

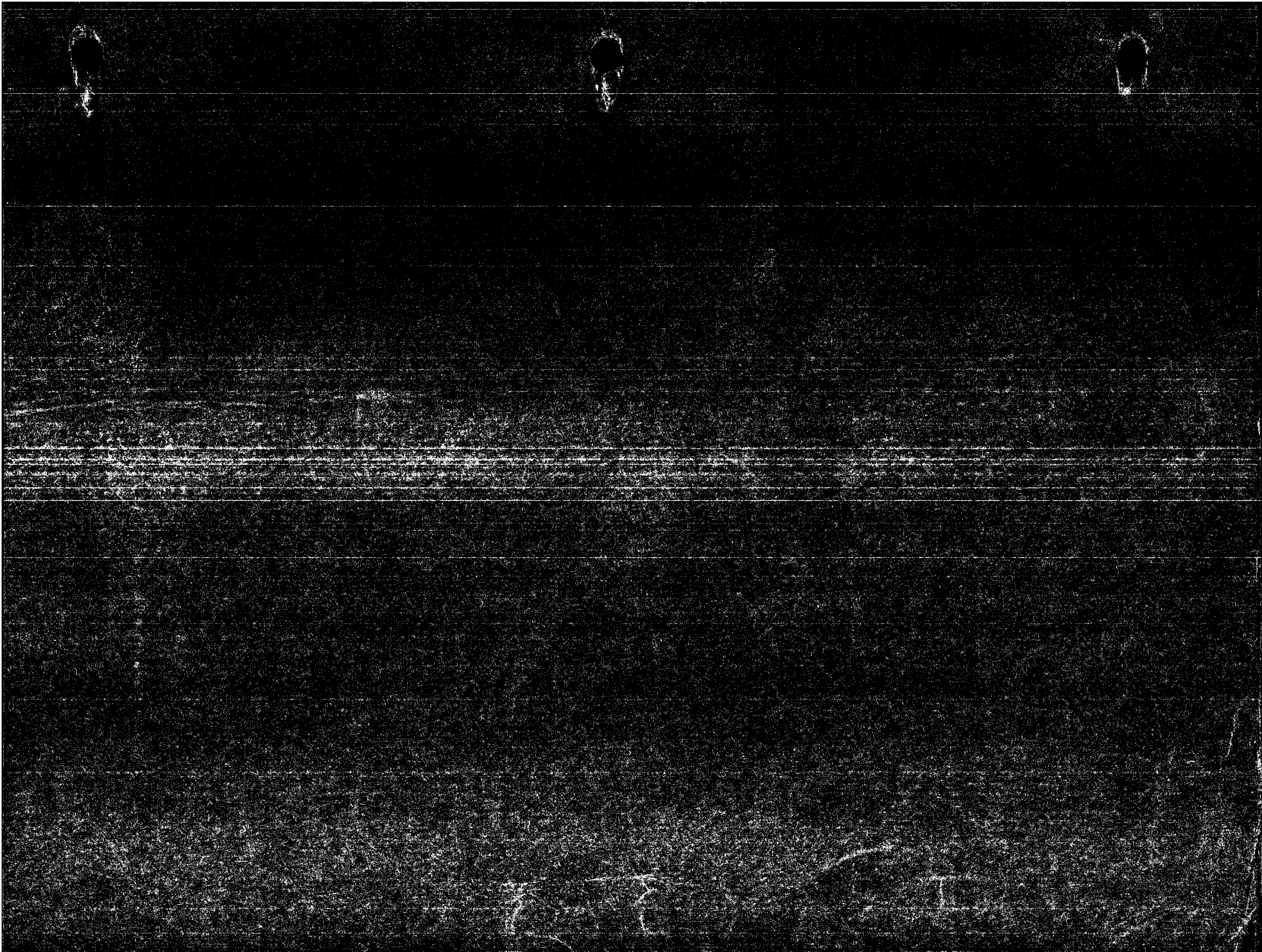

TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES
OF AMERICA IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

I have the honor to report on the administration of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, pursuant to Section 11 of the Act, which requires the Attorney General from time to time to report to the Congress concerning the administration of the Act, as well as the nature, source and content of political propaganda disseminated or distributed by agents of foreign principals registered under the Act.

It has been the policy of the Department since 1950 to prepare a report each year. This report covers the administration and enforcement of the Foreign Agents Registration Act for the calendar year 1972.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY

During the year 1972, the Department received 100 new registration statements and terminated 81 registrations, leaving a total of 481 active registrations on file as of December 31, 1972. Individuals acting as officials or employees or rendering assistance to a registrant for or in the interest of the latter's foreign principal filed 473 short-form registration statements under the Act.

In this reporting year, the staff of the Registration Unit reviewed 1,615 supplemental statements and processed 12,293 pieces of both incoming and outgoing correspondence which involved other government agencies, registrants and the general public. There were 116 agreements with new foreign principals reported by agents already registered under the Act.

ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT

In the administration of this Act, the Department employs normal administrative procedures to effect compliance with its provisions while necessary investigative actions are conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Statements and exhibits filed by registrants are carefully reviewed by staff attorneys to determine their conformity with the disclosure provisions of the Act, with the consequence that requests by the Department for additional information or other corrective action resulted during this year in the submission of 203 amendments to active registrations and it was necessary to employ one injunctive remedy.

In addition, information provided by government agencies or obtained from public sources is also reviewed and considered by staff attorneys to determine whether the various provisions of the Act would be applicable.

The Department also continued the practice of distributing copies of registration statements and supplements thereto to interested departments and agencies of the Federal Government.

NATURE, SOURCE AND CONTENT OF POLITICAL PROPAGANDA

The following is an analysis of the principal trends noted during 1972 in the propaganda material disseminated within the United States in the English language on behalf of the foreign principals and geographical areas listed. Principal publications are set forth together with the approximate circulation figures per issue.

During the year 1972, 7,387 dissemination reports were filed in connection with the distribution of 20,189 different pieces of propaganda which were submitted.

The Arab Information Center during 1972 distributed numerous publications concerning the conflict in the Middle East. Its January 1972 issue of Palestine Digest, a magazine containing reprints of newspaper and magazine articles and editorials about current aspects of the Middle East situation, reported that "The U. N. General Assembly on December 3, 1971 adopted three anti-Israel resolutions. The first acknowledged the inalienable rights of the Palestinians. The second called on Israel to take steps without any further delay for the return to their homes - those Palestinians who fled from the territories occupied by Israel during the Six-Day War in June 1967. The third, concerning Gaza, deplored the Israeli actions taken there and called on her to desist from further destruction of buildings in the refugee camps and the return to them of former inhabitants resettled in Sinai by Israel." The same issue also cited a resolution approved by the United Nations General Assembly calling on Israel to withdraw from occupied Arab territories.

Subsequent issues included reprints of articles dealing with the following topics:

"The United Nations Commission on Human Rights adopted on March 22, 1972 a resolution on the violation of human rights in the occupied Arab territories."

"The World Health Organization Assembly passed an anti-Israel resolution on May 24, 1972. . . The resolution condemned Israel for destroying Arab homes, expelling civilians, mistreating people, refusing to allow Arab refugees to return and lack of cooperation with the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Arab Refugees."

"The United Nations Security Council on June 26, 1972 condemned Israel's attacks on Lebanon."

"In its strongest anti-Israel stand ever, 23 African heads of state and representatives from 19 other members of the Organization of African Unity condemned continued Israeli aggression against Egypt. They called for the return of occupied Arab lands."

All three registrants during the year disseminated booklets and reprints of articles discussing further details of the various aspects of the Middle East conflict.

On Terrorism, a booklet prepared by the Arab Information Center, listed "members of Zionist terrorist gangs who became prominent officials in the Israeli governing establishment" together with a "record of Israeli Terrorism in Palestine and the Arab World" and alleged that "Since the establishment of the State of Israel these acts of wanton terror have not ceased. . . The purpose of these barbaric attacks has always been to consolidate the spoils of earlier aggressions and to extend these aggressions still deeper into the Arab World."

Judaization of Jerusalem (Arab Information Center) This study deals with "Israel's ceaseless efforts to annex Jerusalem before and after 1967 as well as the illegality of such annexation and the international protest against annexation which was climaxed by the United Nations rejection of Israel's measures."

A Chronology of Zionist and Israeli Terrorism, a pamphlet published by the Palestine Liberation Organization, states "The list is admittedly incomplete, but the breadth of the activities cited at least indicates the nature of the record of achievement of the early Zionist movement and the State of Israel directed against the Palestinian peoples in particular, as well as the Arab people and in many cases Europeans in general. Of special interest will be the methods employed throughout the years, including the early and systematic use of the letter and package bomb."

