Dear Sir:

I read in the Albuquerque papers that the Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit has unanimously affirmed the above entitled treason prosecution. You will recall that this case was briefed and argued by Mr. DeWolfe and myself.

According to items appearing in the local newspapers it appears that Mr. DeWolfe will be detained in St. Louis in the immediate future, and I will be detained in New Mexico until the 1st of November in connection with the motion for new trial, in the case of United States vs. Humble Oil Company et al.

Therefore, it is apparent that someone in the Washington office may be called upon to handle the above captioned matter, in the event that a petition for certiorari is filed by Mrs. D'Aquino. In any event, it may be necessary for the government to recover its copy of the transcript and the photostatic copies of the exhibits which were lodged with the Clerk of the Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. I suggest therefore, that your office write to Mr. Paul O'Brien and request that the above described transcript and exhibits be sent by him without delay to your office.

Reference is made to the above entitled treason prosecution presently pending on appeal in the Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit.

We are shortly transmitting to you under Government bill of lading via Railway Express, 57 volumes of the typewritten transcript of the proceedings below. 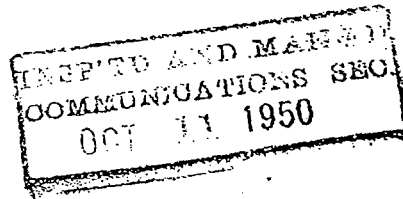

Reference is made to the above entitled treason prosecution presently pending on appeal in the Court of Appeals for your Circuit.

Under date of September 13, 1950, you were served with three copies of appellant's brief. On said date you forwarded two copies of appellant's brief to the Department and the same were received here on September 15, 1950. The Clerk of the Court of Appeals has advised that appellant's brief was filed on September 15. Normally the government's brief under the rules becomes due on October 15, 1950. A three months extension within which to serve and file the government's brief is desired.

Records available in the Department disclose that the transcript of record was delivered to you and appellant's counsel on April 25, and at that time both parties litigant hereto were advised that appellant's brief was due on June 5, 1950.

An order was entered on June 2 based on a stipulation executed between the respective parties hereto extending the time in which appellant could file her brief up to and including July 1. On June 26 a consent order was entered extending the time for the filing of appellant's brief up to July 17. On July 13 you entered into a stipulation with appellant's counsel extending the time for the filing of her brief up to and including August 17, 1950. On August 15 appellant, by virtue of a written agreement with you, obtained an extension of the time within which she might file her brief up to and including September 7. Although the Department's records in connection

with the various extensions might not be entirely accurate, it is believed that appellant obtained another extension by means of a stipulation executed by you so that her brief would be considered timely as of September 15 when filed.

Summarizing, appellant's brief was originally due on June 5, 1950, and based on stipulations obtained from you, she obtained extensions of time up to and including September 15 within which to file her brief.

Appellant's brief consists of 242 pages with an appendix comprising an additional 106 pages, and covers numerous points of law. For example the table of contents is seven pages in length and the Table of Cases, Statutes and Texts cited in the brief covers seven and one-half pages. Furthermore the brief contains countless references to the trial transcript and printed record. As you are well aware, the trial of this cause commenced on July 5, 1949, and culminated with the rendition of a guilty verdict on September 29, 1949. The typewritten transcript of the trial proceedings alone covers 57 volumes and consists of more than 6300 pages. In addition, the judgment roll, which constitutes the printed transcript of record, consists of two volumes covering 871 pages. The printed record generally contains post- and pre-trial motions, the Court's rulings thereon, and appellant's depositions admitted in evidence as corrected, in addition to those depositions of appellant which were offered and rejected.

The government's brief will be prepared in the Department. The printer has advised that it will take approximately one week and a half to print the government's brief and some time allowance must be made for mailing copies thereof to you, appellant's counsel, and the Clerk of the Court of Appeals at San Francisco.

It is therefore absolutely necessary for the government to procure an extension up to and including January 15, 1951, within which to file its brief in this cause. In view of the recitals above mentioned it is not believed that the Department's request in this regard is unreasonable.

It is requested that you seek a stipulation from appellant's counsel looking toward an extension of time up to and including January 15, 1951, within which the government's brief may be filed. If such a stipulation is forthcoming an order of court confirming said agreement should be promptly obtained.

If appellant's counsel refuse to acquiesce in the extension sought by the Department it is requested that you serve and file the enclosed motion for extension of time, expedite the hearing of the same, and make every effort to obtain such an extension from the Court of Appeals. Please advise the Department by wire as to the action taken on the Department's request for an extension of time up to and including January 15, 1951, within which to serve and file its brief in this proceeding.

Q: Then what happened?

A: I asked her if the statement was true and she said, "It is," and I then asked her if she would dare to sign it and she said she would. She then signed her name at the bottom of the page and I asked her if she would initial the other pages and she did.

It is the recollection of Messrs. DeWolfe and Knapp that attorney Hogan testified in substance that he asked Appellant if she would "care" to sign the exhibit in question.

