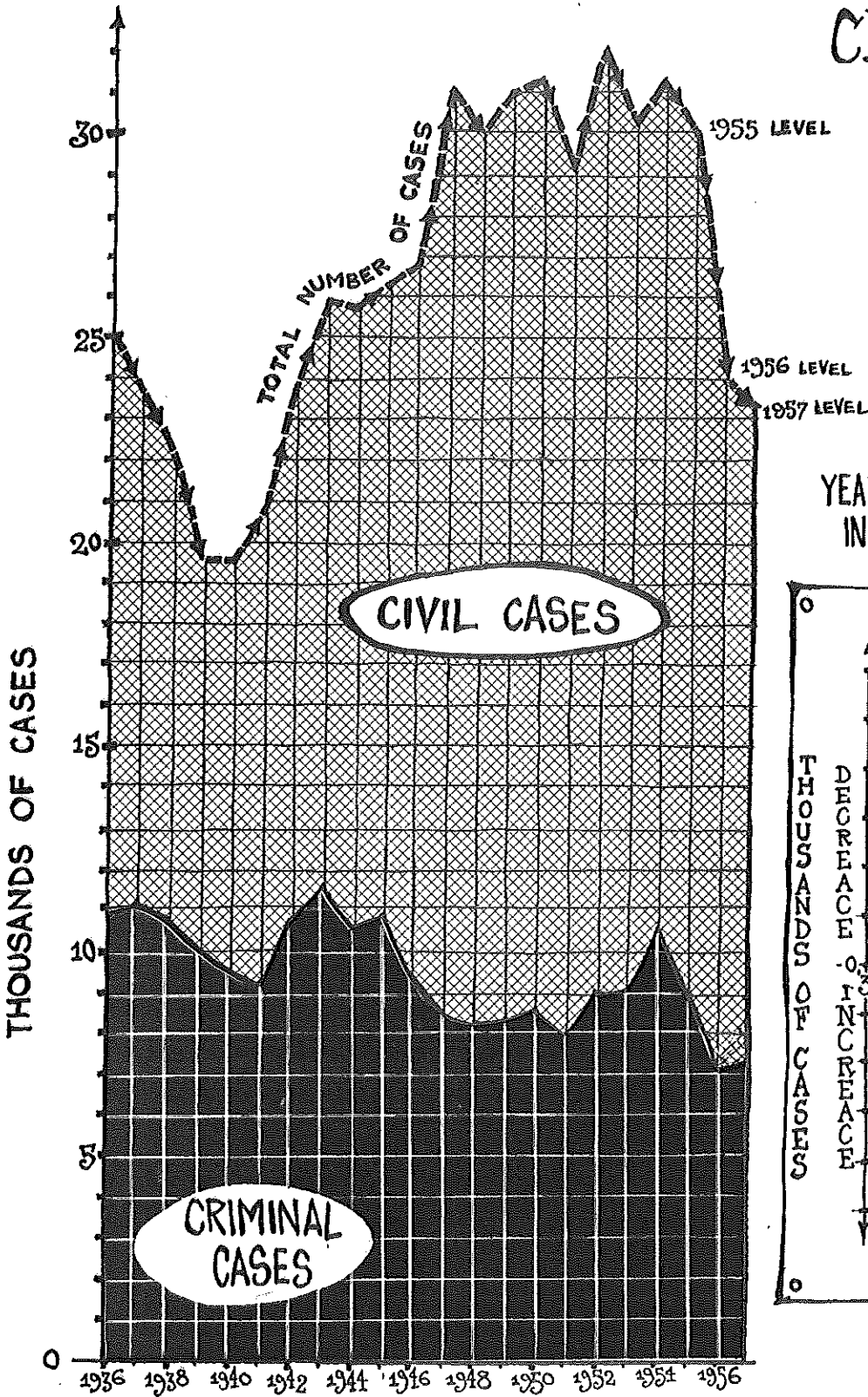
Collections amounted to \$36,092,218. While this is a decrease of \$5,942,570 from the record-breaking total of \$42,034,788 collected in the previous fiscal year, it is the second highest total in the history of the Department.

\$44,108,371 was saved by United States Attorneys in 1,288 suits in which the government was sued for \$53,675,175. This is an increase of 11.1 per cent over the \$39,701,498 saved during Fiscal Year 1956.

YEAR-TO-YEAR CHANGE IN CASES PENDING

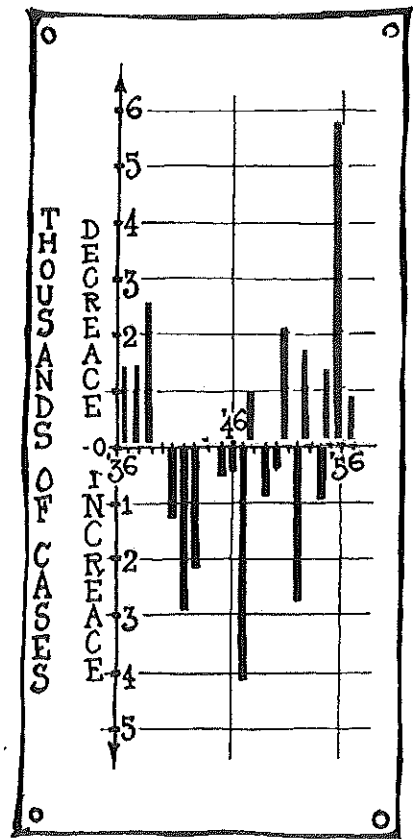
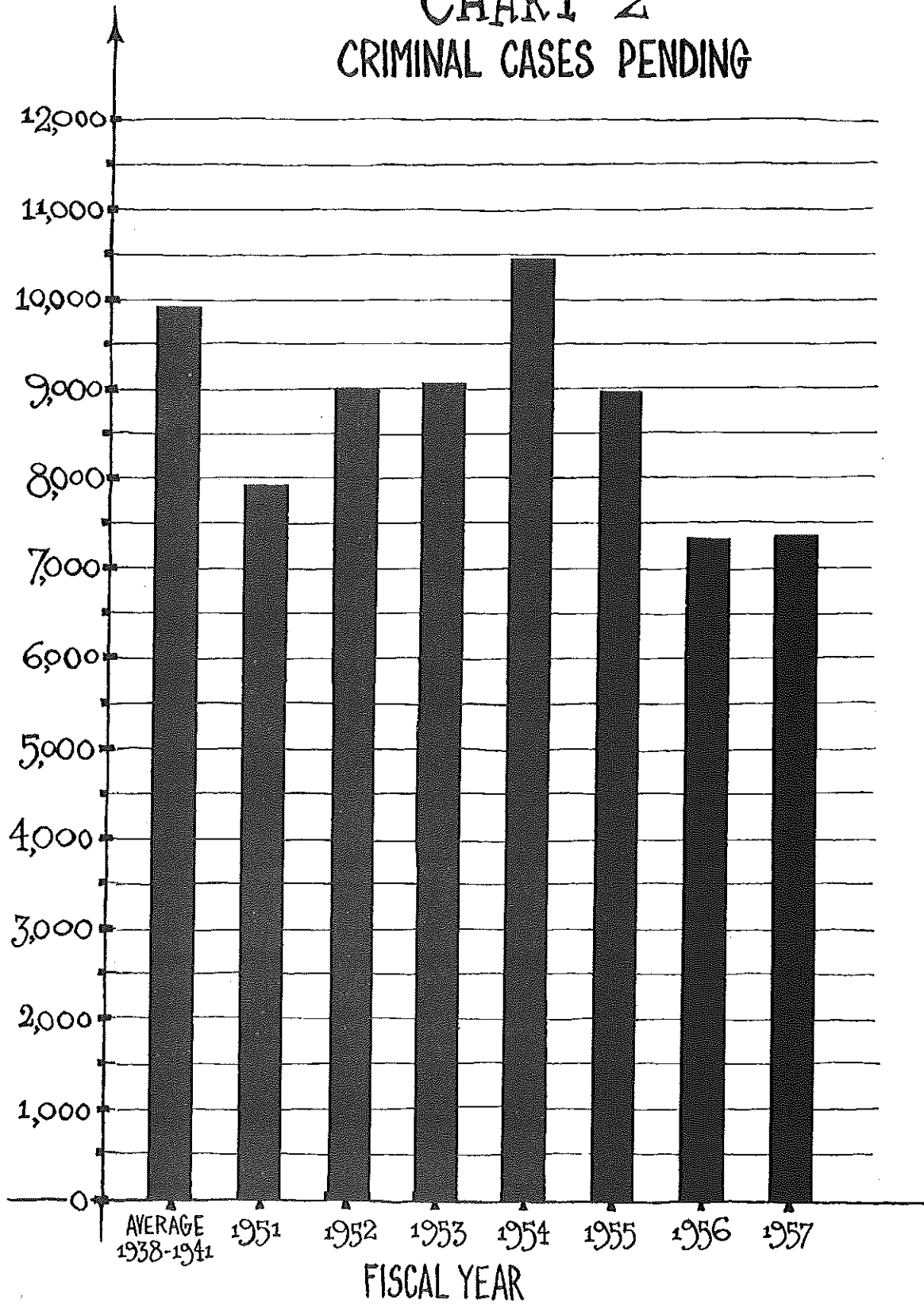

(As of June 30, 1957)

7,411 Criminal cases were pending as of June 30, 1957 which is an increase of 70 cases over the number pending at the close of the previous fiscal year, and next to the 7,341 cases pending on June 30, 1956 is the lowest number pending since June 30, 1889 when 7,212 cases were pending. This indicates that United States Attorneys are getting to a "hard-core" of pending Criminal cases.

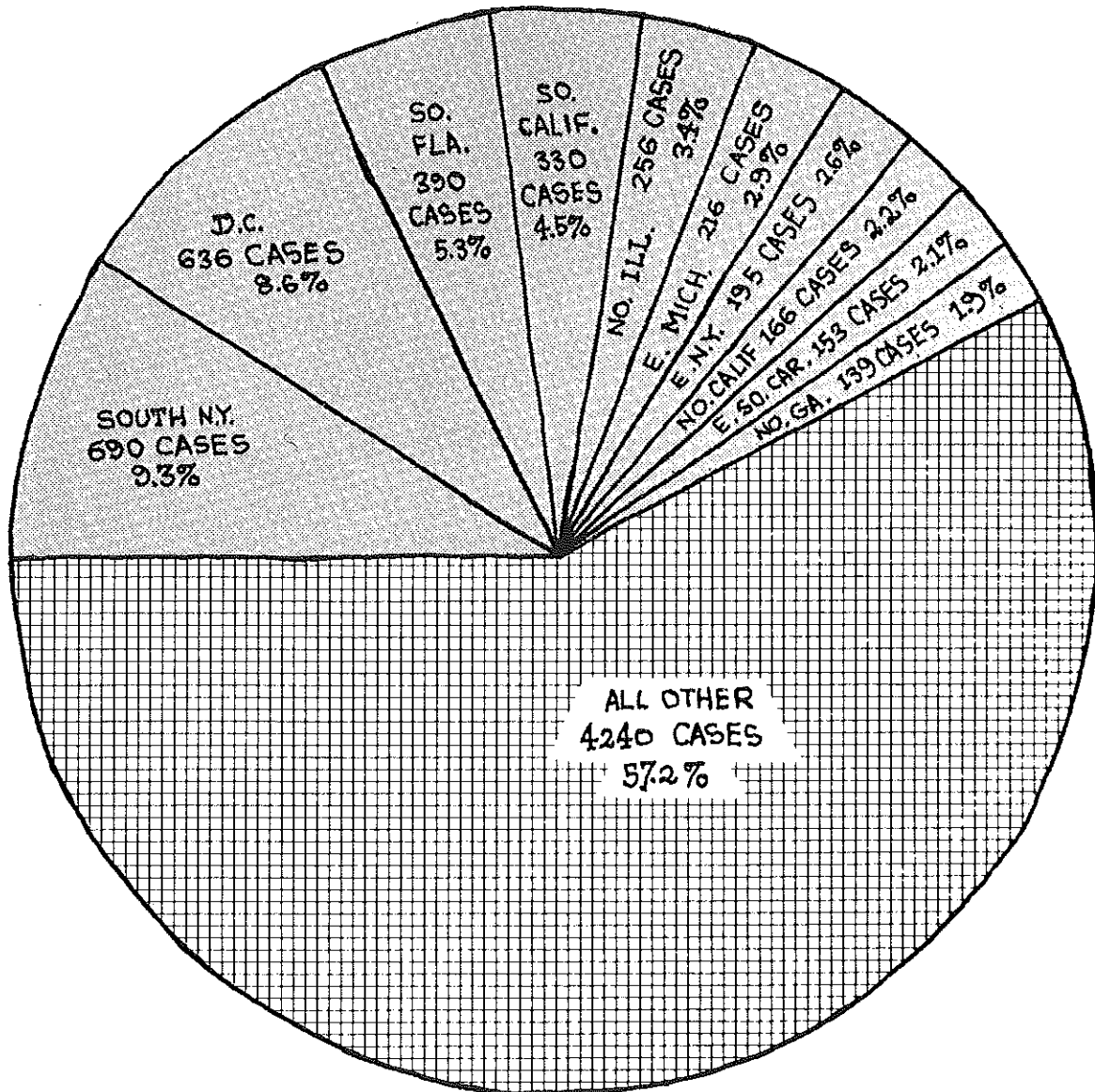
3,171 of the 7,411 cases are in ten districts. This is just 8 less than were in the top ten districts at the close of Fiscal Year 1956.