Basic Facts About the Palestine Problem, a leaflet prepared by the Palestine Liberation Organization, alleges "That ever since the advent of Zionism, de-Arabization of Palestine was an integral part of the Zionist philosophy, and that the expulsion of the Arab peoples of Palestine was premeditated, calculated and carried out in fulfillment of this philosophy."

Zionists Committing United States Further and Further Into Zionist Wars of Aggression and Expansion (Palestine Arab Delegation) "The United States must become neutral in the Middle East conflict and refuse to commit itself to war either for the Arabs or Jews."

Other publications distributed in 1972 discussed Arab culture, art and literature. The Spring issues of Arab World included not only an editorial on "War Crimes" referring to the United Nations Human Relations Commission's resolution calling upon Israel "to desist from all policies and practices affecting the demographic structure or physical character of the occupied Arab territories" but also such cultural articles as "The legacy of Islamic Artistry in Europe." The magazines also included excerpts of Arab poetry, color reproductions of Islamic art and articles on Arabic music, architecture and crafts.

The Australian Daily News, published each weekday by the Australian News and Information Bureau, made available in the United States most of the important happenings in Australia during 1972. Leading articles from various Australian principal cities such as Canberra, Perth, Melbourne and Sydney are included.

Economy: "The Prime Minister told a group of Australian manufacturers he believed the worst of the local economic downturn was over. He said the economy would continue to gather strength steadily and deliberately providing there were no self-inflicted injuries resulting from prolonged industrial trouble."

Tourism: "The General Manager of the Australian Tourist Commission stated that one and a half million tourists would be visiting Australia annually by 1980. He told the Australian National Travel Association convention in Sydney that tourism by that time would be one of Australia's largest industries."

Vietnam: "In the changing and improving circumstances, the Australian Government had been giving close consideration to the future of the Australian forces in Vietnam. It had for some time been policy to withdraw the forces progressively, as and when, in the Government's judgement and after consultation with the Republic and the United States, the situation had allowed it. He [Prime Minister McMahon] was now able to announce that the Government had decided to withdraw all remaining Australian combat forces from Vietnam."

Soviet Naval Presence: "The Australian Minister for Defense described the Soviet naval build-up in the Indian Ocean as basically an offensive fleet and not a defensive one. He said the federal government saw the build-up as a long-term strategic threat."

Further news stories in greater detail were published in the Australian News Weekly Round-up.

Nuclear Weapons Resolution: "United Nations adoption of a draft resolution on nuclear weapons sponsored by Australia and New Zealand and other Pacific nations was applauded by the Minister of Foreign Affairs. The resolution which calls for an end to nuclear testing in the Pacific and elsewhere in the world, was approved without amendment by the main political committee of the U. N. General Assembly."

Summit Conference: "The Prime Minister described President Nixon's recent visit to the Soviet Union as another massive stride along the road towards reducing international tensions and another contribution to making the world a more peaceful place in which to live in freedom and peace of mind."

China-Japan Relations: "China and Japan signed a joint communique establishing diplomatic relations and agreeing to an early exchange of ambassadors. Officials of the Department of Foreign Affairs in Canberra said the understanding would make a great contribution to world security and stability, and relieve tensions."

The Australian Economic Newsletter is a monthly publication reporting specific economic news. The February issue reported that "the Prime Minister announced a series of measures designed to ease the employment situation and to stimulate economic activity. . .and although the measures were aimed at creating more jobs and boosting confidence in the economy, the most difficult problem still facing the government was inflation." The May issue in reporting the results of the Quarterly Survey of the Australian and New Zealand Banking Group stated, "the various government measures, including reductions in interest rates, the release of funds from the statutory reserves deposits of the trading banks and the removal of restraints on bank lending, did much to realign the Australian economy in a more expansionary and progressive direction." Moreover, the September issue reported that "Although some major problems remain to be resolved, particularly international monetary relationships, marketing of rural products and the persistence of inflation, Australia's overall economic outlook appears much more promising than at this time last year."

The Australian Science Newsletter, a monthly information report, discussed a wide variety of topics as seen from the following list of titles:

Sydney Morrell & Company during 1972 distributed an 8-page monthly economic report entitled Australian Newsletter on behalf of the Victoria Promotion Committee describing the investment potential of Australia, and Victoria in particular and encouraging United States investment in Australia. "Businessmen visiting

Australia are invited to use the facilities made available by the Victoria Promotion Committee at no cost to assist them in assessing the investment potential of the country and the State of Victoria in particular." Some of the topics of Australian economic growth and future investment potential included the following:

Wool Industry: "Recent sales of wool have exceeded all expectations, and confidence is already beginning to be restored in this industry."

Tourism: "A survey completed recently by the Australian Tourist Commission shows that Americans were Australia's main source of overseas tourist income last year. . . Tourism is to be vigorously promoted over five years and the industry is described as responsible for 7.9% of the GNP of the country."

Schools: "Victoria is spending more than ever on schools to meet its largest annual enrollment."

Business Property: "Property values are rising in Melbourne's central business district . . . sales represented a 40% increase over last year."

Economy: "Most recent statistics have confirmed that the slow growth in production continued well into 1972, although total farm product rose strongly, after some years of little growth. . . There are signs of improvement in the economy in terms of the tempo and activity, as reference to the statistical indicators of sales and finance will show. . . It is also significant that government policy is obviously and deliberately directed toward stimulating the economy by a variety of measures both through the monetary system, with reduced interest rates and ample liquidity, and with added stimulus imparted in the Federal Budget."

During 1972 numerous news releases were issued by the public relations firm of Maurice Feldman outlining plans and projects designed to increase investment in Austrian economy. The City administration of Vienna was reported to have opened three industrial parks to attract new industrial enterprises and encourage the expansion of existing ones. Industrial investments in Vienna were reported to have increased 33% in 1971 with the rise expected to continue. Branch offices of major American banks are reported now operating in Vienna. In one release the United States is described as being Austria's largest overseas trading partner with the United States expected to register a surplus of \$40,000,000 in its trade with Austria. Some of the articles sold to the United States include winter sports equipment with Austria described as taking first place as the supplier of skis to the United States. Austria buys primarily machinery, vehicles, foodstuffs, chemicals, feed and raw materials.

Graz, Austria's second largest city, is reported as hosting American conventions and offering a variety of attractions for United States firms interested in establishing businesses in Austria. The boom in Austrian economy is described as in its fifth year "with a real growth rate of 5% anticipated for 1972" and "unemployment has been at its lowest level in 27 years. All sectors of Austrian economy, including manufacturing, construction, tourism and the export-import trade have shared in this uninterrupted prosperity."

BANGLADESH

The biweekly news bulletin Bangladesh was distributed by the Washington office of the Bangladesh Mission for the first five months of 1972 until the establishment of the Embassy of Bangladesh which took over its functions. This newsletter contained statements of Prim Minister Mujibur Rahman that three million Bengalis were killed by Pakistani troops during the nine months occupation of Bangladesh and he called the actions of the Pakistani army "the greatest massacre of people in history." It reported that by early February 1972, 34 countries recognized the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh, 7 million refugees had returned from India and Rahman had established a going government in Dacca. This bulletin castigated the actions of the West Pakistani troops and stated "There is no hope of lingering ties with Pakistan." It further reported on Rahman's press statement in London on January 8 when he stated "I would like to thank all those freedom-loving states who have supported our national liberation struggle, in particular India, the Soviet Union, Poland, other Eastern European countries, the United Kingdom, France - and also those freedom-loving people around the world who supported our cause, including the people of the United States of America."

This newsletter also reported on the friendly meeting of Rahman and Indian Prime Minister Mrs. Indira Gandhi in Calcutta when a joint statement was issued agreeing "to promote cooperation between Bangladesh and India in every way possible, inspired by a vision of lasting peace, amity and good neighborliness." The Bangladesh also reported on the visit of Rahman to Moscow for a five day visit where he met with Premier Kosygin, President Padgorny and Secretary Brezhnev and where a joint declaration was issued with the Soviet Union offering assistance to Bangladesh in various areas. The Soviet leaders noted with satisfaction the statement by Rahman that Bangladesh completely agrees with the principles and purposes of the Charter of the United Nations and assumes all the obligations which the U. N. Charter imposes on states. In view of this the Soviet Union supported the request of the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh to be admitted to U. N. Membership. The newsletter reported on April 7, 1972 that the United States extended its recognition to the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh on April 4. The last few issues of Bangladesh contained articles on the Bangladesh-India trade agreement, celebration of Bangladesh's first anniversary of its independence, the rapid rebuilding of the war-torn villages and business establishments, and the U. N. Relief Operations for Bangladesh which received pledges of \$153 million in grants for reconstruction, importing foodgrains, equipment, spare parts, raw materials, chemicals and food.

