8th HEROIN DISTRIBUTOR SENTENCED TO PRISON

Madison, Wis. - Stephen P. Sinnott, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Yarnell "Magic" Fuller, 23, Madison, was sentenced today by U.S. District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to eight years in prison for distributing heroin and for possessing a firearm in furtherance of his drug trafficking activity. Fuller pleaded guilty to these charges on November 9, 2009.

Fuller was arrested on August 11, 2009, at his apartment on Troy Drive, Madison, where police recovered heroin and a loaded handgun. In connection with the other individuals below, the court determined that Fuller distributed at least one kilogram of heroin.

Fuller is the eighth of nine defendants to be sentenced in federal court after a series of arrests in August related to heroin trafficking. Chavis Webster will be sentenced on February 8, 2010.

The charges against Fuller were the result of an investigation conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration; Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation; Madison Police Department; Middleton Police Department; Sun Prairie Police Department; McFarland Police Department; DeForest Police Department; and the Dane County Narcotics and Gang Task Force. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Jeffrey Anderson and Paul Connell.
