The evidence to be presented consists, in part, of a series of phonographic recordings of short-wave broadcasts beamed from Berlin, in which the subject participated. It is necessary to prepare written transcriptions of each of said phonographic recordings and it is desirable that such transcriptions be prepared by an expert in that field.

Throughout the war, Mildred Elizabeth Gillars was employed as a broadcaster in the Short-Wave Radio System maintained by the German Government in the dissemination of enemy propaganda. At the request of the Department of Justice, Miss Gillars has been held in the custody of the European Command Intelligence Center at Oberursel, Germany, since her arrest in 1946. Her alleged treasonable activities have been the subject of an extensive investigation, both here and abroad, and sufficient evidence has now been obtained to warrant presentation of the matter to a grand jury.

The testimony of four witnesses now resident in Germany is considered indispensable in presenting the instant matter to the grand jury. The names and addresses of said witnesses, each of whom has agreed to come to the United States for the above purpose, are as follows:

Under date of July 29, 1948, this Department requested that steps be taken by the Department of the Army looking toward immediate contact with the above-mentioned witnesses in Europe with the view in mind that the witnesses named be located and alerted for the trip to this country via commercial airlines.

The Department of the Army will fly Miss Gillars to the United States by military airplane at the earliest possible date and she will remain in military custody until delivered to the civil authorities in the District of Columbia.

The Department of Justice hereby requests that the State Department make the necessary arrangements for waiving the visas of the above-named individuals. The Immigration Service has been notified of the arrival in this country of the German citizens listed above.

The Department of Justice will provide for the welfare of the witness on arrival in this country.

I have received your letters concerning the trip to the States for Mildred Gillars, as well as witnesses desired by you. I immediately called all witnesses concerned and notified them to arrange their personal affairs and be alerted for the trip to the States in the near future. The official orders coming through the Department of Army directing the transportation of Gillars and the witnesses arrived on Sunday, August 8th, and I have been working closely with the Deputy Director of Intelligence endeavoring to expedite the transportation arrangements. It was necessary for the Deputy Director of Intelligence, after receiving your letter concerning Sally's transportation, to wire Washington because special flights direct to Washington, D.C. have to be ordered direct from Washington. A cable was dispatched to the Department of Army in Washington requesting orders setting up the special flight for Gillars and a telegram has since been received stating that the special flight to Washington will leave here on the 20th of August. Nothing can be done to arrange the special flight prior to that date. A cablegram setting up this flight came from the National Airport in Washington from Headquarters, Military Air Transport Service, dated 10 August 1948, Cable number EN 1093, signed, General Outer. Based on this date of shipment for Sally, I am arranging through Lieutenant Moller to have the witnesses requested leave Frankfurt two to three days later. Army orders directing the transportation for were received by the Deputy Director of Intelligence this morning, and she will be processed and shipped to the States on the date above mentioned for witnesses.

The Royal Dutch Air Lines, KLM, has refused to allow  
in Munich to go to the States as a witness. I  
have called the American Military Attache in The Hague  
who is going to personally contact the director of KLM  
in an effort to work out a solution to this problem, and  
it is thought that arrangements will be made so that  
can leave Frankfurt with the other witnesses. If  
such arrangements cannot be made, a cable will be dispatched  
to you immediately. The objection, from the standpoint of  
KLM, is that they do not desire to remain in the  
States the length of time estimated for the completion of  
the trial, which was from one and one-half months to two  
months. My present requests are to have go to the  
States for the Grand Jury indictment under the conditions  
that something can be worked out for his extended stay or  
the possibility of returning him to the job between the  
date of the indictment and the actual trial.

I am sorry so much time has been consumed in getting the  
persons requested by you under way to the States, but in  
typical Army fashion, the office of the Deputy Director  
of Intelligence would take no official action in this  
matter until official orders were received from Washington.  
They have been very cooperative, however, in expediting  
the matter as much as possible once the orders were received.  
I am keeping in close daily contact with the Deputy Director  
of Intelligence in an effort to carry out your request in  
the shortest possible time.

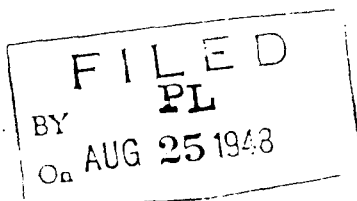

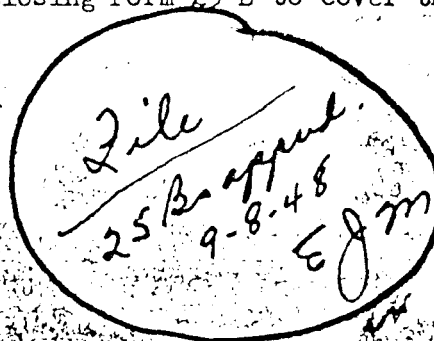
These witnesses are former residents of Germany but **HOLLIE**  
are citizens of the United States. They are wholly without  
financial means. They have cooperated fully with the Govern-  
ment in connection with the subject case, and it is highly important  
that this cooperative relationship be preserved. Their testimony  
relates to facts coming within their knowledge while they were resi-  
dents of Germany and follows patterns similar to the testimony of  
other German-citizen witnesses who have been brought to the United  
States to testify in this case at agreed witness fees of \$10 per  
day.

Apart from their expected testimony before the Grand  
Jury, these witnesses have aided the Government in the role of  
interpreter and analyst in connection with the interrogation of  
other German speaking witnesses. Their status is the same as that  
of [unclear] as to whom you have received an earlier  
memorandum from me and who was authorized to be paid as an expert  
witness at the rate of \$10 per day. It is believed necessary in