Policano/Rothholz, Inc. issued various press releases on behalf of the Barbados Industrial Development Corporation with officials presenting their "Operation Beehive" program in such cities as Miami, New York, Minneapolis, Indianapolis, Atlanta, Baltimore and San Juan.

Under "Operation Beehive" Barbados offers manufacturers various incentives, such as duty free importation of raw materials used in manufacturing goods for re-export, a liberal ten year tax holiday, followed by a corporate tax ceiling of 12 1/2% for companies manufacturing only for export. Some of the factors which are reported to contribute to the success of the program are the island's highly literate, hard working, stable and productive labor force with political stability and good labor relations. Since Barbados gained its independence over 30 American businesses have opened on the island, in such fields as electronics, data processing, computer assembly, pharmaceuticals, and the manufacture of toys, wigs and garments.

CHINA

Peking Review, a 24 page political and theoretical weekly publication of Guozi Shudian (China Publications Centre) of Peking, China printed in English, French, German, Spanish and Japanese was the most comprehensive source of political propaganda about the PRC disseminated in the United States. Many of the articles published were often repeated in booklets, pamphlets and in poster material.

As with all PRC publications the teachings of Chairman Mao Tse-tung are the central theme running through all issues. The most important topics appearing in Peking Review during 1972 included the war in Viet Nam and PRC support of North Viet Nam, the entry of the PRC into the United Nations and the new diplomatic relations with the United States and Japan. The magazine is directed to Communist and non-Communist nations but most of the news articles on foreign countries concerned those with which the PRC enjoys friendly relations.

PRC condemnation of "U. S. imperialist aggression" and "Soviet revisionism" is repeated in each issue. The deep-rooted enmity towards Japan is thinly veiled although great efforts were made in the latter part of the year in establishing relations with Japan.

Japan: At the visit of Japanese Prime Minister Tanaka to negotiate and settle the question of the normalization of relations between the PRC and Japan, Premier Chou En-lai stated "Following Chairman Mao's teachings, the Chinese people make a strict distinction between the very few militarists and the broad masses of the Japanese people . . . leaders of China and Japan have already begun their talks of great significance on the question of the normalization of relations between the two countries. We expect that our talks will achieve complete success . . . China and Japan are close neighbors separated only by a strip of water and the two peoples have a profound traditional friendship."

Viet Nam: "The stand of the Chinese Government and people of supporting the Vietnamese people's just struggle is firm and unshakable. So long as U. S. imperialism does not stop its war of aggression against Viet Nam, the Chinese people will certainly perform their internationalist duty and continue to give all-out support and assistance to the Vietnamese people in their war against U. S. aggression and for national salvation until complete victory."

Middle East: The PRC was highly critical of the United States and the Soviet Union for "causing tensions in the Middle East." "The Chinese Government and people have always firmly supported the just struggle of the Palestinians and other Arab peoples and rendered support to the Palestinian people to the best of our capabilities . . . strongly condemn the barbarous and unscrupulous crimes of aggression committed by Israel against Syria and Lebanon in open contempt for the Security Council resolutions."

Pakistan: The PRC supported Pakistan in the India-Pakistan conflict and condemned India's invasion and occupation of East Pakistan "with encouragement and support from Soviet Union social-imperialism", warning India that "there can be no tranquility in the Indian-Pakistani subcontinent until India withdraws its troops from Bangladesh and from positions seized in the Pakistani section of Kashmir during the 1971 war."

Economic Growth: Each issue of Peking Review contained extensive articles on how by following the teachings of Mao progress was made in attaining and exceeding the goals set for 1972, the first year of China's Fourth Five Year Plan, in such areas as agriculture, fishing, mining, light and heavy industry, electric power and transportation.

U. S. Relations: President Nixon's visit to China in February 1972 was given wide coverage with the expressed hope "that the gains achieved during the visit would open new prospects for relations between the two countries not only in the interest of the Chinese and the American peoples but also to contribute to the relaxation of tension in Asia and the world."

China Pictorial is a large monthly magazine with excellent quality photographs in color and black and white which covered in picture form many of the topics presented in Peking Review portraying various aspects of domestic life, industrial development and agricultural achievements as well as China's relations with other nations.

Articles on youth, schools and industrial instruction quoted Mao for the proper guidance: "While their main task is to study, the students should also learn other things . . . so that by closely combining knowledge learned in the classroom with practice, teaching is more effective and the pupil's enthusiasm for manual labor is higher." The People's Liberation Army is depicted with a political Communist Party member in every squad and "the company Party branch paid great attention to exercising political leadership over the

company . . . It educated its commanders and fighters in Chairman Mao's revolutionary line, class struggle, revolutionary tradition and internationalism . . . This insured the fulfillment of their tasks including fighting the enemy, Military training, mass work and production." Pictures of the military working with the peasant farmers are presented to show that "the Army and the people are the foundation of Victory."

Most issues of the magazine devoted articles on table tennis as a means of enhancing friendship among nations as well as other sports including basketball, football, cycling and gymnastics.

President Nixon's visit to China received considerable attention with many color photographs of various events during his trip.

China Reconstructs, a monthly magazine in color and in black and white, published in English, French, Arabic, Russian and Spanish, contains articles on the welfare and culture of the Chinese People. It also points out how accomplishments were effectuated by following the teachings of Chairman Mao. Subjects covered in Peking Review were set out in pictorial form with special emphasis on medical advances, agricultural developments, schools, literature, opera, art, ballet and athletic events.

Chinese Literature, a pocket-size monthly, published stories, poems and sketches practically all of which included the teachings of Chairman Mao and their application. Quoting from Mao's talk on literature and art the May 1972 issue stated: "In the world today all culture, all literature and art belong to definite classes and are geared to definite political lines. There is in fact no such thing as art for art's sake, art that stands above classes, art that is detached from or independent of politics."

"Proletarian literature and art are a component part of the whole revolutionary cause; they are as Lenin said, cogs and wheels in the whole revolutionary machine."

"If our writers and artists who come from the intelligentsia want their works to be well received by the masses, they must change and remould their thinking and their feelings."

"The peasant and the handicraft workers were the basic classes which created the wealth and culture of this society."

The most frequently published political propaganda reflecting the views of the Republic of China was News from China, a daily news bulletin from Taipei provided by the Chinese Information Service which covered not only events and conditions in and about Taiwan but also gave considerable coverage to subjects concerning Mainland China. Two important events in 1972 were the visit of President Nixon to Peking in February and Taiwan's severance of diplomatic relations with Japan in September following Japan's recognition of the Peking Government.

News from China reported that the National Assembly of the Republic of China's statement on President Nixon's visit to Peking declared "null and void any compromise or understanding reached by the United States with the Chinese Communist regime that involves the rights and interests of the Republic of China . . . The Communist regime is a group of rebels which has no right whatsoever to represent the people on the mainland of China. And yet the President of the United States has held talks with them on an equal footing. None of us, the citizens of the Republic of China, can tolerate this . . . It is a sacred duty of the government and the people of the Republic of China to destroy the Chinese Communists who are now occupying the China Mainland and rescue our compatriots who have suffered immensely. No external force can intervene. We wish to declare to the world that the government and the people of the

Republic of China consider null and void any compromise or understanding our ally of the United States has reached with the Chinese Communists."

On recognition of the People's Republic of China by Japan News from China releases in September denounced Japan's actions as "a stab in the back" and "in total disregard of treaty obligations." The RC severed diplomatic relations with Japan on September 29, 1972 and held Japan responsible for the rupture. The RC National Assembly in its press releases declared the Japanese Prime Minister Tanaka and Chinese Premier Chou En-lai accord "null and void since the Chinese Communist regime cannot represent the Chinese people." News from China, on the day following the break with Japan, carried a statement of RC Premier Chiang Ching-kuo to the Legislative Yuan that Prime Minister Tanaka is bringing "endless disaster" to Japan by collaborating with the Chinese Communist regime and that "Our basic policy in foreign affairs is to continue and to strengthen existing diplomatic relations with other countries. As to those which have no diplomatic ties with us but are friendly, we shall actively maintain contacts with them in all forms of relationships. At the same time, we shall make further efforts in sowing new seeds of friendship in all parts of the free world in the hope that our good-will and amity will take root and grow."