Increases in the number of cases pending occurred in 40 districts, and decreases in 49 districts while 5 districts had the same number pending that they had as of June 30, 1956. Table 10 in the appendix gives a comparison of the number of cases pending as of June 30, 1956 and 1957 as well as the per cent of increase or decrease of 1957 over 1956.

2,029 or 27.4 per cent of these cases are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of United States Attorneys, e.g. fugitives. 313 in the District of Columbia and 250 in Southern New York comprise 27.8 per cent of the cases in this category.

The following table and Chart 4 show that 10 types of cases with 4,615 represents 62.3 per cent of the total. By comparison, that same group represented 59.1 per cent of the total cases pending as of June 30, 1956. Pending Criminal Tax and Narcotics cases increased by 146 and 126 cases, respectively. For the first time since Fiscal Year 1954, Liquor Law violations did not constitute the largest number of cases pending according to offense. National Stolen Property Act cases with 792 or 10.7 per cent of the total was the largest group as of June 30, 1957.

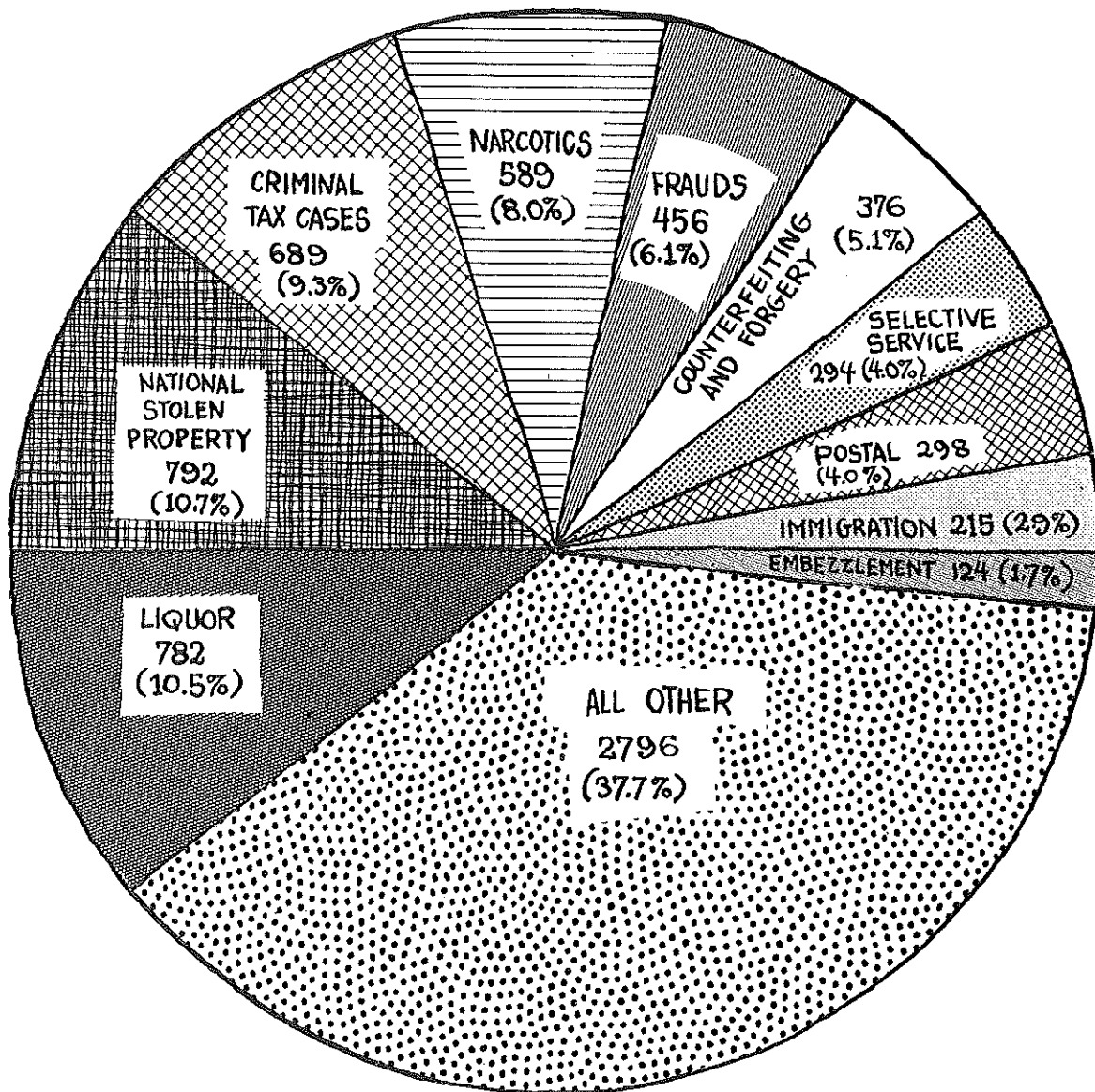

Of the 7,411 Criminal cases pending as of June 30, 1957, 5,382 or 72.6 per cent are in a triable status. This is an increase over the number of such cases as of June 30, 1956 when 5,185 or 70.6 per cent were in a triable status and 2,156 or 29.4 per cent were in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of United States Attorneys. As the following table indicates, 92.2 per cent of these cases have been in the same status for less than one year as compared to 91.0 per cent in this category as of June 30, 1956.

Of the 5,382 triable cases, 1,193 are awaiting arraignment in court, 2,301 are awaiting trial or trial is in progress and 849 are awaiting sentence. Slight changes, percentagewise, have taken place in the age of pending Criminal cases pending as of June 30, 1957 when compared with June 30, 1956. In two of the age brackets, less than six months and one to two years the percentages were identical with those at the close of Fiscal Year 1956, namely, 39.9 and 17.7 per cent respectively.

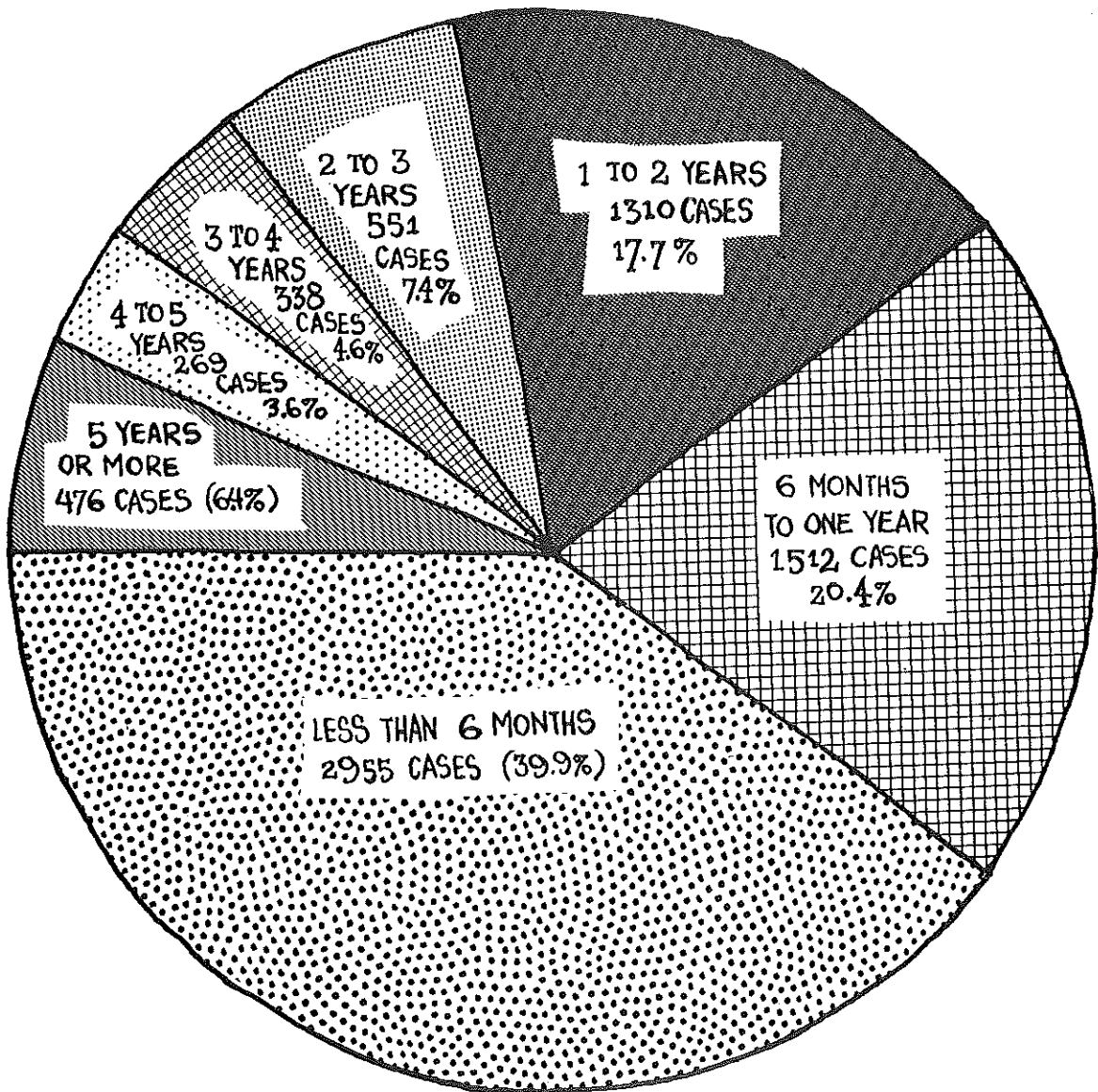
1,500 or 50.9 per cent of the 2,944 cases that are more than one year old are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of United States Attorneys. Of the 1,500 cases, 549 are in three districts, namely the District of Columbia with 240, Southern Florida with 83 and Southern New York with 226.

The following table gives a comparison of the cases pending in various age groups as of June 30, 1956 and June 30, 1957. Chart 5 shows the number as well as the percentage in each group as of June 30, 1957.

The number of Criminal complaints pending as of June 30, 1957 was 11,989 which is a slight decrease of 51 from the 12,040 complaints pending at the close of the previous fiscal year. 5,112 or 42.6 per cent of the total complaints pending are in ten districts, and 7,767 or 64.8 per cent are in twenty five districts.

