National Night Out Expenditures

On August 2, 2016, National Night Out events will take place in communities across the country. National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie. The Asset Forfeiture and Money Laundering Section frequently receives inquiries from agencies regarding the use of shared funds in support of this event. Below are examples of the various types of permissible and impermissible expenditures in support of National Night Out.

Permissible Expenditures

- Community mailers or flyers advertising the event
- Nominal value giveaways with anti-crime and crime prevention slogans (do not print names of agency head)
- Child Identification Kits
- DARE activity books
- Public Address system, audio/visual, podium, and sun canopy rentals
- Motivational Speaker fees for individuals with anti-crime message

Impermissible Expenditures

- Water, food, or beverages of any kind
- Moon bounce, face painter, clown rentals, or other entertainment
- Pony rides