Other subjects reported in publications of the Chinese Information Service included among others, the following:

Economy: "The nation's long range economic development efforts are aimed at expediting its economic modernization, achieving economic stability and raising the standard of living." President Chiang Kai-shek reported that the RC gained in strength despite the diplomatic setbacks suffered this year. "The foreign trade of our 15 million free people in this bastion [Taiwan] of national recovery has surpassed that of 700 million people enslaved on the China mainland." In 1972 the RC registered two-way foreign trade volume of \$5.7 billion exceeding the Chinese Communist regime which stayed around \$4 billion. Taiwan's gross national product was \$7.8 billion in 1972, an increase of 15.2% over 1971 with per capita income at \$375 up 12% over 1971's \$329 making the RC one of the most prosperous areas in Asia.

U. S. Relations: "Relations between the Republic of China and the United States remain firm on the four pillars of friendly ties, mutual defense, a common interest in economic progress and shared social values and experiences." President Nixon reaffirmed U. S. intention to continue diplomatic and other ties to Taiwan and will stand solidly behind its defense commitments to the Republic of China. The United States will continue to encourage American businessmen to make investments in Taiwan. Premier Chiang Ching-kuo in addressing the Legislative Yuan stated that "the emphasis of the Republic of China's foreign policy will be placed on strengthening ties with the United States and other friendly nations."

Tourism: During 1972 Taiwan had a 9% increase of tourists over 1971 with Japan heading the list with 55% of the visitors and the United States next with 24%. Japanese tourists sharply decreased after the rupture of diplomatic relations between Taipei and Tokyo in late September.

Industrial Development: Industrial development continued at a strong pace. The RC produced and sold more than 3.5 million black and white television sets during 1972 enhancing its role as the world's leading supplier after dethroning Japan a year ago. The Electronic Manufacturers Association looks forward to even brighter prospects in 1973.

Other publications disseminated by the registrants included Background on China which reprinted various news articles from the official Communist news agency (Hsinhua) in Peking as monitored in Taiwan for the benefit of students of Chinese Communist affairs, the majority of the articles being attacks on "U.S. Imperialism and its lackeys . . . the bombing of North Vietnam . . . full support for the Vietnamese people's war against U.S. aggression." Free China Weekly, a small four-page newspaper published in Taipei and reporting on current events in Taiwan and on Chinese people around the world with special attention focused on the Mainland and Free China Feature Service also recorded current events and remarks of Taiwan's leaders urging the free people to follow Chiang Kai-shek's teaching of self-reliance "so that through diligent effort they would overcome all difficulties and emerge victorious from their current struggle against the Maoists on the Chinese Mainland."

During the latter part of 1972 Hugh C. Newton & Associates, Inc. issued a series of press releases and letters to the editor accompanied by news clips concerning:

"Despite the action of the U.N., the Republic of China remains a thriving, prosperous nation of 15 million people with full economic, press and religious freedom and growing political freedom . . . In sum, Taiwan appears to have achieved political and economic stability, mirrored in a mood of general satisfaction with the nation's political and business leadership."

News clips forwarded with letters to the editor dealt with such topics as "Free China's Economic Boom Continues", "Taiwan Can Stand on Its Own Two Feet", "Red China Subverts U.N.". "U.N. to Avoid All Mention of Taiwan", "How China Refugees Swim to Hong Kong", "Report Charges Red China Major Contributor to U.S. Narcotics Problem."

Booklets distributed by the Chinese Investment and Trade Office were all prepared for the purpose of encouraging trade with and investment in the Republic of China and included: Investor's Guide, Taiwan, The Place to Invest in Asia, Utopia for Industrial Entrepreneurs and Statute for Encouragement of Investment.

Press releases written and distributed by Roy Duffus Associates, Inc. on behalf of the Colombian Information Service were principally devoted to new economic incentives to promote Colombian industries. The monthly newsletter of the Colombia Information Service, Colombia Today, included articles on the promotion of tourism and the various ways in which Colombia's National Tourist Corporation assists foreign investors in getting local cooperation. Colombia's business outlook is described "most encouraging" by the president of the country's National Association of Manufacturers in reporting on the nation's economy, industrial development and employment, foreign investment and the recently initiated Four-Year Export Expansion Plan which "will generate the foreign exchange needed to provide the resources in raw materials and equipment to develop domestic industry and to service our international debt." The dependence on its major export, coffee, (53%) and the vulnerability of the domestic economy to fluctuations in world prices and demand necessitated the government's export diversification program. For the year 1972 coffee exports may bring an increase of \$100 million in foreign exchange earnings, attributable in great measure to frost damage suffered by the Brazilian crop. The increase of over 57% in earnings from other exports during the first five months of this year reflects the success of the export diversification plan as reported in Colombia Today where it states "Colombia's drive for export diversification is beginning to show positive and significant results. Sizable growth has taken place in exports of agricultural commodities, particularly bananas, cotton, sugar, beef, cattle, and in manufactured and handicrafted products which multiplied from \$52 million in 1960 to \$270 million in 1971. Coffee averaged 66% of total exports during the 1960's. It declined to 53% in 1971."

Private enterprise plays the leading role in Colombia's expansion in manufacturing, with foreign investments a major contributor in wholly owned and joint venture enterprises. Housing is getting top priority in Colombia's new Four-Year Plan to overcome the chronic housing shortage. Public construction, expanding at a 22% annual rate, aims at building low and middle-income multiple family units in the major urban centers. Education is also making great strides with the goal of public grade school education for all children within five years.

One of the most noticeable factors of Colombia's general culture is the manufacture of textiles including upholstery and drapery fabrics while retaining the painstaking handwork and ancient motifs of yesteryear. Handicrafts account for a significant percentage of Colombian manufacturing.

FRANCE

France Actuelle is an eight page monthly economic report published in Paris by the Comite France Actuelle (prior to August 1972 it was issued twice a month) giving information on modern France and French affairs with emphasis on business and industrial news.

France Actuelle reported that French enterprise and industry reemphasized their commitments to continuing accord with the United States and the western community of nations toward a more equitable, orderly and expansive international trade. This bulletin stated France felt the impact of the United States 10% import surcharge and other trade measures, but these were lifted and the situation was straightening itself out with good will and concessions on both sides. Within the context of the two-centuries-old French-American friendship and alliance, France's business leadership is reported today to have two priority and long-term aims, one being to offer exceptional advantages for United States enterprise to invest in production plants in France, and the other to persuade French enterprise to invest and produce in the United States or at least to set up offices and sales networks for export of French techniques and products in the American market. Citing as an example France Actuelle reports that "CRG Medical Corporation, the American subsidiary of Compaigne Generale de Radiologie, with a large plant in Baltimore, Maryland, now does over \$50 million in sales to American doctors and hospitals of excellent products to quality-demanding customers."

Some of the varied subjects included in the 1972 issues of the bulletin were:

Automobiles: French automobile manufacturers continue their efforts to produce a better engineered and economical car with advanced styling and safety features. Renault's foreign market performance is meeting all competition and 56% of all cars manufactured last year were exported. In the United States over 6500 earn their living from Renault cars.

Wine: France last year despite high import duties shipped to the United States double the amount of French wines shipped five years before. "France continues firmly on top as the leading exporter of table wines to the United States."

Shipbuilding: French shipbuilding of specialized ships such as oil and liquid gas carriers increased 17% over last year and is fifth in the world in total tonnage produced.

Winter Resorts: "France is far-ahead first in winter resorts and sports." Quoting a British source, the bulletin reports "France has the most modern and best-equipped complex of ski resorts in Europe."

National Budget: The French national budget is in the black for the 4th consecutive year and the 1973 budget will "stress spending on public services like schools, health services, roads, public transportation and telecommunications."

Transatlantic Travel for Education: "More United States students go to France for part or even all of their secondary education than to any other country."

Housing: "In construction of new housing units in relation to population, France for some years has been ahead of, for instance, the United States, Great Britain, West Germany and all Eastern European countries." and "The emphasis has been on improving the quality of the apartments and houses and to increase the proportion of individual houses - so greatly preferred by most of the French. Thus the number of new individual homes constructed in relation to new apartments rose from 24% in 1963 to 40% in 1971."