Substantial decreases in complaints pending took place in Massachusetts and Southern Texas where the decreases numbered 155 and 285 respectively. On the other hand increases of 207 and 147 may be noted for the District of Columbia and Northern Illinois, respectively, in the following table.

Following is a list in rank order of districts with the largest amount of pending complaints as of June 30, 1957 compared with the number pending in those districts on June 30, 1956.

Where 65.2 per cent or 7,853 complaints were pending in twelve offenses as of June 30, 1956, 69.2 per cent or 8,298 are pending in those same offenses as of June 30, 1957. At the close of Fiscal Year 1956, National Stolen Property Act complaints had the largest volume and as of June 30, 1957 this offense again had the greatest volume with 1,918 or 16.0 per cent of the total. Following is a table showing complaints pending by those offenses as of June 30, 1956 and 1957.

Of the 11,989 complaints involving 16,177 defendants pending in United States Attorneys' Offices 3,016 or 25.2 per cent of the total are awaiting completion of investigation. Prosecution is under consideration in 2,140 or 17.8 per cent of the complaints, and 3,121 or 26.0 per cent are awaiting grand jury action or the filing of information. The table below gives a comparison of the number of complaints pending in certain status groups as of June 30, 1957 and 1956, and the table on the following page gives a breakdown of the length of time complaints pending on June 30, 1957 have been in a particular status group.

68.9 per cent or 8,257 of the 11,989 complaints pending on June 30, 1957 are less than six months old since date of receipt in United States Attorneys' Offices. In the complaints that are a year or more old, there is little change percentagewise from the previous fiscal year when 18.1 per cent were in that category whereas 17.9 per cent are now in that age group. 2,249 or 18.8 per cent of those complaints are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of United States Attorneys. 1,042 of the 2,153 that are more than one year old are in five districts, namely Southern California - 94, District of Columbia - 263, Massachusetts - 89, Eastern Michigan - 133, and Southern New York - 463. Following is a table showing the number of complaints in each age category as well as the number and per cent of fugitives in each of these groups.

CRIMINAL CASES AND MATTERS FILED

For the year ending June 30, 1957, 31,554* cases involving 40,679 defendants were filed. This is exactly the same as the number of cases filed during the previous fiscal year. Immigration cases filed in the five districts bordering on Mexico decreased to 1,507 from the 2,864 filed in Fiscal Year 1956. Thus, by excluding these cases, an increase of 1,357 or 4.7 per cent took place. Of these 31,554 cases, 14,341 were filed by indictment, 13,552 by information, 1,498 by transfer from other districts and 2,163 by other methods such as removal from State Courts, etc.

Chart 6 gives a comparison filed by Fiscal Year from 1952 through 1957. Southern California with 1,700 including 521 Immigration cases had the largest number of cases filed. The District of Columbia with 1,385 and Southern Florida with 1,225 had next highest totals in cases filed.

During the year, United States Attorneys received 99,201** criminal complaints involving 126,173 defendants. This is an increase of 7,763 or 8.5 per cent over the 91,438 complaints received in the previous fiscal year. 36,575 or 36.9 per cent of the 99,201 complaints were filed in eleven districts having a volume of 2,000 or more complaints while 65,947 or 66.5 per cent of these were filed in 33 districts having a volume of 1,000 or more complaints.

CRIMINAL CASES FILED

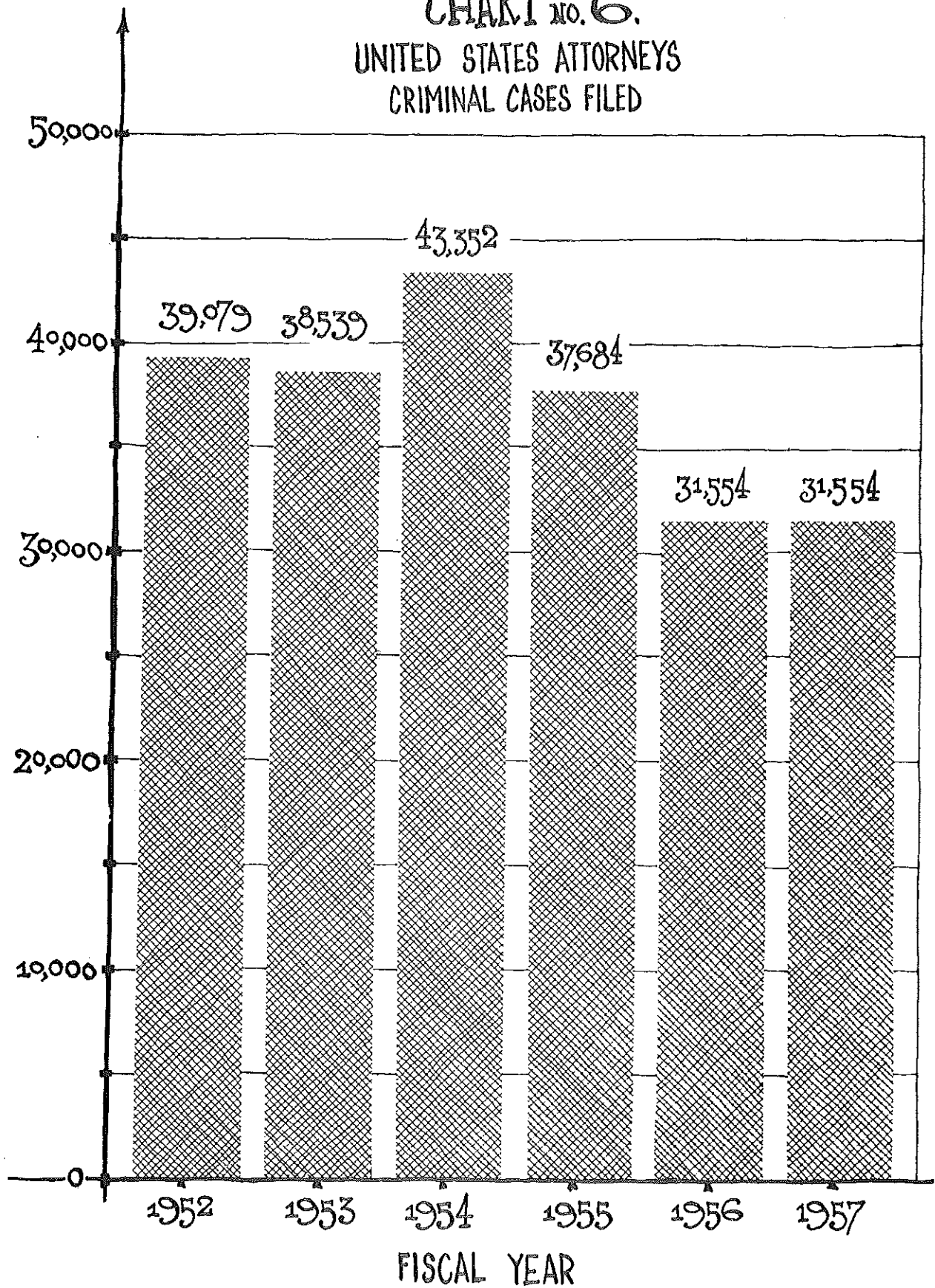


Chart 7 groups the cases filed according to offense by major categories for Fiscal Years 1942 to 1957 inclusive. It may be noted that Immigration violations decreased substantially. Where this offense had the largest number for several years due to the large number of wetback cases in the five districts on the Mexican border, three other offenses, National Stolen Property, Liquor Laws and Counterfeiting and Forgery with 5,365, 3,693 and 2,291 respectively had a larger number in Fiscal Year 1957. Criminal Tax cases continued to increase and totalled 1,346 or 249 more than the 1,097 such cases filed in Fiscal Year 1956. Narcotics violations increased from 1,302 to 1,567.

The table on the next page shows the number of cases filed in major categories, and the number of defendants in these cases.

Grand Jury proceedings handled by United States Attorneys amounted to 15,197, an increase of 323 over the 14,874 handled in Fiscal Year 1956. Ten districts listed below had 6,521 or 42.9 per cent of the total grand jury proceedings for Fiscal Year 1957. Table number 7 in the Appendix gives figures as to the number of grand jury proceedings reported by each United States Attorneys' Office.

CRIMINAL CASES FILED

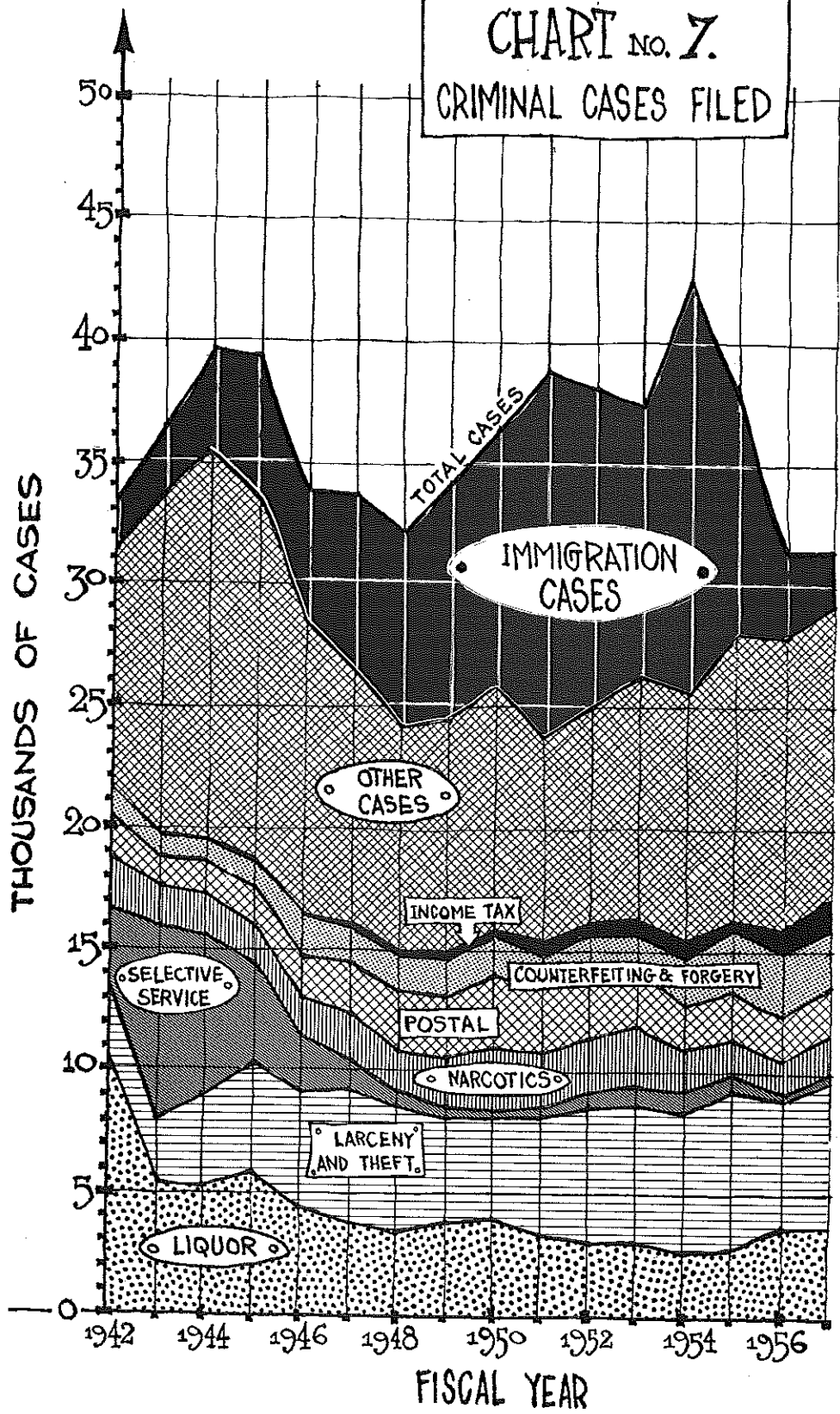
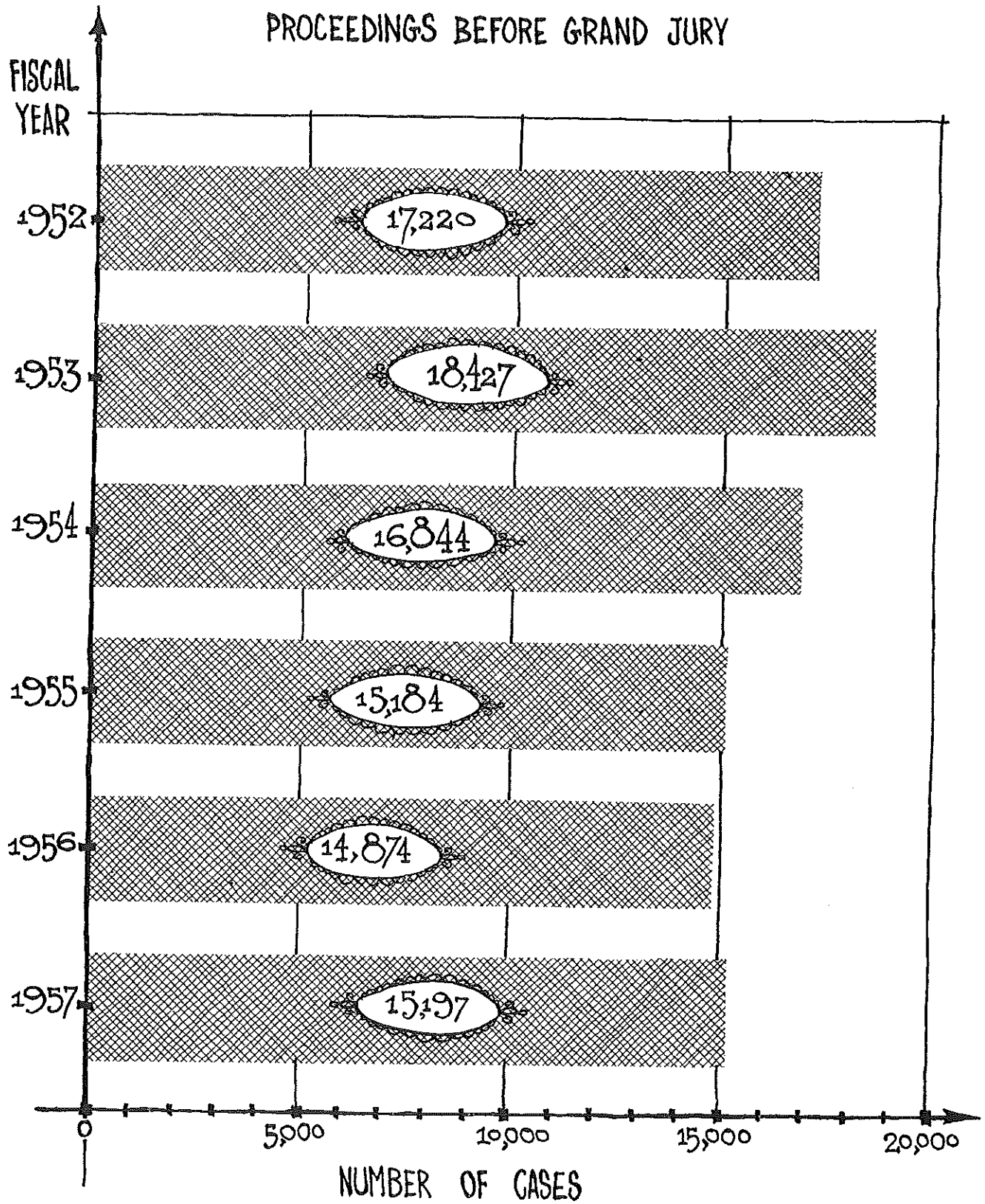

