# **ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE**



Environmental justice is a principle that combines civil rights with environmental protection by asking:

Are all people, regardless of race, color, national origin, or income, receiving **fair treatment** and **meaningful involvement** with respect to the development, implementation, & enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies?

**Fair treatment** means no group bears a disproportionate share of the negative environmental consequences from industrial, governmental, and commercial operations or policies, or from the execution of federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and policies.

**Meaningful involvement** means that people have an opportunity to participate in decisions about activities that may affect their environment and/or health, that their input can influence the decisions, and that their concerns will be considered in the decision-making process, and that decision makers will seek out and facilitate the involvement of those potentially affected.

Ensuring safe living and working conditions for our entire community is a priority in the Middle District of Alabama. Notifying the U.S. Attorney's Office about environmental justice concerns helps us protect the community from harmful violations of federal law.
