
Dear Mr. Stallings,

This is just hearsay but that is how we communicate in the North Fork Valley near where the actions of SGI and GEC in the US vs. SGI et al took place. I heard that Bill Koch offered \$100,000 for a ranch in our valley and was turned down. He then offered a million dollars which was accepted. Money means different things to different people. Whereas a fine would mean a lot to me, to Bill Koch a fine is just the cost of doing business. Koch is buying up the valley and now wants to co-opt the government and the BLM. The Finding Of No Significant Impact regarding lease sale parcels by the BLM is ridiculous from our point of view and so is this settlement.

What we really want is for you to stop this outrageous behavior and the control of the government by money.
