The Grand Jury charges that:

**COUNT 1**

On or about July 23, 2012, in Jefferson Parish, in the Eastern District of Louisiana, the defendant, **WALTER ANDRES RAMIREZ**, an alien, was found in the United States after having been officially deported and removed therefrom to El Salvador on or about October 5, 2007, at or near Houston, Texas, and without the Attorney General of the United States or his designated successor, the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security, as provided for in Title 6, United States Code, Sections 202(3), 202(4), and 557, having expressly consented to the defendant's reapplication for admission into the United States; all in violation of Title 8, United States Code, Section 1326(a).

**NOTICE OF SENTENCING ENHANCEMENT**


Now comes the United States of America, by and through Jim Letten, the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Louisiana, to give notice that on or about December 12, 2005, in the Three hundred ninety-sixth District Court of Tarrant County, Texas, the defendant, **WALTER ANDRES RAMIREZ**, was convicted of sexual assault. Because of this aggravated felony conviction, if the defendant is convicted for a violation of Title 8, United States Code, Section 1326(a), Section 1326(a), the defendant's sentence will be subject to a maximum sentence of imprisonment for not more than 20 years. Title 8, United States Code, Section 1326(b)(2).