Franco-American Project: ". . . France and the United States . . . are officially embarked on a mission to investigate volcanic activity that appears to be pushing apart the two sides of the Atlantic." Quoting New York Times science correspondent Walter Sullivan the bulletin describes the rift as "a network of giant cracks in the sea floor, often ten miles wide and two miles deep that extends into all the oceans and is at least 40,000 miles long." and "This three year Franco-American project has many parallels to the Apollo program for lunar exploration."

Labor Incomes: ". . . while wages in the United States over the years 1963-1969 increased an average annual 4.5%, in the same period French wages rose an annual average 8% and that while U. S. wages in 1969-1971 went up an average 6.1% a year, in France the annual average wage rise in these latest years was 10.9%."

French Contribution to NATO: "NATO's 'Nadge' automatic air defense system on the West's periphery from northern Norway to eastern Turkey, will be practically completed (84 stations) during the year. The top contributing French enterprise in the Allies 'Nadge' equipment consortium is Thomson-CFS, which participated in the creation and production of the 'Ares' tridimensional long-range radars and 'Lord' warning radars." "Thomson-CSF . . . has now been given the responsibility for advanced pinpointing and meeting all outside air challenges to NATO's defense over the next decade."

GERMANY

Roy Blumenthal International Associates, Inc. issued numerous press releases on the cultural and economic life of the City of Berlin with the benefits resulting from the Berlin Agreement and its easing of travel from West Germany to East Berlin. The Berlin Business Barometer issued by the registrant on behalf of the City-State of Berlin reports that "With its signature on the draft of the Berlin Agreement, the Soviet Union in effect guarantees the economic and cultural development of this divided city and its relationship with the rest of the world . . . Specifically, the Berlin Agreement calls for traffic of people and goods between [East] Berlin and West Germany to be unimpeded, facilitated, expeditious, and to receive preferential treatment." In tourism West Berlin continued to hold its position as a top tourist attraction.

In its releases disseminated on behalf of the German National Tourist Office West Berlin is depicted as the convention city for Europe with such events featured as the 8th International Women's Fashion Fair attended by hundreds of manufactures and thousands of buyers; Berlin's International "Green Week", largest agricultural land show in Europe, attended by hundreds of thousands of people from Germany and abroad; the 10th overseas import fair with 50 countries exhibiting and \$30 million in orders placed and the 21st German Conference on Medical Progress attended by 25,000 doctors.

The City of Hamburg was reported in numerous booklets and reprints by Paul G. Langfeld as being the leading seaport and largest industrial city in Germany offering the finest facilities and most modern methods of handling bulk goods and high grade general cargo. "As a major industrial city in Europe, a metropolis with the oldest and largest free port in the world, Hamburg offers unlimited advantages for building a plant, engaging in a joint venture or operating a sales office, reasons why 43 of the top 100 U. S. business and industrial firms are located in Hamburg." This city is described as having the largest universities in the Federal Republic of Germany, numerous institutes and research establishments of international repute and first class colleges of advanced technology, making it the main center of education and training for all of North Germany. "Hamburg with its 76 consulates and trade missions, is, after New York, the second largest consular city in the world. . ."

Oram International Corporation distributed press releases containing statements of former Prime Minister K. A. Busia, Accra, Ghana. Dr. Busia's statements were made in response to the military Government take-over in January 1972. "The will of the people, as expressed by their elected representatives in Parliament, should not have been replaced by self-appointed redeemers, in a country which had accepted the ballot box rather than the gun as the means of changing governments."

"Since January 13, 1972, when the democratically elected government of Ghana, of which the undersigned was Prime Minister [K. A. Busia], was overthrown by the army, Ghana has been ruled by military decree. Decree #2 of the so-called National Redemption Council (NRC) authorized the detention of ministers, ministerial secretaries, elected members of Parliament and party officials, without trial. Their only crime, apparently, was to hold political office in their own country."

"The military coup has no justification whatsoever. It can bring nothing but disaster. It violates the first principle of democracy, namely that governments should be changed not by the use of the gun but by the people exercising their choice through their votes at an election."

"The coup, which has started with the abolition of the constitution, the dismissal of the President, the Prime Minister, the Leader of the Opposition and of Parliament, with mass arrests and imprisonment of hundreds of people from all walks of life, in towns and villages, shows all the symptoms of the unstable and repressive character of dictatorships. It has no popular support. It can only rule through repression."

"The coup has come at a time when it can do the greatest damage to the future of Ghana, at a time of very great economic difficulties arising from increasing costs of imports due to world inflation and to a drastic fall in our export prices, particularly of cocoa, and to the heavy burden of debts inherited by my government from the military transitional government which in turn inherited it from the Nkrumah regime."

The Policy and Reference Division of the British Information Services published background information on the leading national issues of 1972 in Policy Background and set out the official British Government's views on major news topics through Policy Statements. The subject most discussed in these publications during 1972 was Northern Ireland where Britain suspended Northern Ireland's government and Parliament on March 30, 1972 and imposed direct rule over the province for at least a year, in an attempt to halt the continuing terrorist violence.

Prime Minister Edward Heath emphasized his consciousness of the British Government's responsibility for the future of Northern Ireland and said he would be guided by two main principles. ". . . first, that the status of Northern Ireland as part of the United Kingdom cannot be changed except by consent. . . second. . . that the minority in Northern Ireland must be assured of a real and meaningful part in the taking of the decisions which shape their future." British Secretary of State for Northern Ireland (newly created office) William Whitelaw reported that the purpose of the proposed plebiscite to be held in Northern Ireland in early 1973 is to assure the people of Northern Ireland that there would be no change in the position of their province as part of the United Kingdom without the consent of the majority of its inhabitants. He stated that "The voter is asked whether he wants Northern Ireland to be joined with the Republic of Ireland, outside the United Kingdom. . . . It is the people in Northern Ireland who must operate the new constitution, whatever it is, and it is for them to make known what they want." Policy and Reference Division quoted the comments of Irish national leaders and the leading Irish newspapers condemning the terrorist bombing activity in Belfast.

The British economic situation was also a major topic of BIS publications. Policy Statements in 1972 reiterated Britain's foreign affairs position quoting Prime Minister Heath on the British entry into the European Common Market: "For the first time since the war we have a policy which enables us to break out of the depressing circumstances which have confronted us for so long: the gradual decline in our relative economic strength, and the decline in the importance of our traditional markets and outlets. We can now, at last, take advantage of our European partners to win new influence and greater prosperity." Chancellor of the Exchequer Anthony Barber reported that all indications suggested that "The country is now achieving a five percent rate of growth. That is twice as fast as during the previous decade."

Policy Statements contained the comments of British Foreign and Commonwealth Secretary Sir Alec Douglas-Hume who stressed the importance of British partnership with the United States which is entirely compatible with European partnership: "On the strategic level of foreign policy in Europe, friendship with the United States and partnership with the United States in NATO is of cardinal importance to our approach on foreign policy and security affairs."

Today's British Papers and British Weeklies reprinted excerpts from editorials and official pronouncements appearing in either British daily or weekly leading liberal, independent and conservative newspapers on day-to-day events. The majority of these concerned Northern Ireland but comments on other news stories which received considerable attention included, the search for peace in Vietnam; immigration of expelled Uganda Asians to Britain; the problem of world-wide inflation; the visits of President Nixon to Moscow and Peking; the China-Japan agreement ending the 20 year old relations with Chiang-Kai Shek; and peace prospects in the Middle East.

British Record, a four-page digest put out 16 times in 1972, published in brief summary the official British position on major events and topics and left for the other British Information Services' publications the reporting of the detailed information.

BIS in 1972 disseminated numerous other publications on various subjects as indicated by their titles:

Organization of Political Parties in Britain
Literary Britain
Residence in Britain (Guide for U.S. citizens)

Sport in Britain

The British American Chamber of Commerce comprising over 600 firms nearly all engaged in transatlantic commerce published a monthly newsletter, British American Trade News in which the devaluation of the dollar, the U. S. trade deficit, and other issues affecting trade were discussed. Transatlantic Trade Topics a section of Trade News, devoted considerable attention to the efforts of American and the British to increase competitive and profitable trade. Cited as examples were the activities of American businessmen holding seminars in key cities of Europe to encourage investing in the United States and the report of the British Consul-General in New York that British commercial officers throughout the United States devote a large portion of their time visiting factories and other business organizations not only to make themselves more knowledgeable in the market but in search of profitable contracts and opportunities for British exports.

Trade News quoted the British Embassy Commercial Minister: "The United States position on trading matters affects all countries. The old cliché that when Uncle Sam catches cold the rest of the world is liable to catch pneumonia still holds true. Unfortunately, the feverish symptoms of protectionism are plainly visible and it is vital to try to stop the disease from spreading."

