

























Dedicated Docket Representation Rates¹





Pending Unaccompanied Noncitizen Child (UAC) Cases





Median Unaccompanied Noncitizen Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time





































Median Unaccompanied Noncitizen Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time





New Cases and Total Completions - Historical



























Median Unaccompanied Noncitizen Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time





New Cases and Total Completions - Historical






















In Absentia Removal Orders in Cases Originating with a Credible Fear Claim¹





Pending Unaccompanied Noncitizen Child (UAC) Cases









Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹









FY 2022 (Third Quarter) Asylum Grant Rates by Court









Median Times for Pending Detained Cases¹









Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) In Absentia Removal Orders1











Pending Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases





Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹



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

Asylum Decision Rates by Nationality in Cases Originating with a Credible Fear Claim¹

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



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FY 2022 (Second Quarter) Asylum Grant Rates by Court







Median Completion Times for Detained Cases¹








Percentage of DHS-Detained Cases Completed within Six Months¹








Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time



Initial Receipts with Specific Charges¹







Inactive But Pending Cases by FY of Administrative Closure





Active and Inactive Pending Cases between February 1, 2012 and May 17, 20181







Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹





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FY 2022 (First Quarter) Asylum Grant Rates by Court







Median Completion Times for Detained Cases¹









Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) In Absentia Removal Orders1





Pending Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases





Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time







Initial Receipts with Specific Charges¹







Inactive But Pending Cases by FY of Administrative Closure



















Median Times for Pending Detained Cases¹







Percentage of DHS-Detained Cases Completed within Six Months¹







Asylum Applicant In Absentia Removal Orders1





Pending Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases





Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time







Initial Receipts with Specific Charges¹





Inactive But Pending Cases by FY of Administrative Closure






Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹





FY 2021 Asylum Grant Rates by Court








Percentage of DHS-Detained Cases Completed within Six Months¹



Initial Receipts with Specific Charges¹







Inactive But Pending Cases by FY of Administrative Closure






Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹



Asylum Decision and Filing Rates in Cases Originating with a Credible Fear Claim¹









Median Completion Times for Detained Cases¹







Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time







Inactive But Pending Cases by FY of Administrative Closure




Active and Inactive Pending Cases¹









Fiscal Year (FY) 2008 - FY 2020 (Third Quarter)









FY 18 Asylum Grant Rates by Court

















In Absentia Removal Orders in Cases Originating with a Credible Fear Claim¹







Number of Courtrooms





Pending Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases





Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time











Inactive But Pending Cases by FY of Administrative Closure





Active and Inactive Pending Cases¹





Affirmative Asylum Applications¹





Defensive Asylum Applications¹






Attorney Discipline Complaints Received










Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹



New Cases and Total Completions







Current Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases Pending More than Three Years















Fiscal Year (FY) 2008 - FY 2018





Initial Receipts with Specific Charges¹







In Absentia Removal Orders in Cases Originating with a Credible Fear Claim¹ with Nationality of Guatemala





Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) In Absentia Removal Orders1










Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹





Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time









Asylum Applicant In Absentia Removal Orders1








Percentage of DHS-Detained Cases Completed within Six Months¹



In Absentia Removal Orders in Cases Originating with a Credible Fear Claim¹









Percentage of DHS-Detained Cases Completed within Six Months¹





Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time









Pending Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases




Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time


Current Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases Pending More than Three Years



Percentage of DHS-Detained Cases Completed within Six Months¹