United States Attorneys and their staffs closed 31,687 Criminal cases* involving 40,898 defendants. This is a decrease of 1,701 or 5.1 per cent as compared with the number terminated in Fiscal Year 1956. However, by excluding the 1,601 routine Immigration cases terminated in the five Mexican border districts, the decrease was only 313 or 1.03 per cent. By eliminating the 1,721 cases transferred under Rule 20 to other districts, 86.6 per cent or 25,938 of the remaining 29,966 cases resulted in convictions while 2.8 or 827 were found not guilty after trial. Court or jury trials took place in 3,117 cases involving 4,512 defendants, and convictions were obtained in 2,281 or 73.2 per cent of those cases involving 3,283 defendants.

Of the 67,981 Criminal complaints closed without reaching court dockets 59,894 or 88.1 per cent involving 75,708 defendants were closed by declination of prosecution. Chart 9 shows a comparison of the number of cases closed for Fiscal Years 1951 to 1957. Table 2 in the Appendix gives a breakdown by district of the methods of disposition of Criminal cases and defendants. Table 3 furnishes a breakdown of the disposition of defendants according to type of offense.

Chart 10 gives a comparison of the number of Criminal cases tried for Fiscal Years 1952 to 1957 inclusive.

CRIMINAL CASES TERMINATED

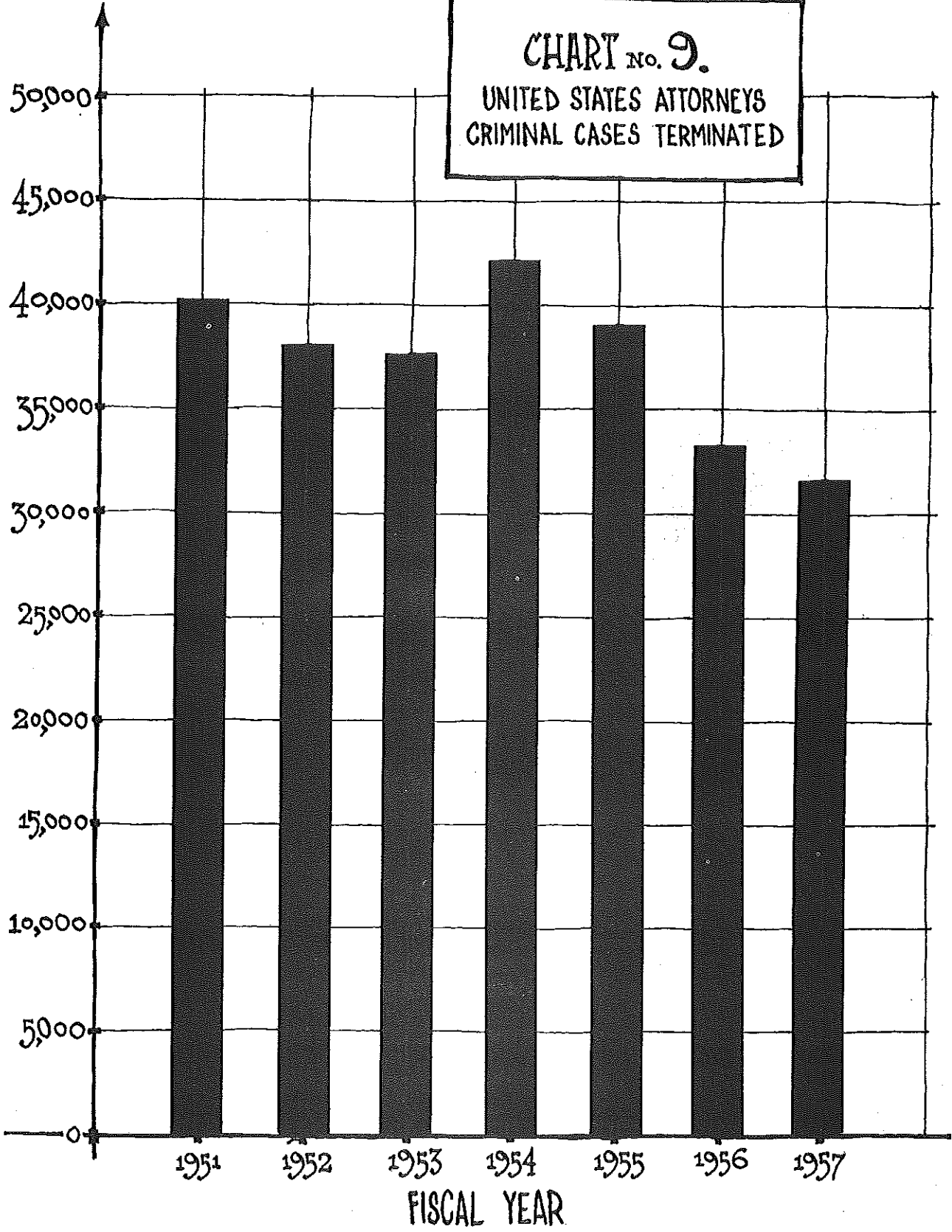

TRIALS IN CRIMINAL CASES

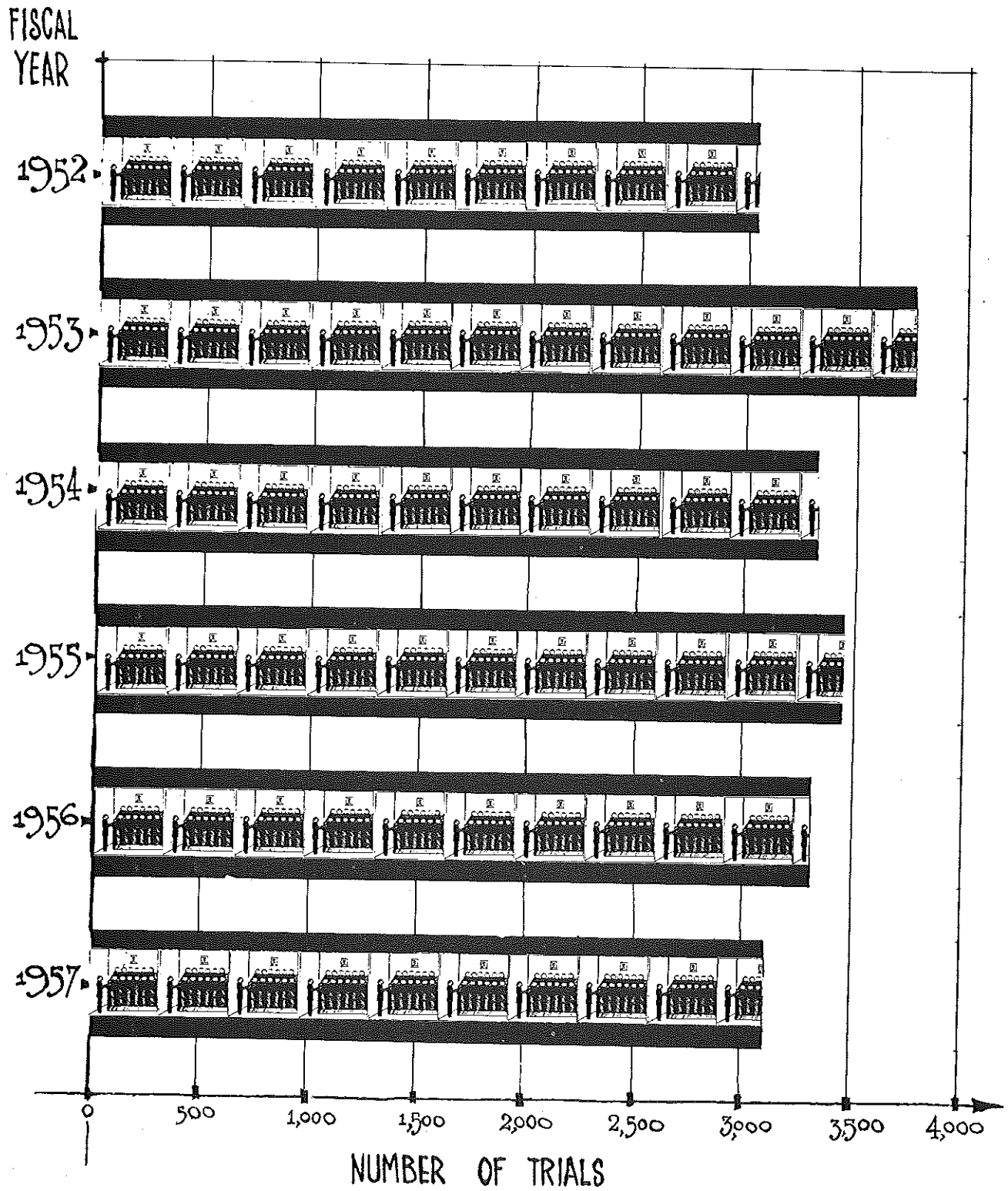
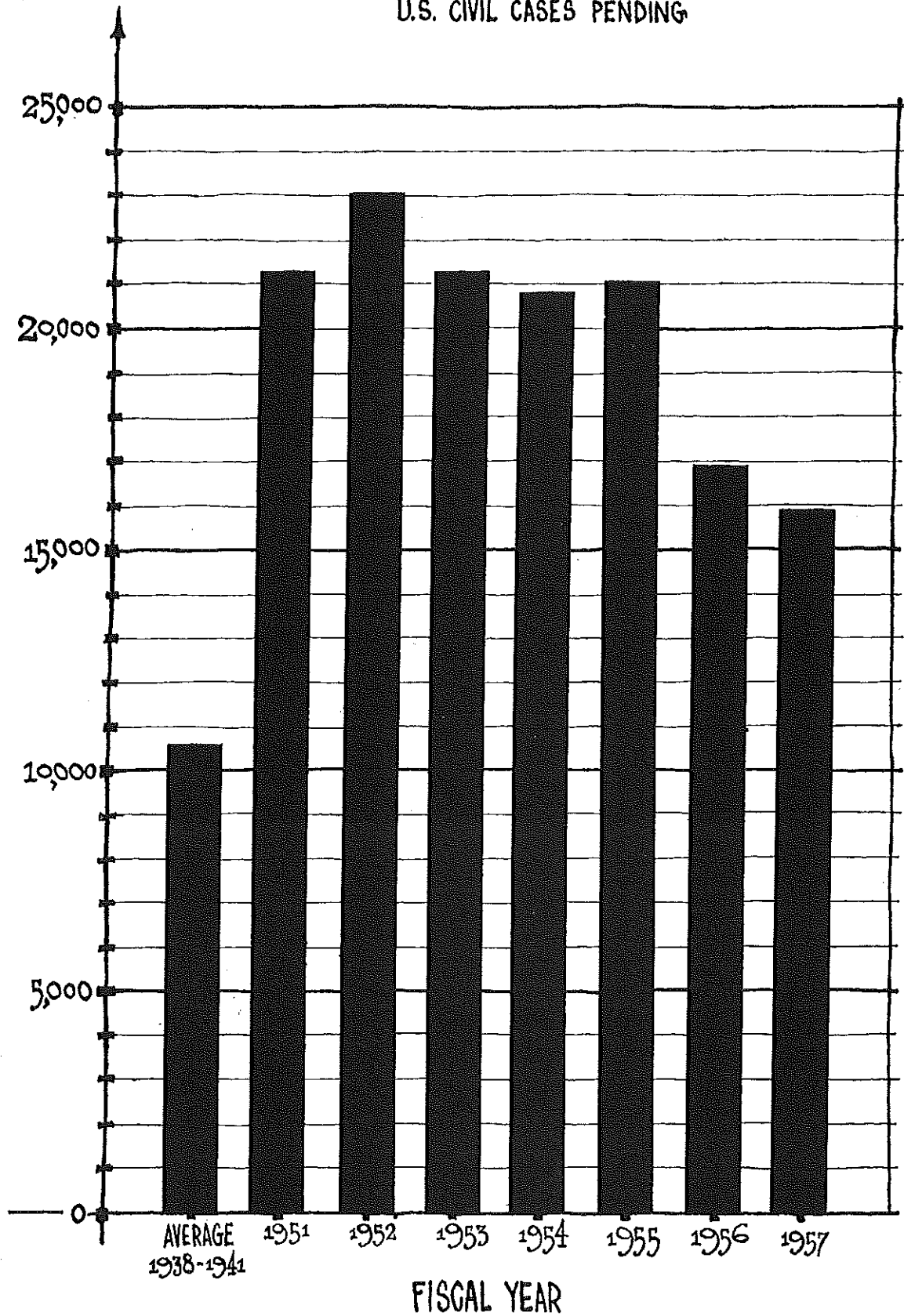

Civil cases pending in United States Attorneys' Offices amounted to 15,933 exclusive of Tax Lien cases* of which there are 1,692 pending. This is 979 cases less than the number pending at the close of Fiscal Year 1956. Of this number, 8,216 or 51.6 per cent are in fifteen districts having the largest civil caseload. As of June 30, 1956 these same districts had 8,968 cases or 53.0 per cent of the total. Chart 12 illustrates in graphic form the caseload of those fifteen districts as compared to the caseload for all other districts.