Of prime importance to the Chamber was proposed trade legislation and it dispatched numerous telegrams to members of Congress registering strongest objection to restrictive trade measures, protests against "Buy American" amendments and advocating liberal foreign trade policies by both the United States and Great Britain.

Other topics discussed in Trade News include:

Monopolies Control: "Europe in the next decade will implement stern measures to deal with price fixing, monopolies and anti-competitive moves by multi-national corporations. The anti-trust legislation in the US has not only frequently failed, but has been recognized as miserably ineffective. A European commission and a solid Europe will take on multi-national corporations with a will and ingenuity not yet understood in the United States. Witness already the \$108,000 fine imposed by the Commission on Pittsburgh Corning Europe SA. By 1980, giant US corporations will no longer be able to threaten relocation, unemployment and so forth on individual European countries."

Inflation: "Inflation in Europe is very bad, and shows no sign of alleviation; people want more and more consumer goods and services."

Trade Policy: "For the present we are particularly interested in protectionist threat to British commercial interests, as well as the way the Administration is likely to approach the next round of world trade negotiations it is hoped may start next year. We are also deeply concerned as to how US regulations are being applied to particular British exports, in giving advice to British exporters faced with US 'escape clause' and anti-dumping actions, and in keeping abreast of any new US safety and pollution standards."

D. Parke Gibson International, Inc. on behalf of the Republic of Guyana distributed releases stating that the nationally owned Guyana Bauxite Company, the world's major producer of calcined bauxite, had been a prime factor in Guyana's attaining under the leadership of Prime Minister Forbes Burnham "A position of dominance in the Caribbean, a position of leadership with the Third World and a position of respect in the total international community." It further stated that the country "has launched a wave of self-help projects that will see the nation in a position to house, clothe and feed itself by 1976. In its explanation of its nationalization of the aluminum companies the releases stated "More than a year ago, Burnham took his first major step toward the utilization of the land's resources for the good of the people. In a widely misunderstood move, the government took over the operation of the Aluminum Company of Canada. For years this country had been mining bauxite in Guyana and selling it on the world market. The move was misunderstood because the government originally attempted to form a partnership with Alcan and when they were unable to do so, the government took the company over. There were dire predictions from the business and financial community that without the knowledge of the whites running the company the Guyanese would be unable to run it. One year later, under the directorship of Mr. Pat Thompson, a Guyanese, the company issued its first financial statement and showed a profit of over \$7 million. Mr. Burnham makes it clear that negotiations will begin soon with another bauxite company owned by Reynolds Metals, an American concern. The terms offered will be basically the same as those offered Alcan."

On Guyana Development the releases stated "In the eight years he has been Prime Minister of Guyana, Forbes Burnham has seen Guyana become a trend-setter and an impressive force, not only within the Caribbean, but within the Commonwealth and the Third World. Guyana did not achieve independence until 1966; four years later than Jamaica and Trinidad. Yet in February 1970 she set a lead by becoming the first republic in the Commonwealth Caribbean; a Cooperative Republic in which her government's socialist philosophy is given form through the cooperative movement. It was Prime Minister Burnham who led Guyana to independence and into becoming a republic and, who is largely responsible for Guyana's present stability."

Hong Kong Trade Development Council published the Hong Kong Cable a monthly newsletter listing trade figures issued by the Hong Kong Government and other trade information data. Trade figures for the end of the year showed a continued favorable trend in the Colony's external trade with imports up 8.3% reaching a level of \$340 million, exports up 15.9% to \$267 million and re-exports up 16.5% ahead of the corresponding month last year to \$71 million.

Other topics included:

Mass Transit System: "The proposed mass transit railway system reached an important milestone with the powerful 56 company Japanese consortium headed by Mitsubishi emerging as one of the strongest contenders for the construction of the proposed \$1.1 billion underground railway system. In addition to Japan, this project has attracted the interest of consortiums in the U.K., Europe, Australia and the U.S."

Hong Kong for Expansion of Chemical Manufacture: "The Borg-Warner Corporation has started a series of discussions with Hong Kong business and financial houses exploring investment and expansion possibilities in the Colony."

Banking: "As evidence of Hong Kong's growing financial significance, Barclays Bank International, the fourth largest bank in the world has announced plans for the opening of a full branch office in Hong Kong early next year."

Tremendous Boom in Light Industries: During the past decade Hong Kong's light industries have shown tremendous growth. The labor force has more than doubled during this period and new towns have sprung up as a result of this rapid industrial development. Those industries which have developed in scope, scale and sophistication have been ones whose products have been able to withstand international competition without subsidy or protection as well as those who are geared to servicing the manufacturing of such products as electronics, plastics and watches and clocks."

Hong Kong Enterprise, Hong Kong Apparel and Hong Kong Toys are full-color catalogs of Hong Kong products and lists of manufacturers which the registrant disseminated to further export trade.

European Community, a 24 page monthly magazine, was published ten times during 1972 and distributed by the European Community Information Office as an agent of the Commission of the European Communities, Brussels, Belgium. The issues contained short articles of current news events as they related to the Common Market with major articles on such principal topics as the growth of the Common Market and trade relations with the United States.

The March 1972 issue contained such articles as The Community and U.S. Agree on Mutual Trade Concessions Now and International Talks in 1973 "which paved the way for approval by Congress for the devaluation of the dollar." The December issue reports that "Many United States states have opened trade offices in Brussels to seek export opportunities for home state manufacturers, to promote tourist traffic and to try to entice European investment to their home states." To indicate that the climate of relations between the European Community and the United States has improved greatly since the beginning of 1971 and that confrontation has yielded to compromise following the U.S. 10% import surcharge in August 1971, the publication quotes President Nixon's comments on the commitment of the nine countries to form the enlarged European Community: "On behalf of the United States, I wish to affirm our commitment to work with the members of the European Community for reform of the international economic system in a way which will bring about a new freedom of world trade, a new equity in international economic conduct, and effective solution to the problems of the developing world."

European Community in commenting on the attitude of Peking and Moscow toward the enlarged Common Market stated "Peking now wants a United Europe and considers the Community one of the large international regroupings capable of stemming the tide of imperialism . . . with France obviously Peking's favorite . . ." Russia's attitude was reported as "Pravda has continuously denounced the Common Market as a closed economic grouping benefiting only the capitalist monopolies."

European Community News, a four to six page biweekly newsletter distributed by the European Community Information Office was published 19 times during the year and devoted its articles to closer harmony between the member countries and advancing relations with other trade partners.

It reported that Great Britain, Denmark and Ireland voted approval of membership in the Common Market but Norway, in a public referendum, rejected Norwegian membership in the Community. In Brussels the reaction was one of disappointment with the European Community stating "It is a step backwards on the path toward European unity. The Commission hopes that time will give Norway another chance to participate in this great undertaking."

Other items reported included such subjects as:

"Business on the Upswing - Despite record inflation the business outlook in the EC is optimistic."

"European Community Willing to Share U. S. Burdens."

"World Mourns 'Mr. Europe' - Paul Henri Spaak, Chief Architect of the European Communities."

"China's Stake in a United Western Europe - Peking is paying special attention these days to cultivating good ties with Europe . . . because of Russia."

"Arabs Look to Europe - Departure of Soviet Advisers, arms, and influence from Egypt has turned Arab eyes toward Western Europe."

Radio scripts for broadcast tapes were distributed by the European Community Information Office on a weekly basis including such topics as "The Value Added Tax - What it Means", "Common Market Expects Prosperous New Year" and "Canada and Britain's membership in the Common Market."

Also distributed by the ECIO were Bulletin of European Communities, a monthly summary published by the Secretariat of the Commission giving the news of activities of the Commission and other Community activities and The United States and the European Community: Their Common Interests.

EFTA Reporter, a four page periodic newsletter, was distributed during the period by the EFTA Information Office on behalf of the European Free Trade Association and contained current news-related articles concerning trade relations of the nine member countries of the Association. Major topics concerned the withdrawal of Denmark and Great Britain from EFTA and their accession to the European Communities (Common Market) as well as important developments concerning free trade relations among EFTA countries and between them and the European Communities.

EFTA Bulletin, a 24 page news magazine, published 9 issues in 1972 with principal articles including "How International Treaties Are Implemented in EFTA Countries", "Swedish-Austrian Trade, an EFTA Success Story", "The Norwegian Economy Development and Change" and "Denmark and the United Kingdom Say Farewell to EFTA."

