This case is before the Court on remand from the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit, following that court's decision in United States v. Alaw, 327 F.3d 1217 (D.C. Cir. 2003). In Alaw, the D.C. Circuit upheld this Court's January 17, 2002 injunction with the exception of Part C, which was vacated and remanded to this Court. *and the absence of any opposition,* After consideration of the record, this Court orders as follows:

It is hereby

ORDERED, that Plaintiff's Motion for Entry of Order on Remand is granted; it is further

ORDERED, that Part C of the injunction shall permanently enjoin Defendants Philip "Flip" L. Benham, Mark H. Gabriel, Howard S. Heldreth, Troy E. Newman, and Jeffrey L. White, and any person acting as any Defendant's agent or employee as required by Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(d), from demonstrating within

twenty feet from either side or edge of, or in front of, doorways or doorway entrances, parking lot entrances, driveways and driveway entrances of any facility where abortions are performed that is located within the boundaries of Interstate 495.
