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**BOWLING GREEN MAN SENTENCED TO ONE
IMPRISONMENT FOR TAX EVASION**

- \$640,000 not properly reported

BOWLING GREEN, KY - David A. Stewart, age 35, of Bowling Green, Kentucky, was sentenced to one year imprisonment, followed by two years supervised release, in United States District Court, Bowling Green, Kentucky, for four counts of tax evasion in violation of Title 26, United States Code, Section 7201 for the years 1999 through 2002, announced David L. Huber, United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky announced today.

During his guilty plea on April 16, 2007, Stewart admitted to willfully evading taxes for the aforementioned years by, among other things, 1) failing to file a timely tax return with the IRS for each year in question; 2) failing to make timely payment to the IRS the amounts of tax due and owing for each year in question; and 3) by filing false and fraudulent W-4 statements with his employers during these years in which he fraudulently claimed he was exempted from withholdings or by claiming an exorbitant number of exemptions. During the years in question, Stewart had earnings of over \$640,000 in taxable income through, in part, employment with Robo Enterprises and Sunclear Energy, with a consequent tax obligation of approximately \$169,000.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney James R. Lesousky, Jr., and it was investigated by the Internal Revenue Service, Criminal Investigation, Bowling Green, Kentucky office.

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