IRELAND

Ireland Industry News a quarterly newsletter contained a wide variety of items concerning industry in Ireland and what incentives were offered to foreign investors. The Summer 1972 issue restated the message from Prime Minister John Lynch that on May 10, 1972 Ireland voted itself into the European Economic Community and "our Industrial Development Authority has helped no fewer than 460 overseas manufacturing companies to come here and operate. This new blood has made a big contribution to our technical progress and to the flowering of our economy. Ten years ago, we were an agricultural country. Today, though agriculture has grown enormously, we are an industrial country. . . . Exporting companies investing in Ireland will enjoy duty free access to almost 260 million consumers. They will be in line for substantial capital grants and a unique, 100% relief from taxation of their profits for 15 years to come. Nowhere in Europe, inside or outside the EEC, are such incentives to be had."

IDAI disseminated numerous booklets dealing with tax relief and industrial incentives for foreign industrial interests in Ireland.

NORTHERN IRELAND

Oliver Beckman, Inc. distributed News of Northern Ireland a two page bulletin containing news, information and promotional material relative to the Government's efforts along with the British Industrial Development Office to attract foreign industry into the economy of the country. Mr. David Howell, Minister of State with responsibility for the Ministry of Commerce, is quoted as acknowledging that all factions in Northern Ireland recognize that the Province's problems are as much economic as political or religious. "The problems are all too familiar. High average unemployment with very high figures indeed for some towns. The difficulty of attracting new manufacturing industries from outside Northern Ireland, and the continued pressure on the agricultural community. Continued terrorism at a high level adds a further dimension to all these problems." Mr. Howell stated that the Government was launching an across-the-board program which included a wide range of cash grants, tax incentives and other concessions to stimulate Northern Ireland's commerce, industry, farming and tourism, the effect of such measures being "that industrialists undertaking investment in Northern Ireland will continue to receive more generous assistance than in any other part of the United Kingdom."

ISRAEL

The Israel Digest is a bi-weekly, eight page publication bearing in its caption "News of Israel-Direct from Israel." Its articles are related to current topics written in a concise newspaper style usually less than a page in length.

Lead articles were mostly concerned with the conflict with Arab nations and terrorism in the Middle East. Samples of articles published during 1972 included:

Ready for Unconditional Negotiations Towards Peace: "Golda Meir declares that Israel was as willing as before to conduct unconditional negotiations leading to a peace agreement, based on secure, agreed and recognized borders."

Dayan Stresses Regional Need for Peace: "Egypt, Syria and Jordan now need peace with Israel as much as we need peace with them. But it will still take a long time because a basic change in Arab approach is required in order to reach peace. Unless the Arabs renounce hatred of Israel, there will be no real peace."

After President Sadat's abrupt dismissal of the Soviet advisers in Egypt, Golda Meir appealed to Sadat "Let us sit down together to discuss peace settlements. Let us search for a way to break the deadlock. Let us advance toward complete peace."

Receiving particular attention was the Arab terrorists murder of eleven Israeli Olympic athlete hostages in Munich, Germany during the 1972 Olympic Games and the Lod Airport massacre when 26 persons were killed and 76 injured by three Japanese terrorists. Referring to the Lod massacre Prime Minister Golda Meir stated "We have borne the brunt of many attacks and terrorist acts, and we have always found a remedy to overcome them. I am certain this time, too, we shall find a way. It is no secret that Beirut is openly enabling the centers of terrorist organizations to reside in their midst."

Articles not directly related to the conflict in the Middle East reported on the Israeli economy and activities of Jewish individuals and organizations abroad. The emigration of Soviet Jews to Israel received considerable attention in such articles as:

Soviet Jews Hindered in Efforts to Leave: "Only one out of four Jews requesting an exit visa from the Soviet authorities gets one . . ."

The Russian plan to impose ransom payment of thousands of roubles upon Jewish academicians wishing to emigrate to Israel presents a continuation of the arbitrary measures that Soviet Russia has taken in order to frighten the Jews in Russia who are fighting heroically for their right to emigrate to Israel."

Soviet Slave Tax on Jewish Professionals Denounced: "We thought that slavery was a thing of the past . . . All the righteous people of the world should join in protesting this decree - Golda Meir."

Other articles reported that while the Gross National Product showed an 8 1/2% increase over the previous yearly period and that tourism was running 30% ahead of 1971, the Government is "faced with a wide range of problems - many of them arising out of the continued war situation Some of Israel's social problems are related to the spiraling inflation and rising prices which particularly beset those in the low-income groups."

The press releases issued by the World Zionist Organization - American Section, Inc. were written on specific topics or events of interest to or concerning the activities of American Jews:

"Dr. Emanuel Neumann, Executive of the WZO and the Jewish Agency for Israel for 25 years and an active Zionist for over 50 years plans retirement from WZO-American Section. Often referred to as one of the architects of the State of Israel, Dr. Neumann played a major role in mobilizing American opinion in behalf of the Zionist State."

"152 Americans will attend the 28th World Zionist Congress as delegates when it opens on Tuesday evening, January 18th, in Jerusalem, with addresses by President Zalman Shazar and Louis A. Pincus, Chairman of the Executive of the WZO. . . . Among the leading American participants will be Dr. Emanuel Neumann, Chairman of the American Section of the WZO Executive, and Mrs. Charlotte Jacobson, member of the American Section of the WZO Executive."

"Students of Jewish schools in the United States are joining boys and girls in all lands outside Israel in writing a Torah Scroll for the President of Israel. The Scroll will be presented to President Zalman Shazar in 1973 as a tribute to his office. It will be housed in its own "Aron Hakodesh", a Holy Ark, in the "Bet Hanasi", the "White House" in Jerusalem."

"2,613 Americans are leaving this month (July) to spend some seven weeks to one year in intensive education programs sponsored by the Education and Culture Departments of the WZO, American Section."

Israel Information Services distributed a wide variety of booklets containing considerable substantive information about Israel during 1972.

JAMAICA

Jamaica Industrial Development

The material distributed by the Jamaica Industrial Development Corporation, a statutory board operating under the Jamaican Ministry of Trade, concentrated on the establishment of labor-intensive industries to meet the demands of the country's growing pool of skilled and semi-skilled labor. Considerable emphasis was also placed on attracting and developing industries in Jamaica with export potential. The booklet Jamaica-Island of Industrial Opportunity describes not only the superlative climate and location of this island but also sets out a comprehensive program of various industrial incentive and encouragement laws offered to promote industrial development. The mining of bauxite has been the strongest single influence in the transition of the economy from an agricultural to an industrial country. More than 200 new industries have been established in an effort to cope with heavy imports.

Economic Survey contained the following summary of Jamaican economic activity: "The Jamaican economy which for years has been under the expansionary influence of foreign-financed investments in Bauxite/Alumina, and Tourism sectors began to feel the effects of inevitable levelling off in these investments. Also with the lag between investment and output availability there has been a slow-down of productive activity as the lull in construction activity due in part to industrial unrest was not offset by increasing production elsewhere. While all sectors shared in the slower rate of advance, the usually leading thrusts of Mining and Tourism were lacking, but the recovery of Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing continued and the massive public school-building programme maintained some momentum in Construction."

A series of pamphlets on investment and other opportunities in Jamaica were disseminated during the year: "In Jamaica there are no death duties. In addition, there is a special body of incentive legislation for companies registering and doing business in Jamaica under the country's industrial development program." "A few years ago, the place to see and be seen here [Jamaica] was the Chamber of Commerce. But today, a better place is the Jamaican Association of Manufacturers." "Jamaica's hotel incentives program - still less than two years old - has spawned a \$50 million plus building boom. In addition to its tourist-oriented projects, Jamaica last year made steady, if modest progress in its vigorous efforts to promote foreign investment. Overall the situation is encouraging. Overseas companies continue to show confidence in expanding industrial operations on the island."