The table on the following page indicates the caseload at the close of Fiscal Years 1956 and 1957 in each of those fifteen districts and shows the per cent of increase or decrease in the number of cases pending from last fiscal year to the current year.

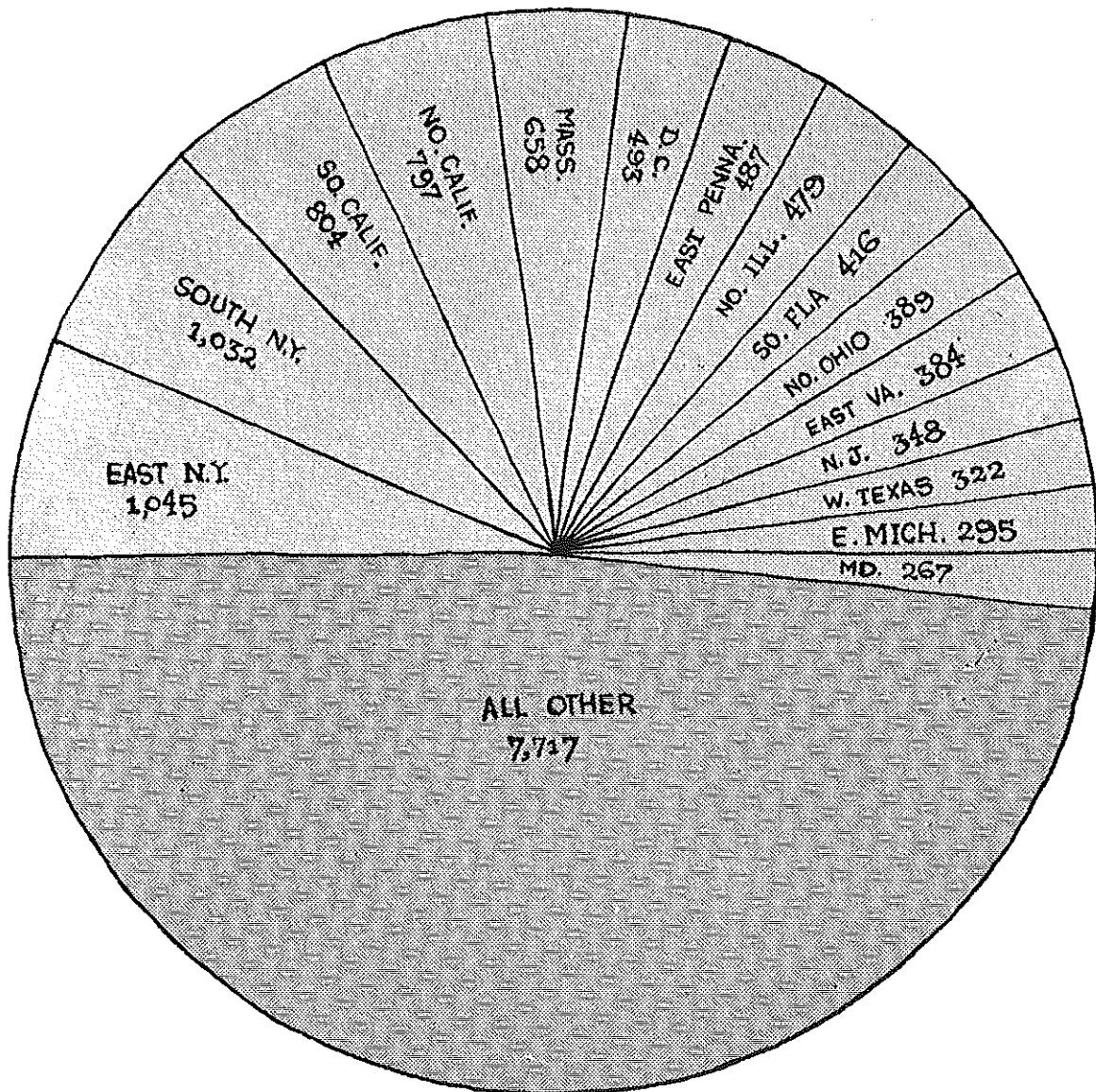

Exclusive of Land Acquisition cases there are 14,936 cases pending involving \$638,839,665. In 6,646 of these the United States as plaintiff is seeking to recover \$272,731,700. In the 7,261 suits in which the United States is defendant \$342,342,266 is involved, and there are 1,029 cases involving \$23,765,699 in which the United States is joined as a party.

The largest single group of cases in which the government is plaintiff are Negotiable Instrument cases (principally Federal Housing Administration defaulted notes). There are 1,782 cases in this group as compared to 1,752 such cases pending at the close of Fiscal Year 1956. The next largest group are Veterans' cases of which there are 1,220 which is just 68 cases less than the 1,288 pending as of June 30, 1956.

Of the cases in which the government is defendant, Civil Tax cases with 1,807 involving \$153,221,363 and Torts cases with 1,658 involving \$126,418,577 have the largest number or 24.9 and 22.8 per cent of the total respectively.

The following comparative table shows the increase or decrease percentage-wise in the number of cases in each major cause of action category from Fiscal Year 1956 to 1957 as well as the percentage each group represents of the totals at the close of Fiscal Years 1956 and 1957.

Chart 13 indicates the proportionate number of each type of case and the table on the following page shows the number of cases pending according to major cause of action group, the amounts involved and how the United States participates.

