INFORMATION

The defendant having waived in open court prosecution by Indictment, the United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey charges:

- 1. At all times relevant to this Information:
- a. Defendant FRANCISCO MARCOS was owner and operator of Sicomac Pharmacy, a retail pharmacy located in Wyckoff, New Jersey.
- b. Among the customers of Sicomac Pharmacy were employees of the United States Postal Service and their families, who received health care coverage through health care plans participating in the Federal Employees Health Benefits program ("FEHB plans"). Prescriptions for medication filled by employees of the United States Postal Service and their families at Sicomac Pharmacy were paid for by FEHB plans based upon submission of claims by Sicomac Pharmacy.

The Scheme to Defraud

2. From in or about 2005 through in or about 2008, in Bergen County, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, defendant

FRANCISCO MARCOS

did knowingly and willfully execute and attempt to execute a scheme and artifice (1) to defraud, and (2) to obtain, by means of false and fraudulent pretenses, representations, and promises, money and property owned by, and under the custody and control of, a health care benefit program, in connection with the delivery of and payment for health care benefits, items, and services.

Methods and Means of the Scheme

FRANCISCO MARCOS to carry out the scheme, defendant FRANCISCO
MARCOS submitted fraudulent claims for reimbursement to FEHB
plans based on prescriptions which were purportedly requested by
employees of the United States Postal Service and their families,
and filled by defendant FRANCISCO MARCOS and Sicomac Pharmacy.
In fact, these prescriptions were not requested by employees of
the United States Postal Service and their families, and were not
filled by defendant FRANCISCO MARCOS and Sicomac Pharmacy.

4. In this fashion, defendant FRANCISCO MARCOS submitted at least 400 fraudulent claims to FEHB plans and received in excess of \$28,000 in reimbursement from FEHB plans based upon fraudulent claims.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1347.
