

787. **United States v. Forestal Land, Timber and Railways Ltd., Civil 23-510:** Complaint filed under Sections 1 and 2 of the Sherman Act and Section 73 of the Wilson Tariff Act December 20, 1943, in the District Court (S. D. N. Y.), against three foreign corporations, three American corporations and four of their officers charging violations of the Sherman Act by maintenance of an international cartel in QUEBRACHO. On March 22, 1945, on motion of the United States, the court allowed Tannin Products Export Corporation to be joined as party defendant and further stated that Section 75 of the Wilson Tariff Act and Section 5 of the Sherman act authorizing the bringing in of additional parties, do not prohibit the introduction of events which occurred preceding the filing of the original complaint (CCI 1944-1945 TRADE CASES ¶ 57,348). On December 12, 1945, a consent decree was entered against one defendant. The case was dismissed on May 27, 1949, because the Argentine government has taken over control of the product in question, and the principal American defendant corporations have been dissolved.
