Throughout the war, Mildred Elizabeth Gillars was employed as a broadcaster in the Short-Wave Radio System maintained by the German Government in the dissemination of enemy propagands. At the request of the Department of Justice, Miss Gillars has been held in the custody of the European Command Intelligence Center at Oberursel, Germany, since her arrest in 1946. Her alleged treasonable activities have been the subject of an extensive f nvestigation, both here and abroad, and sufficient evidence has now been obtained to warrant presentation of the matter to a grand jury.