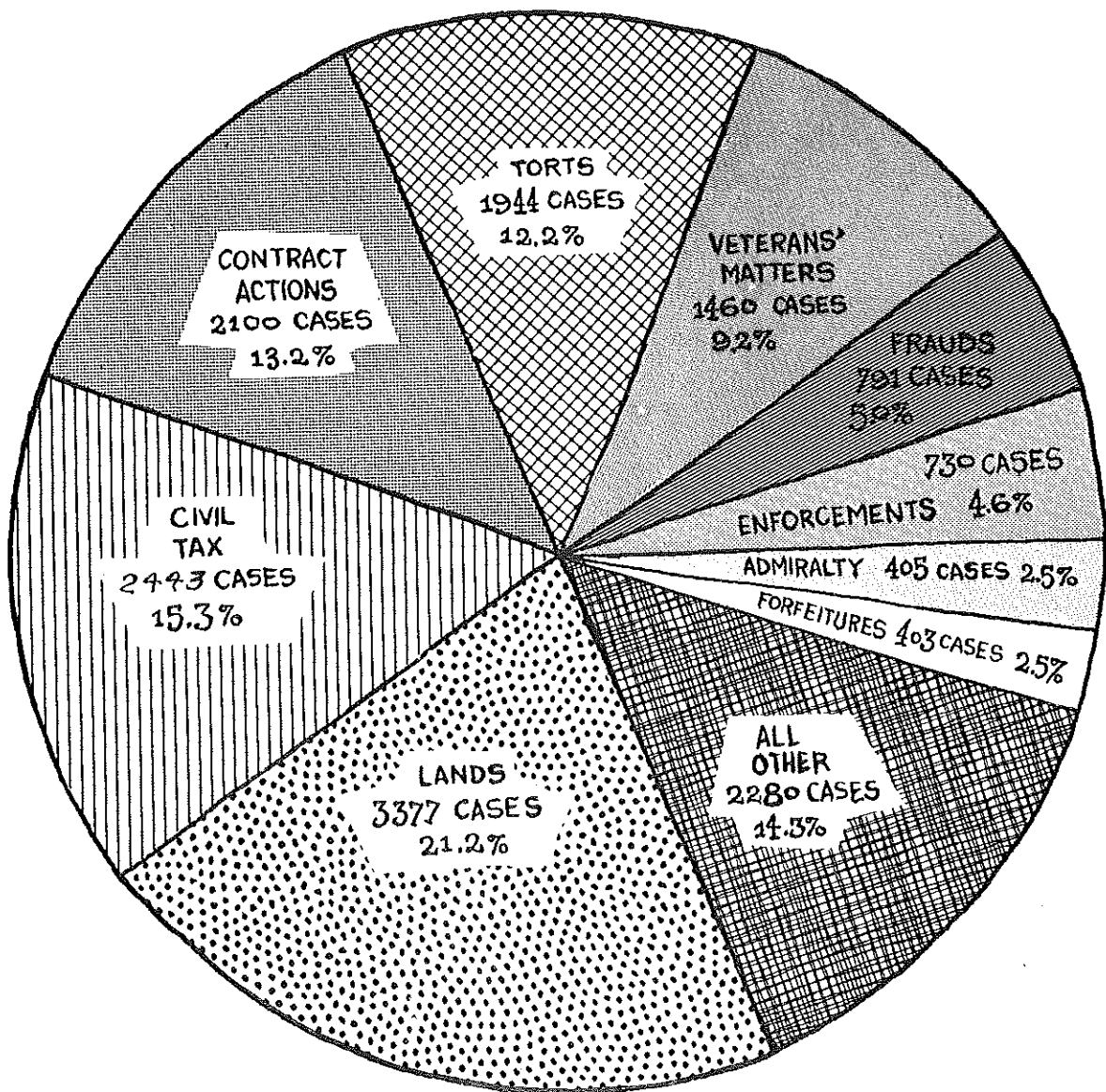

As of June 30, 1957, 1,574 suits were in the same status for a year or more, and 546 or 34.7 per cent of them were at issue or awaiting trial, but as of the close of the previous fiscal year 2,515 suits had been in the same status for a year or more and 1,425 or 56.7 of those were at issue or awaiting trial.

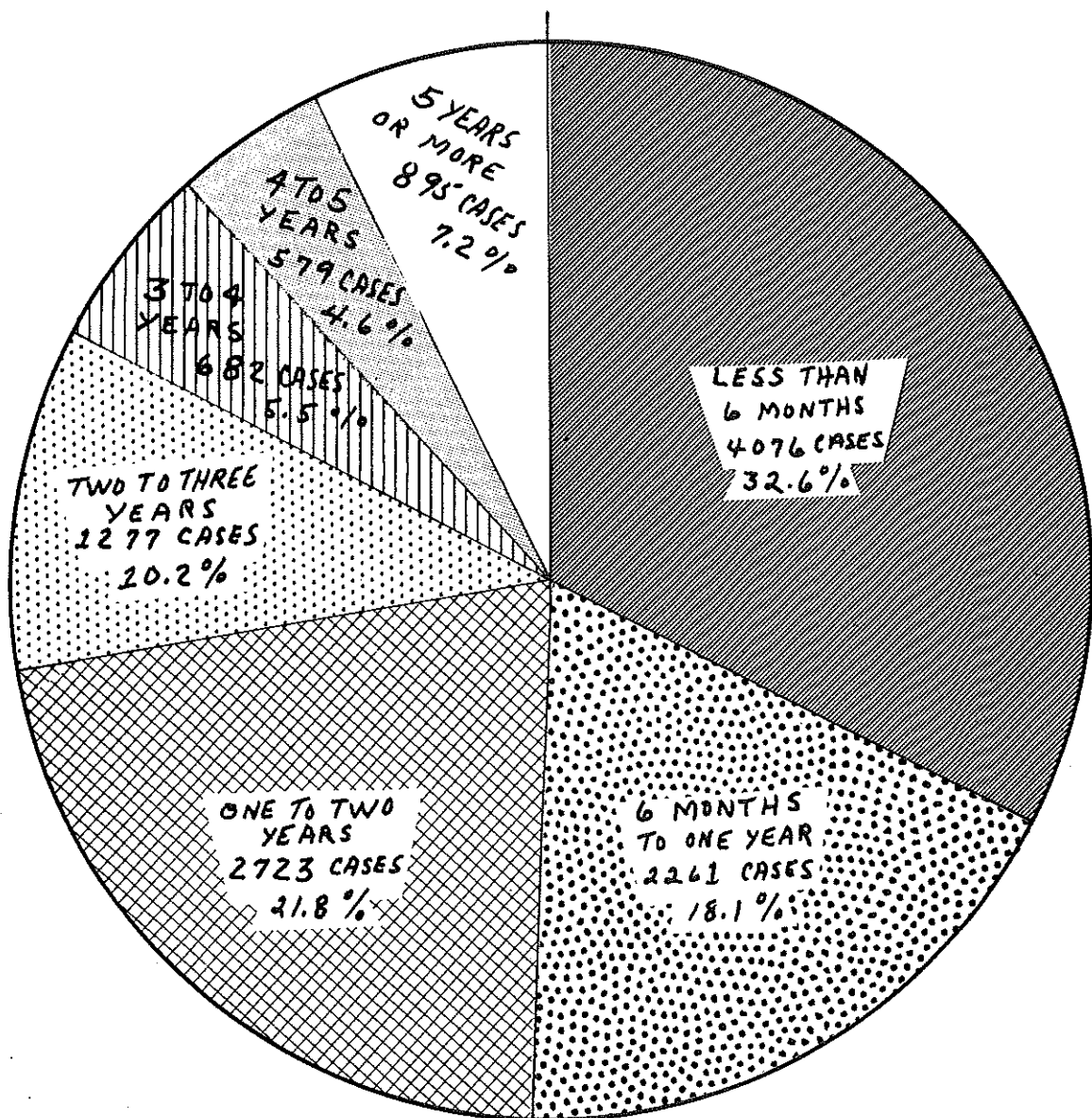

A breakdown of pending Civil cases (other than Civil Tax and Land Condemnation) according to amount range indicates increases in each amount category while there is a considerable decrease in non-monetary suits. Of the 14,747 Civil matters pending 6,450 are Contract actions consisting of 6,178 Negotiable Instrument matters, namely, 43.7 and 41.9 per cent respectively of the total. CIVIL CASES AND MATTERS RECEIVED

During the year 20,783 Civil cases were filed, a decrease of 4.3 per cent from the 21,706 cases filed during Fiscal Year 1956. As the following table indicates 50.9 per cent or 10,583 of the cases filed were in seventeen districts having a total of 400 or more cases. Southern California while having a decrease of 21.6 per cent from the 1,717 cases filed in Fiscal Year 1956 nevertheless had the largest number with 1,346 cases. Southern Florida with 624 had a 40.9 per cent increase from the 443 cases filed in the previous year. Other districts with substantial changes were:

Northern Illinois from 1,171 to 727, a 37.9 per cent decrease,

Maryland from 306 to 416, a 36.0 per cent increase

Southern Ohio from 309 to 437, a 41.4 per cent increase and,

Southern Texas from 264 to 647, a 145.1 per cent increase.

Chart 15 gives a comparison of the number of cases filed each Fiscal Year since 1952, and Table 8 in the Appendix gives a comparison of the number of cases filed in each district during this fiscal year and last fiscal year.

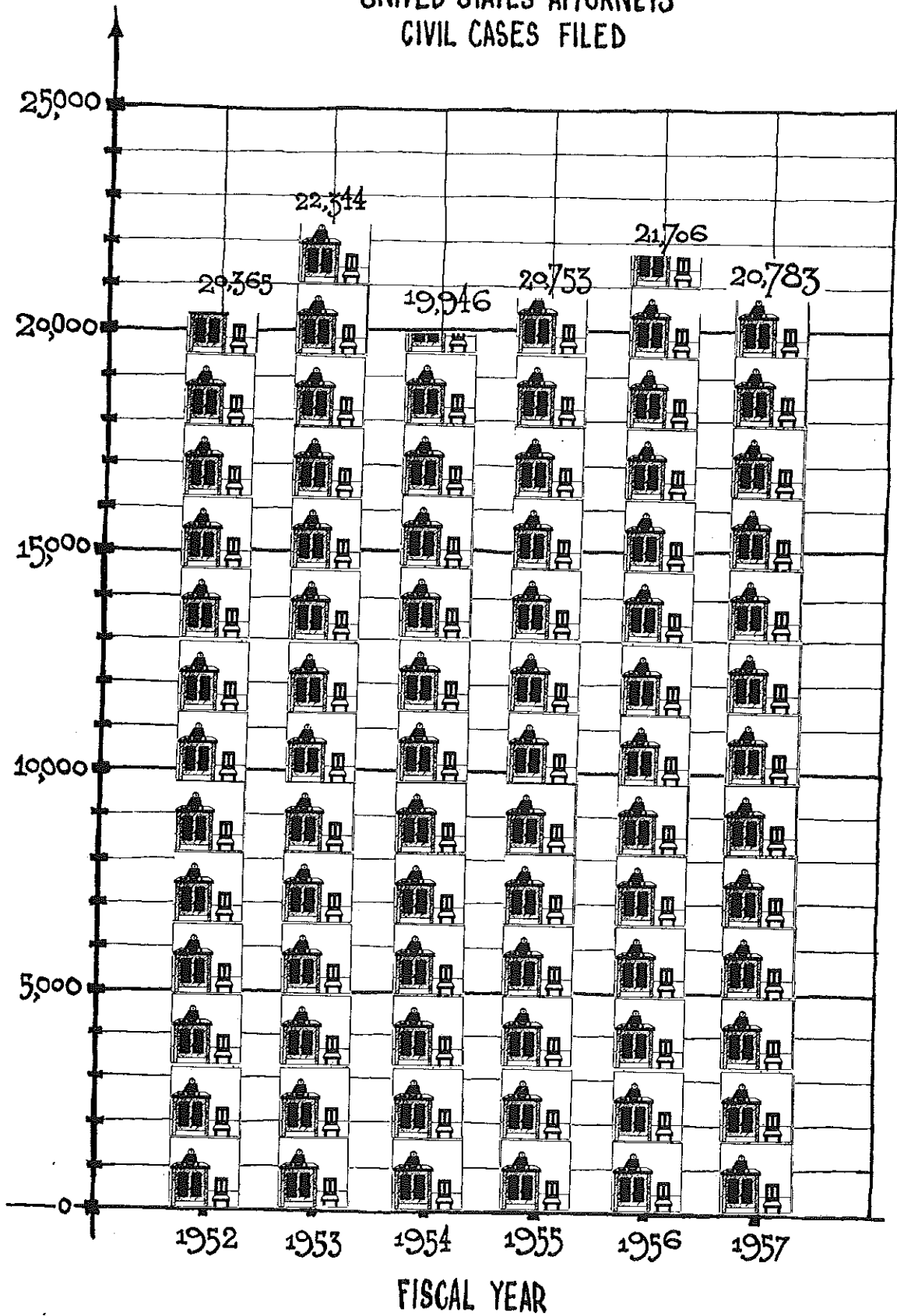

Of the Civil cases filed (excluding Land Acquisition but including Tax Lien), the United States was plaintiff in 14,119 involving \$202,921,950. Two categories, namely, 5,594 Negotiable Instrument suits for \$8,981,976 and 3,033 Veterans' suits for \$7,574,785 made up over half of this total. In the 566 suits involving frauds, the United States is seeking to recover \$53,839,822.

