Why is this memo being issued by the counterterrorism AD? Asked by lawmakers last week, Langan said the bureau does not view parents expressing heated rhetoric as domestic terrorists. But his signature on this memo seems to blur that line. Any thoughts on that?

Is there anything else you can say about how the bureau is implementing the AG's Oct. 4 memo?

Attorney General Merrick B. Garland <u>released</u> a statement following the U.S. District Court's decision to issue a preliminary injunction blocking enforcement of Texas Senate Bill 8. The Justice Department filed a lawsuit to prevent the State of Texas from enforcing the law on Sept. 9.

"Today's ruling enjoining the Texas law is a victory for women in Texas and for the rule of law. It is the foremost responsibility of the Department of Justice to defend the Constitution. We will continue to protect constitutional rights against all who would seek to undermine them."

Assistant Attorney General Kristen Clarke testified on the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act of 2021 this week at a hearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee. The Act responds to the elimination of the preclearance coverage formula, provides greater clarity regarding the appropriate legal standard in Section 2 vote denial cases, gives DOJ authority to compel the production of documents and materials relevant to investigations of potential voting rights violations, and puts new voting safeguards measures in place.

"Congress must act now to restore the Voting Rights Act to prevent us from backsliding into a nation where millions of citizens, particularly citizens of color, find it difficult to register, cast their ballot and elect candidates of their choice. The Justice Department welcomes this opportunity to work with Congress to revive this bedrock civil rights law." Read Assistant Attorney General Clarke's entire opening statement.


Also this week, Deputy Attorney General Lisa O. Monaco <u>testified</u> on the Reauthorization the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) before the Senate Judiciary Committee. During her opening statement, she highlighted what DOJ sees as priorities for a reauthorization bill, which included reauthorizing its grant programs, finding new ways to reach and improve services for underserved populations, expanding the ability of tribes to protect their communities from domestic and sexual violence, and addressing federal firearm laws. Prior to her testimony, the Deputy Attorney General <u>authored</u> an op-ed in *People* on how VAWA has saved lives and why Congress must reauthorize it.

In other news at the Justice Department, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services <u>announced</u> over \$33 million in funding to advance the practice of community policing in law enforcement. As part of the department's <u>comprehensive strategy</u> to address violent crime and to commemorate National Domestic Violence Awareness Month,

the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) announced more than \$476 million in grants to address domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

In addition, the Attorney General directed the FBI and U.S. Attorneys' Offices to meet in the next 30 days with federal, state, Tribal, territorial and local law enforcement leaders to discuss strategies for addressing violent threats against school officials and teachers. Lastly, the department announced 10 new National Public Safety Partnership sites that will work with DOJ, local agencies, and community organizations to reduce violence in areas with elevated crime rates.



On September 30, 2021, the U.S. Senate confirmed Clifford D. Johnson to be the first African American to serve as the U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Indiana and Erek L. Barron to be the first African American to serve as the United States Attorney for the District of Maryland. Attorney Johnson was sworn in on Wednesday and Attorney Barron was <u>sworn</u> in on Thursday.



As board Chairwoman Mary Martin sought to quiet her and move the meeting along, Bessette proceeded over her objections to read a Bible verse that proclaimed "whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea."

"You are responsible for all your decisions," Bessette warned board members as she walked away to the applause of a few of supporters in the library at Poland Regional High School.

She said Wednesday that she meant that "at the end, everyone will be held responsible before God" for "horrible choices" like the one to require masks that she thinks are "muzzling these kids."

Of the seven school districts in the two U.P. counties, only one previously had a mask mandate. After the school board for the Norway-Vulcan Area Schools voted 5-2 to require masks for elementary students, there was a death threat against a school board member on social media

"You can't print exactly what it said, but leaving out the curse words and the Nazis, it said, 'We need to find out where this board member lives and go there and bring a rope," said Norway-Vulcan Superintendent Lou Steigerwald. "We called the police and the person took down the post.

WASHINGTON (7News) — Loudoun County School Board vice chair Atoosa Reaser shared a disturbing, racist death threat she received with her Facebook followers Thursday, adding that she wants to be transparent about the amount of hate that exists within the community.

"While many of us have received hate messages since taking office, I have only recently started sharing them because I realize the public needs to know and

understand that every bit of hate and anger we stoke feeds into the problem," she wrote.

A screenshot of the message she said she received started off like this: "Don't be surprised when you low-IQ, poorly educated, and morally bankrupt pinko traitors are dragged from your beds in the middle of the night and hanged by the neck until dead by the righteously angry parents of your community."

Captain Darrin DeWitt, the department's officer in charge, said city detectives are drawing sources of letters sent to neighbors Michael Oates and Scott James-Vickery. They have the assistance of Bergen County law enforcement partners.

"You will be taken by vote or by force," the post says.

Neither Oates nor James-Vickery are up for re-election, nor have they recently been involved in any particularly controversial decision. Although there have been public exchanges between board members and teachers 'union representatives, these are" a normal incident and nothing out of the ordinary, "a police report says.