It is requested that you contact the official court reporter for your District and request him to check his original shorthand or stenotype notes in an effort to ascertain whether the word "dare" in the transcript, as above mentioned, should not be changed to "care", so that the record can be made to conform to the truth.

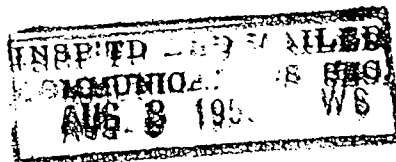

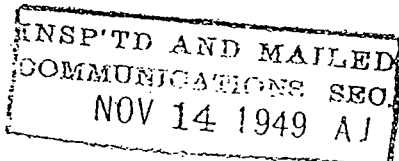

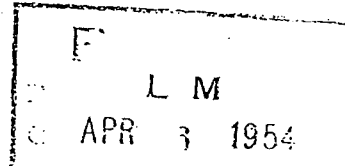

Dear Mr. Foley:

It is my understanding that I am needed as soon as possible in Washington, D.C., in connection with other cases now pending.

My plans, at present, are to stop at Los Angeles on my return to pick up some recordings from the Central Intelligence Agency at Reseda, California. These recordings are original Federal Communication Commission recordings relating to the Provoo case. In order to expedite my return by approximately four days, it is suggested that I go to Reseda this week-end and return to San Francisco. Then, as soon as I complete my duties here, I can return directly to Washington.

To accomplish this, it will be necessary to change my Government Travel Request. I now hold a return air-line ticket, via Los Angeles, and a TR for excess baggage from San Francisco to Los Angeles and one for excess baggage from Los Angeles to Washington. It will be necessary to secure a TR for a round trip air-line ticket from San Francisco to Los Angeles and an excess baggage TR from San Francisco to Washington. If this meets with your approval, time will not permit your forwarding the necessary TR's from Washington for use this week-end. Therefore, it is suggested that you telegraph authority to Mr. DeWolfe to issue the necessary TR's from his book. The TR's I now hold would in turn be given to Mr. DeWolfe. 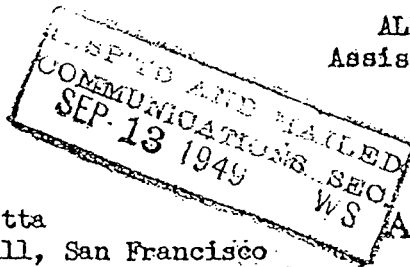

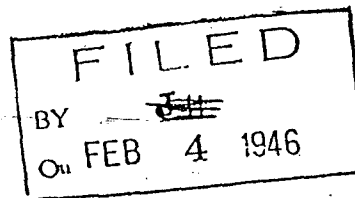

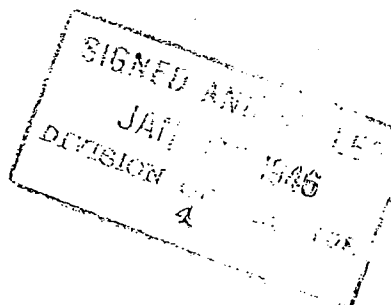

We have your letter of September 14, concerning the possible treason prosecution of Iva Toguri, who broadcast from Japan under the name of Tokyo Rose.

Since this subject previously lived in Los Angeles, it would seem that any treason case against her might well be instituted in your District. As you indicate, venue would be in the District in the United States into which she is "first brought".

We have been working on a number of similar cases in Europe and certain difficulties are found. For instance, it may be that this subject expatriated herself in some manner prior to her treasonable activities. This would, of course, preclude prosecution.

We are asking the Bureau to furnish you with any information available in this case and we shall also review the facts as they are obtained.

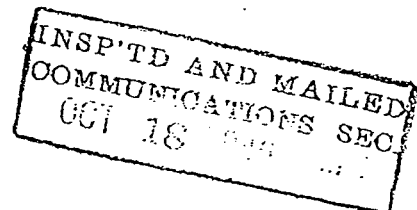

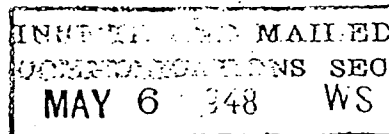

This will acknowledge your letter of November 16, 1948, relative to the above case.

We concur in your conclusion that the defendant has not lost her American citizenship by marriage to Philip D'Aquino.

The Section cited by the defendant; namely, § U.S.C. 717 (a), is not applicable because it relates to the regaining of citizenship already lost by marriage.

The Nationality Act of 1940 repealed and amended many previous statutes on the subject of nationality. Among those repealed was the Act of March 3, 1931, except Section 2. That section, which was not repealed, provides that an American citizen does not lose citizenship by marriage to an alien after March 3, 1931, in the absence of a formal declaration of renunciation before a court having jurisdiction over naturalization. Therefore, we hold that this defendant is and has been, as alleged in the indictment, a citizen of the United States.

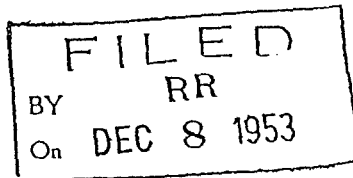