Cases in which the United States was designated as defendant amounted to 7,077 with \$208,389,342 involved. 1,652 Civil Tax suits with \$89,959,498 and 1,072 Torts suits with \$66,452,960 accounted for approximately 75 per cent of the money involved in these suits against the government.

A breakdown of cases filed according to agency involved shows that Federal Housing Administration with 5,740, Internal Revenue Service with 2,910 and the Department of Defense with 2,062 comprise 10,712 cases or 51.5 per cent of the total.

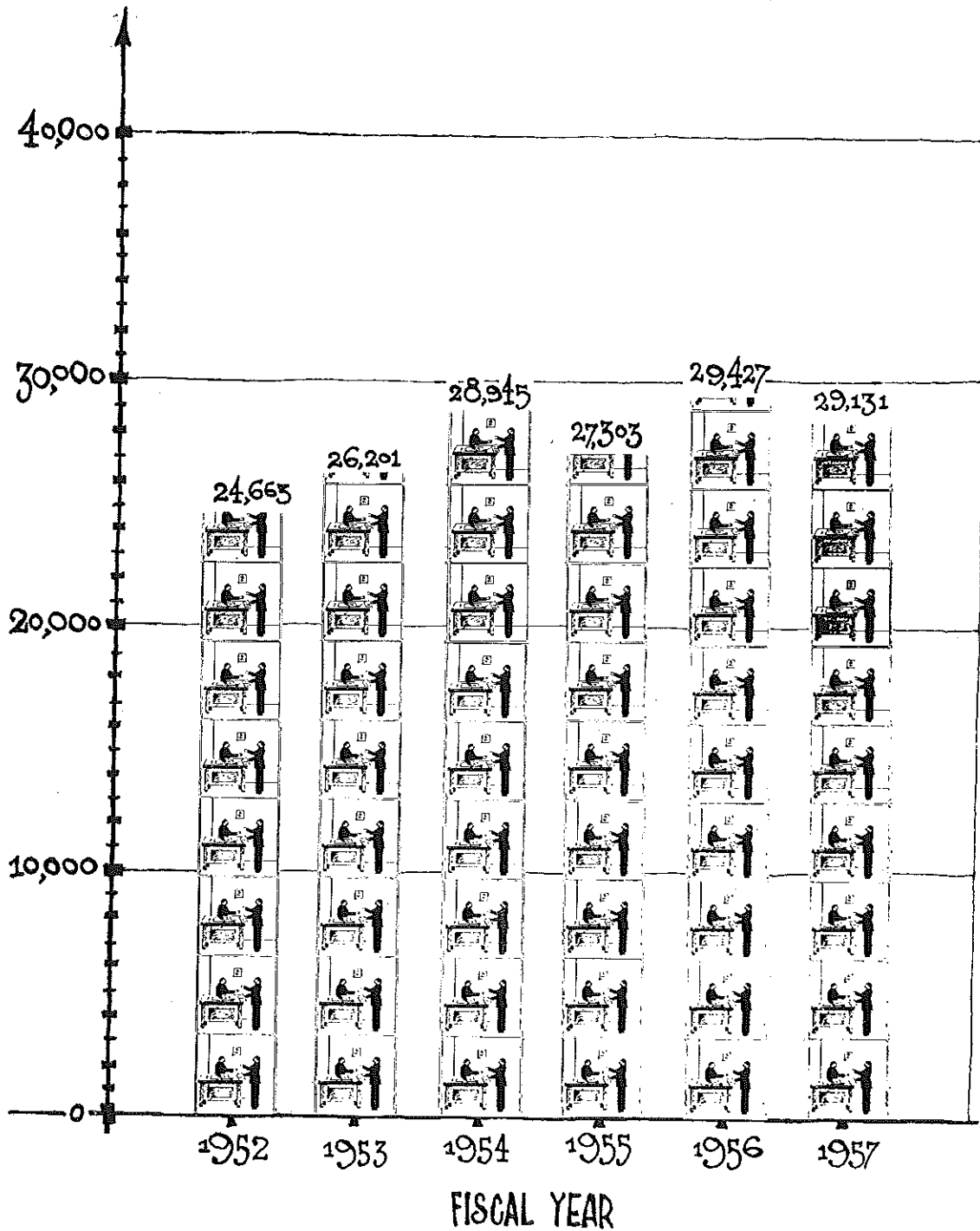
Civil matters received by United States Attorneys amounted to 29,131 a decrease of 1.0 per cent from the 29,427 received in Fiscal Year 1956.

As the table on the following page shows 12,911 or 44.3 per cent of those matters received were in fifteen districts reporting a volume of 600 or more matters received. Southern California with 1,698 had the largest number of civil matters received. However, this is a decrease of 21.5 per cent from the 2,163 matters reported by this district in the previous fiscal year. Table 12 in the Appendix gives a comparison of the number of civil matters received in each district during Fiscal Years 1956 and 1957.

Excluding Land Acquisition matters, there were 28,423 matters received in United States Attorneys' Offices of which 8,942 involved Negotiable Instruments and 5,645 Veterans' matters. As compared with Fiscal Year 1956, Negotiable Instrument matters increased by 336 or 3.9 per cent while Veterans' matters decreased by 666 or 10.6 per cent.

CIVIL CASES AND MATTERS CLOSED

During the fiscal year ended June 30, 1957, 21,371 suits were terminated, a decrease of 15.9 per cent from the record-breaking total of 25,425 closed in Fiscal Year 1956. As Chart 17 indicates, the number terminated during the past year is the second highest in the history of the Department.

A breakdown of Civil suits closed according to major cause of action category shows that Negotiable Instrument suits with 5,664 and Veterans' suits with 3,345 are the largest groups as they were in the two preceding fiscal years. The following tables give a comparison of cases closed in each group during Fiscal Year 1956 and 1957 and a summary of cases for Fiscal Year 1957 showing major cause of action categories, and how the United States participated in those cases.

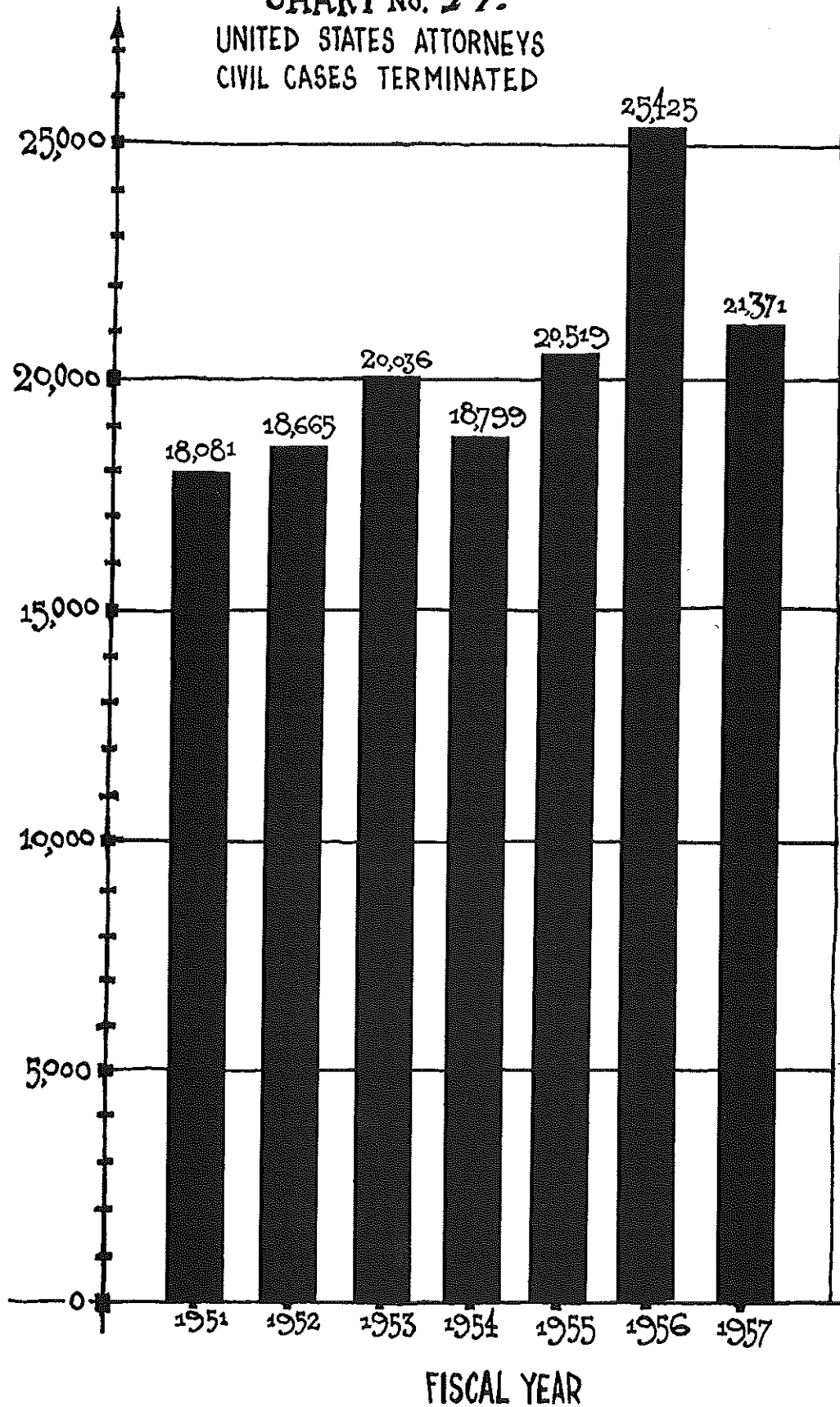

A total of 10,295 or 54.6 per cent of the Civil suits terminated (exclusive of Tax and Land Acquisition) resulted in judgments for the United States as compared to 12,396 judgments (comprising 51.9 per cent of the total) for the United States in Fiscal Year 1956.

As the table below indicates very little change percentagewise took place in other methods of disposition from Fiscal Year 1956 to 1957.

1,288 of the 21,371 Civil suits terminated during Fiscal Year 1957 were suits in which the government was sued for a total of \$53,675,175. In 535 of those suits involving \$21,848,831, compromises amounting to \$4,247,884 were obtained resulting in a savings of \$17,600,947. The United States won 349 of them in which it was sued for \$16,647,318. \$9,860,106 was saved in 404 suits involving \$15,179,026 in which judgments against the United States amounted to \$5,318,920. The total amount saved was \$44,108,371, an 11.1 per cent increase over the \$39,701,498 saved in the previous fiscal year.