STANLY CO., N.C. — After a tense school board meeting Tuesday night, board chairman Jeff Chance announced his resignation effective immediately after revealing his life had been threatened.

"At this time, I hereby resign from the board of education effective immediately," Chance said, before making a motion that the board adjourn.

His resignation came after board members discussed why the venue for the meeting has been changed from its usual location in the spacious Gene McIntyre Meeting Room to the much smaller staff development room, where the public was not allowed in except to briefly speak during public comments.

"We have to do everything we can to ensure the public has access to these things," said board member Anthony Graves who, along with board member Bill Sorenson, took issue with the board not allowing the public in-person access to the meeting.

Graves said he first found out about the change in location on Sunday and thought it had changed due to some sort of threat that was conveyed to board members or school faculty, but that was not the case.

Graves then reached out to the central office on Monday, where he was told that Chance has made the decision to move the meeting out of an abundance of caution.

During Tuesday's meeting, Chance revealed he had received death threats over the past few months, during a time where the board voted to require masks in schools which was heavily unpopular with large parts of the community.

This summer, Gibson started as superintendent for the Amador County Unified School District. Just before school started, things looked bright: Coronavirus case numbers were down, California was reopening and masks were coming off. But she soon realized that as the Delta variant emerged, masks, testing and quarantines would once again be required. That meant trouble.

"I was feeling PTSD," said Gibson, 45, said from her office in Jackson. "Not much rattles me. I can go with the punches, I can be screamed at, I can have complete chaos erupt and am like, 'We've got this.' ... But I said, 'This is going to be a really rough year."

Anti-maskers have emailed her death threats. In late September, police came to one of her schools after a family directed their child to attend class unmasked and refused to leave until authorities were called.

Justice Department Addresses Violent Threats Against School Officials and Teachers

WASHINGTON – Citing an increase in harassment, intimidation and threats of violence against school board members, teachers and workers in our nation's public schools, today Attorney General Merrick B. Garland directed the FBI and U.S. Attorneys' Offices to meet in the next 30 days with federal, state, tribal, territorial and local law enforcement leaders to discuss strategies for addressing this disturbing trend. These sessions will open dedicated lines of communication for threat reporting, assessment and response by law enforcement.

"Threats against public servants are not only illegal, they run counter to our nation's core values," wrote Attorney General Garland. "Those who dedicate their time and energy to ensuring that our children receive a proper education in a safe environment deserve to be able to do their work without fear for their safety."

According to the Attorney General's memorandum, the Justice Department will launch a series of additional efforts in the coming days designed to address the rise in criminal conduct directed toward school personnel. Those efforts are expected to include the creation of a task force, consisting of representatives from the department's Criminal Division, National Security Division, Civil Rights Division, the Executive Office for U.S. Attorneys, the FBI, the Community Relations Service and the Office of Justice Programs, to determine how federal enforcement tools can be used to prosecute these crimes, and ways to assist state, Tribal, territorial and local law enforcement where threats of violence may not constitute federal crimes.

The Justice Department will also create specialized training and guidance for local school boards and school administrators. This training will help school board members and other potential victims understand the type of behavior that constitutes threats, how to report threatening conduct to the appropriate law enforcement agencies, and how to capture and preserve evidence of threatening conduct to aid in the investigation and prosecution of these crimes.

Threats of violence against school board members, officials, and workers in our nation's public schools can be reported by the public to the FBI's National Threat Operations Center (NTOC) via its national tip line (1-800-CALL-FBI) and online through the FBI website (http://fbi.gov/tips). To ensure that threats are communicated to the appropriate authorities, NTOC will direct credible threats to FBI field offices, for coordination with the U.S. Attorney's Office and law enforcement partners as appropriate. Reporting threats of violence through NTOC will help the federal government identify increased threats in specific jurisdictions as well as coordinated widespread efforts to intimidate educators and education workers.

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Justice Department Addresses Violent Threats Against School Officials and Teachers

WASHINGTON – Citing an increase in harassment, intimidation and threats of violence against school board members, teachers and workers in our nation's public schools, today Attorney General Merrick B. Garland directed the FBI and U.S. Attorneys' Offices to meet in the next 30 days with federal, state, tribal, territorial and local law enforcement leaders to discuss strategies for addressing this disturbing trend. These sessions will open dedicated lines of communication for threat reporting, assessment and response by

law enforcement.

"Threats against public servants are not only illegal, they run counter to our nation's core values," wrote Attorney General Garland. "Those who dedicate their time and energy to ensuring that our children receive a proper education in a safe environment deserve to be able to do their work without fear for their safety."

According to the Attorney General's memorandum, the Justice Department will launch a series of additional efforts in the coming days designed to address the rise in criminal conduct directed toward school personnel. Those efforts are expected to include the creation of a task force, consisting of representatives from the department's Criminal Division, National Security Division, Civil Rights Division, the Executive Office for U.S. Attorneys, the FBI, the Community Relations Service and the Office of Justice Programs, to determine how federal enforcement tools can be used to prosecute these crimes, and ways to assist state, Tribal, territorial and local law enforcement where threats of violence may not constitute federal crimes.

