WISCONSIN DELLS MAN SENTENCED FOR DISTRIBUTING COCAINE

Madison, Wis. - John W. Vaudreuil, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Dana Scott, 37, Wisconsin Dells, Wis., was sentenced today by U.S. District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to 10 years in prison for distributing cocaine. Scott pleaded guilty to this charge on August 26, 2010.

On July 30, 2009, law enforcement officers utilized an informant to buy cocaine from Scott by contacting his co-defendant, Jamaal Lee, who later distributed the cocaine at his residence in Stoughton. On September 16, 2009, law enforcement officers utilized the same informant to buy one ounce of cocaine directly from Scott in Madison.

Judge Crabb noted that Scott deserved a lengthy prison term due to his prior felony convictions for distribution of cocaine and battery. On October 6, 2010, Lee was sentenced to 30 months in prison for his role in the case.

The charges against Scott were the result of an investigation conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration and Dane County Narcotics and Gang Task Force. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Paul W. Connell.