9,435 Civil matters were closed without reaching court dockets. COLLECTIONS

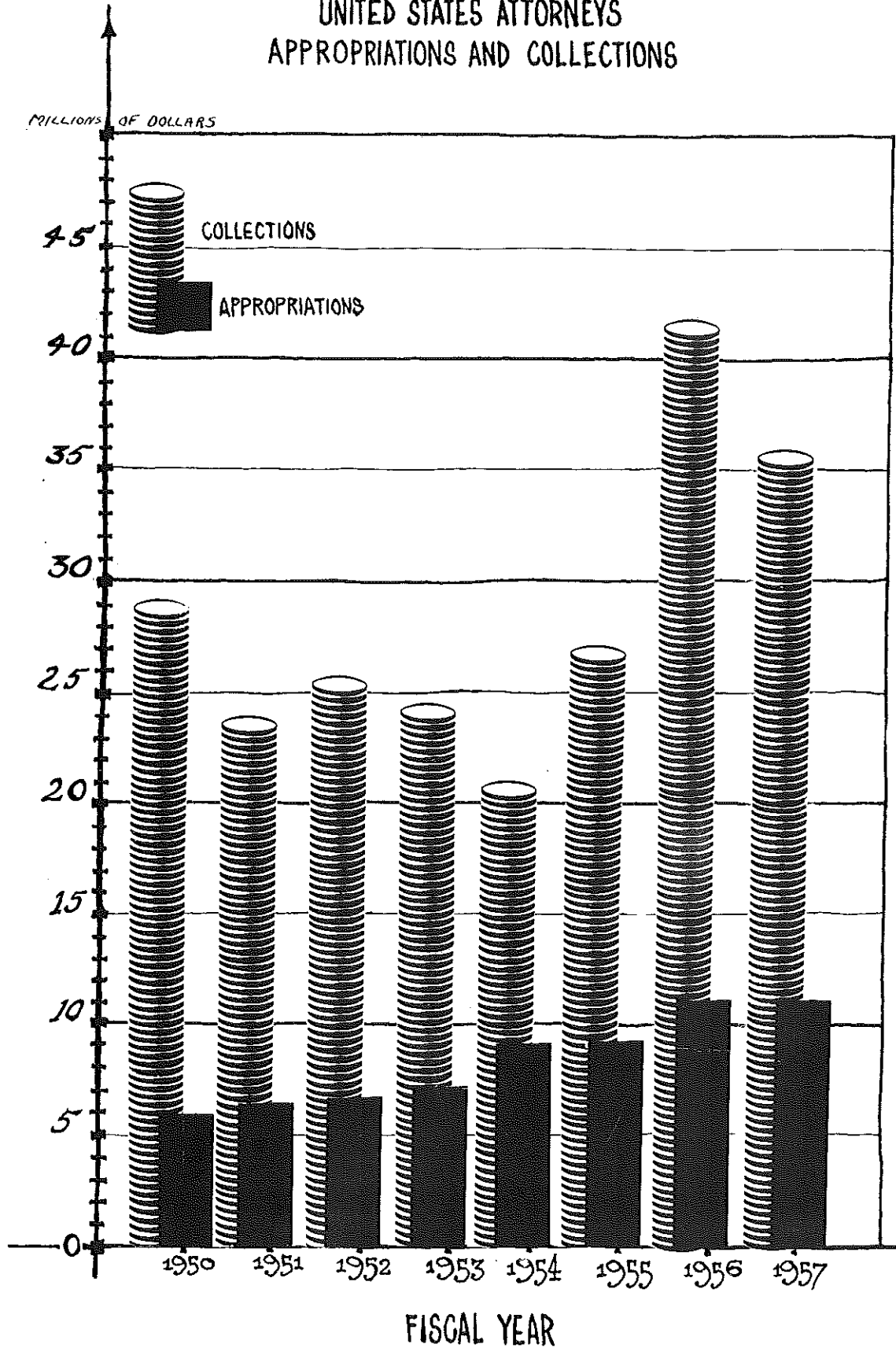
United States Attorneys reported collections of \$36,092,218 which is a decrease of \$5,942,570 or 14.1 per cent from the all-time high of \$42,034,788 collected in Fiscal Year 1956. However, the 1957 total is the second highest total in the history of the Department. A comparison of the collections after suit and those collections which were made without actual suit or prosecution for Fiscal Years 1956 and 1957 shows that collections after suit increased from \$14,381,628 to \$19,473,868, a 35.4 per cent increase while those without actual suit or prosecution decreased from \$27,653,160 to \$16,618,350, a 39.9 per cent decrease.

The total collected during the Fiscal Year is over three times as much as the \$11,138,200 appropriated for the United States Attorneys' Offices. As compared with Fiscal Years 1955 and 1956 when \$2.96 and \$3.77 respectively were collected for each dollar appropriated, \$3.24 was collected in Fiscal Year 1957.

Chart 18 depicts the amounts collected as compared to amounts appropriated for Fiscal Years 1950 through 1957 inclusive. The Financial Summary Table in the Appendix will show amounts collected by district as well as amounts imposed in fines, judgments, etc. and Table 13 will give a comparison of collections in each district for Fiscal Years 1956 and 1957.

PERSONNEL AND APPROPRIATIONS

An average of 1,569 employees were employed in United States Attorneys' Offices, and \$11,138,200 appropriated for their activities. During the year, 289 employees were appointed and 334 separated, a net loss of 45 employees. As of June 30, 1957, 1,557 employees were on the rolls.

Based on a caseload of 76,590 cases, the average cost per case handled was \$145.43 which is an increase over the average cost of \$133.88 in Fiscal Year 1956, but this is offset by the collections of \$35,818,489 and savings of \$44,108,371 so that as in previous fiscal years United States Attorneys again "paid their way" in Fiscal Year 1957.

 SEPARATIONS

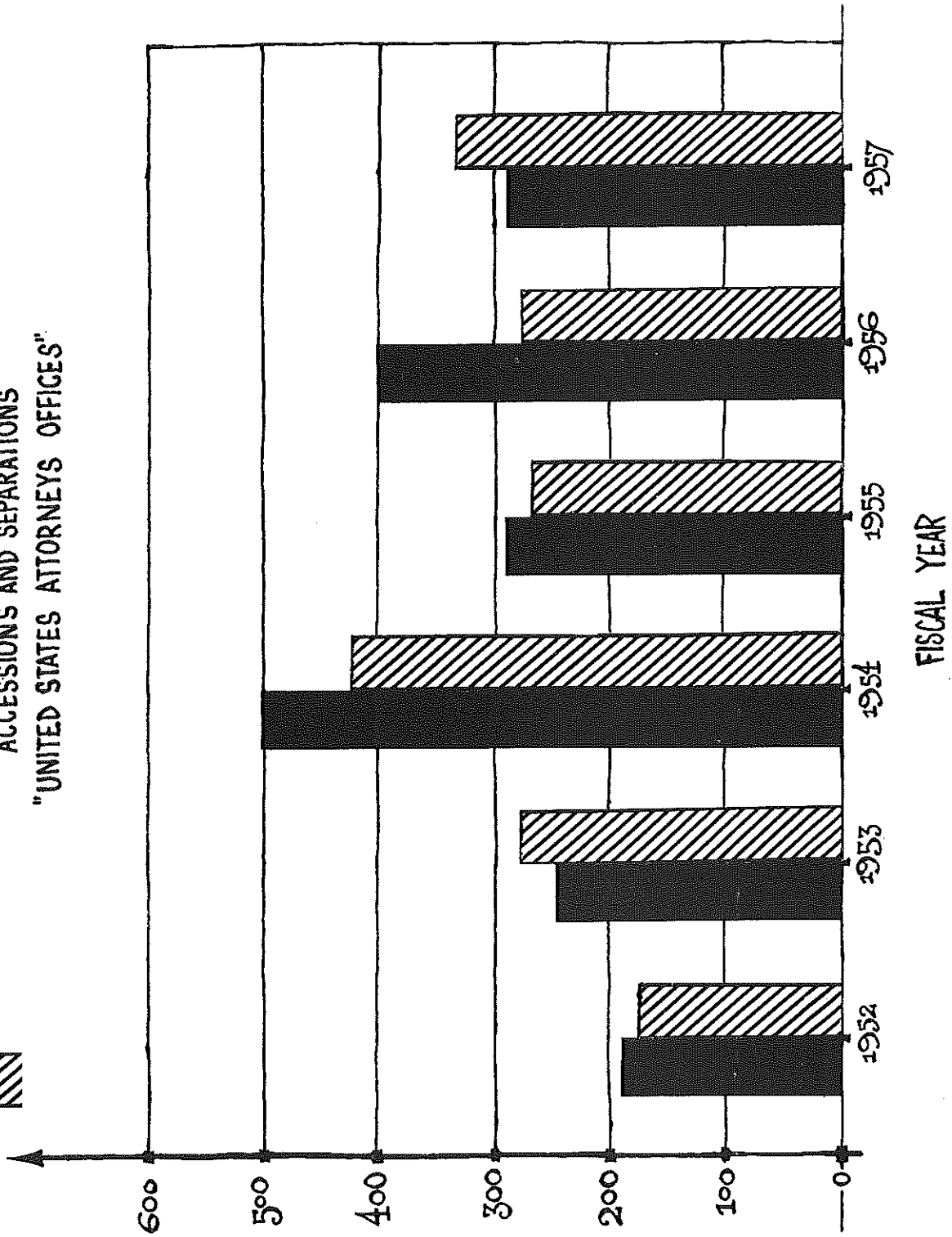
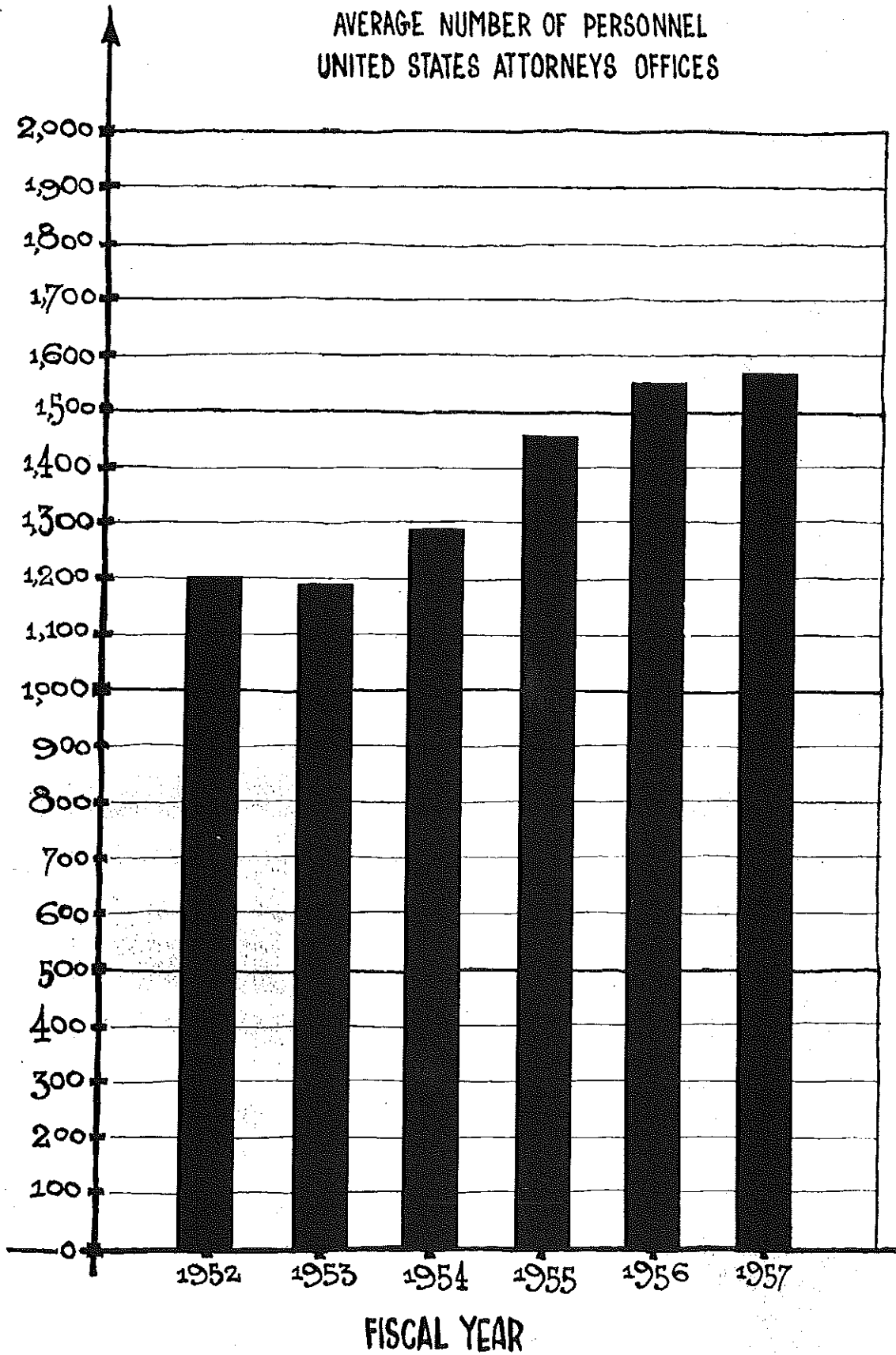