The Justice Department will also create specialized training and guidance for local school boards and school administrators. This training will help school board members and other potential victims understand the type of behavior that constitutes threats, how to report threatening conduct to the appropriate law enforcement agencies, and how to capture and preserve evidence of threatening conduct to aid in the investigation and prosecution of these crimes.

Threats of violence against school board members, officials, and workers in our nation's public schools can be reported by the public to the FBI's National Threat Operations Center (NTOC) via its national tip line (1-800-CALL-FBI) and online through the FBI website (http://fbi.gov/tips). To ensure that threats communicated to the appropriate authorities, NTOC will direct credible threats to FBI field offices, for coordination with the U.S. and Attornev's Office law enforcement partners appropriate. Reporting threats of violence through NTOC will help the federal government identify increased threats in specific jurisdictions as well as coordinated widespread efforts to intimidate educators and education workers.



On the evening of October 08, the Prince William Health District (PWHD) in **Virginia** recommended a one week temporary pause of in-person learning (October 12 – 15), at Bennett Elementary School due to 36 confirmed positive COVID-19 cases, three probable positive cases all in isolation, and more than 200 close contacts in quarantine. Bennett Elementary will deliver learning instruction virtually by classroom teachers during this time. There are indications that the cause of the spread of COVID-19 at Bennett Elementary School may be linked to both transmission in the community and the school.

On Thursday, October 7, health officials for the nine California Bay Area jurisdictions issued criteria for lifting health orders requiring face coverings in most indoor public spaces.

Pfizer and BioNTech have formally requested that the FDA authorize emergency use of their COVID 19 vaccine for children ages 5 to 11. The companies' trial data supports a smaller dose for children in this age group than that given to older children and adults. The FDA has scheduled a meeting to consider the request on October 26, with a ruling is expected by the end of November.

The World Health Organization (WHO) launched a **Strategy to Achieve Global Covid-19 Vaccination** to vaccinate 40% of the population of all countries by the end of the year and 70% by mid-2022. In addition, the WHO for the first time published a definition of "post COVID-19 condition," which states that common symptoms include fatigue, shortness of breath, and cognitive dysfunction, "but also others which generally have an impact on everyday functioning."

According to a new modeling study published in Pediatrics, approximately 1 out of 500 children in the US has experienced COVID-19-associated orphanhood or death of a grandparent caregiver.

The National Foundation for Infectious Diseases released new data that showed 44% of US adults are unsure or do not plan to get vaccinated against the flu, including 23% who are at higher risk for flu-related complications.

The COVID-19 Public Emergency declared by the District of Columbia Mayor's Order 2020-045, dated March 11, 2020, has been extended until January 07, 2022.

As Federal pandemic relief funds are exhausted, many hospitals are struggling financially and taking out lines of credit to make it through the COVID-19 crisis. Hospitals continue to lose revenue from cancelled elective surgeries and are facing increased labor costs due to the need for temporary nurses to alleviate staffing shortages. Federal funding released September 10 covers expenses incurred through March 31, 2021, prior to the Delta surge.

A Colorado based health system says it is denying organ transplants to patients who are not vaccinated against COVID-19 in "almost all situations," citing studies that show kidney transplant patients are at increased risk of death from COVID-19 infection. Other centers across the country have similar policies in addition to other stringent health requirements.

Due to higher than expected numbers of false positives, Australian company Ellume is recalling nearly 200,000 at home COVID 19 tests from specific lots that were shipped to the US. A total of 427,000 kits were affected, about

half of which had already been used. The issue did not affect reliability of negative results. Users will be notified in the app that the test has been recalled.

The US Attorney General directed the FBI and US attorneys' offices to meet with local leaders nationwide to help address a "disturbing spike in harassment, intimidation, and threats of violence" against educators and school board members over politicized issues, including COVID-19 mitigation efforts.

AstraZeneca has asked the FDA to grant emergency authorization of its antibody treatment to prevent symptomatic COVID 19 infection in those at high risk for the disease. Effective for up to 12 months, it would be the first long acting drug for people who don't mount a sufficient protective response from vaccination.

Students and staff at Suffolk Public Schools will be given at-home COVID-19 testing kits if they show symptoms of, or were exposed to, COVID-19. The kits are part of the **Virginia** Department of Education and VDH **Virginia** School Screening Testing for Assurance program.

Data shows that Molnupiravir, an investigational oral antiviral for COVID-19 produced by Merck and Ridgeback Biotherapeutics, is capable of cutting COVID-19 hospitalization or death risk approximately in half.

A National Institute of Health study suggested fully vaccinated people with substance use disorders may be at higher risk for SARS-CoV-2 breakthrough infections than people without substance use disorders.

The **Los Angeles** City Council has implemented one of the strictest COVID 19 vaccine mandates in the country, requiring patrons to show proof of vaccination or recent negative test results to enter indoor spaces such as restaurants, gyms, salons, and entertainment venues. Retail establishments, such as grocery stores and pharmacies, were not included in the ordinance. The mandate goes into effect next month and businesses found in violation could be subject to fines.




