PLEA

GUILTY, and the court being satisfied that NOLO CONTENDERE, NOT GUILTY there is a factual basis for the plea, to information.

FINDING & JUDGMENT

There being a finding/verdict of NOT GUILTY. Defendant is discharged. GUILTY. Defendant has been convicted as charged of the offense(s) of 15:78dd-2 money offered directly or indirectly to foreign governmental officials - influencing foreign officials.

SENTENCE OR PROBATION ORDER

The court asked whether defendant had anything to say why judgment should not be pronounced. Because no sufficient cause to the contrary was shown, or appeared to the court, the court adjudged the defendant guilty as charged and convicted and ordered that: The defendant is hereby fined in the sum of \$75,000. said fine to be payed over a five year period. FURTHER ORDERED that schedule of payments is to be arranged by the Probation Office.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS OF PROBATION

In addition to the special conditions of probation imposed above, it is hereby ordered that the general conditions of probation set out on the reverse side of this judgment be imposed. The Court may change the conditions of probation, reduce or extend the period of probation, and at any time during the probation period or within a maximum probation period of five years permitted by law, may issue a warrant and revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.