Most of the releases and booklets disseminated by the United States-Japan Trade Council, a Washington-based trade association, related to the United States trade deficit with Japan which reached \$3.2 billion in 1972, the greatest it has ever been and of serious concern to both countries. Vigorous efforts were made by Japan during the year (after the yen was revalued upward by 17% in relation to the dollar) to expand imports and curtail exports in order to reduce Japan's growing trade surplus and avoid a second yen revaluation. Quotas were removed on numerous items and greatly expanded on other items of major interest to the United States. Import financing was improved and interest rates lowered. Export incentives were ended and preferential export financing under which Japan's exports had been promoted since the end of World War II were totally abolished. The Council reported that Japan approved in principle the establishment of American company or citizen wholly-owned retail stores in Japan and December 1972 Montgomery Ward received approval for the establish-

ment of a 100% owned subsidiary. In a prepared statement to the Senate Foreign Commerce and Tourism Subcommittee of the Commerce Committee concerning Senate Bill S2754 "The Export Expansion Act of 1971" the Council congratulated the subcommittee for taking the initiative in considering constructive action to bolster the international competitiveness of the United States to upgrade its export expansion but stated, "The notion that import restrictions are the proper course to redress this country's international trade problems is short-sighted and economically self-defeating. The most logical economic approach is to expand American exports." In the same vein, the Council reported that "There is little evidence pointing to any quick or drastic change in the bilateral trade imbalance in the near future in spite of currency realignment, Japan's economic recovery, import liberalization, efforts to restrain Japanese exports and U.S. efforts to increase exports." As 1972 ended the consensus forecast of government and non-government experts for a major improvement in U.S. trade balance in 1973 is regarded by the United States-Japan Trade Council as too optimistic and the Council sees the U.S. trade deficit increasing due to "the continued demand for imports associated with the overall domestic U.S. economic boom and the short-term perverse impact of the dollar devaluation."

Releases and booklets distributed by the Council during 1972 covered a wide variety of subjects, including the following:

The Public Relations Board, Inc. disseminated trade releases on behalf of the Japan Trade Center, Chicago, some of which included articles on World Trade Week in Kansas City, Missouri and its "Salute to Japan" program wherein the concept of two-way trade was emphasized, and on the functions of the Japan Trade Center which through research, promotion, information and public relations extends benefits to businessmen on both import and export trade. Two issues of the magazine U.S./Japan Outlook, a digest of American views of Japan, contained such articles as The Japanese Economy and Can America Meet the Japanese Challenge? and Prime Minister Tanaka's The Path for a New Japan - Decision and Action, Peace and Welfare.

Ruder & Finn, New York, Texas and California, issued releases on behalf of the Japan Trade Center reporting on such items as Japan's participation in the Southeastern Fair and Exposition at Atlanta; the National Merchandise Show in New York where the combined exhibit of 21 companies made Japan's exhibit the largest; the New Tokyo International Airport and other items to promote Japanese tourism. The releases also reported on Japan's new economic policy to emphasize

better life at home and greater economic cooperation abroad. "More and more Japanese people have come to acknowledge that coordinating progress in harmony with the world economy is essential and necessary to the future development of the Japanese economy." Various leaders of industry in Japan report that the price of the dazzling speed of Japan's economic growth is the appalling pollution of its living environment at the sacrifice of such social needs as housing, schools, roads, hospitals, sewage systems and parts, and accordingly they report that the emphasis will be placed on government investments to build up social overhead capital in Japan instead of industries which have promoted past economic growth. On the U.S.-China re-approachment, the releases stated that Japan must seek its national security not by arms as it no longer has any use for militarism but by promoting good relations with the rest of the world.

Sydney S. Baron and Company distributed various releases and booklets on behalf of the Electronic Industries Association of Japan to state that import-export trade plays an important role in the United States maintaining its highest standard of living in the world.

H. William Tanaka on behalf of the Electronic Industries Association of Japan submitted a brief setting forth the Association's reasons why there is no basis for the assessment of countervailing duties against imports of various electronic products.

Arnold & Palmer & Noble issued press releases on behalf of Japan External Trade Organization regarding ways to improve trade between the United States and Japan setting out reasons why Japanese businessmen should invest in Montana and Nevada to increase exports to Japan from the United States.

The Japan Steel Information Center offered a film on foreign trade and the Japanese steel industry depicting the importance of this industry to the economic growth of Japan and the relation of the industry to United States-Japan trade.

Neeson International Corporation on behalf of the Japan Trade Center, San Francisco, issued press releases concerning the importance of exporting more products to Japan.

Daniels and Houlihan, on behalf of the Japan Lumber Importers Association, submitted a statement to the Senate Subcommittee on Forest Legislation for the removal of log export restrictions in the proposed Forest Lands Restoration and Protection Act.

MALAYSIA

Ruder & Finn, New York, distributed various material for the Government of Malaysia describing investment incentives to attract the international flow of private investment capital into Malaysia. Nine American electronics firms set up operations in Malaysia for the manufacture of electronic components and related products. To encourage foreign firms to invest, the Government of Malaysia offers several incentives, such as tax exemption periods ranging from four to ten years and free trade zone areas for factory operations.

Malaysia Industrial Digest featured such articles as:

Malaysia's determination to attract the international flow of private investment capital into the country has resulted in a stepping up of promotional activities abroad, both in the USA and Europe."

"Two areas in West Malaysia have been designated as free trade zones to cater to the needs of investors who wish to manufacture primarily for the export market."

"A total of 305 companies were granted approvals (with and without incentives) to establish manufacturing ventures last year . . . The number of new jobs to be created by the companies was 48,717 which is an increase of 1,485 over 1970. New capital investment amounted to over \$563 million."

A Strategy for Industrialization: "Malaysia has shaped its plans and worked out its strategies for the development of the Economy for the next five years. The blue print of this development is embodied in our Second Malaysia Plan which has two major objectives: 1) to eradicate poverty through raising income levels and increasing employment opportunities. 2) to restructure Malaysian society and hence correct economic imbalances among the various races and eventually eliminate the identification of race with economic function."

Labor Situation Conducive to Industrial Growth: The general availability of low cost and manageable labor is one of the more important points in Malaysia's favor in the competitive business of attracting overseas industrial investment. Indeed the Malaysian Government considers the creation of new employment one of the most important objectives under the Second Malaysian Plan and as such actively promotes the establishment of labor intensive industries. There is an abundance of actual and potential workers in Malaysia and the Ministry of Labor has estimated that there are about 150,000 job seekers both in the unskilled and semi-skilled categories at present readily available.

MEXICO

Ruder & Finn, New York, on behalf of the Government of Mexico reported "President Luis Echeverria's policy on foreign investment is to regulate foreign investment and orient it toward objectives that coincide with the country's plan for economic development . . . Mexico has no intention of hurting legitimate foreign interests or rejecting foreign investments." These remarks were made in reply to commentary published in the foreign press suggesting that the Echeverria Administration wants to "decree a general Mexicanization of foreign investments." Other releases concerning the attention focused on foreign investment in Mexico quotes President Echeverria: "Mexico has chosen the democratic path to development. We are striving to build an economic order that integrates all productive efforts and distributes the fruits of labor equitably. An economy shaped by all for all." Another release entitled Mexican Thesis on Foreign Investment states that ". . . foreign investment must not displace Mexican capital but should contribute to steady technological progress; it would, as well, export to its own markets and, above all, respect and obey national laws . . . This does not mean that we will not accept foreign capital to be invested in those fields allowed by our laws. We accept it gladly, but only in a balanced relation to our own investment. What we want . . . is for Mexicans to be partners, not the employees of foreign capital: co-participants and friends, not subordinates."

Other releases report the economic progress and social gains of the Mexican people and the Administration's program for sweeping fiscal reforms for redistribution of the wealth.

Rouss & O'Rourke on behalf of the National Association of Sugar Producers of Mexico addressed a statement to various members of the House of Representatives enclosing an article in the August 1972 issue of Sugar y Azucar, a sugar trade magazine, featuring several aspects of the Mexican sugar industry. Estimates were made that the 1972-1973 Mexican sugar making campaign will produce approximately 2,600,000 metric tons of sugar, an increase of some 300,000 tons over last year. Particular attention was directed to the programs and achievements during the first eighteen months of the Mexican National Sugar Commission.

During 1972 Warren Weil Public Relations disseminated press releases on behalf of the Colon Free Zone. The expansion program to erect a new 500,000 square-foot warehouse with related distribution services was described as one "which will be instrumental in providing for the continued growth of the Free Zone at no less than its annual growth rate of 15% to 20%." The releases state that not only are the warehousing facilities being expanded but increased emphasis is placed on raising the skills of Free Zone workers in such operations as data processing, accounting and credit procedures and by investing in people the Free Zone will continue to effectively serve the needs of international business in Latin America. The releases report that an economic development consulting firm's in-depth study forecasts a steadily escalating growth in the Free Zone in the coming decade and "an increase of approximately 100% over the current figure." Because of the Free Zone's central location and the economy and speed of air transport, the survey-study points out by operating from a centrally located stockpile it will become increasingly attractive as a competitive advantage. At present more than 60 business firms conduct operations in the Free Zone either manufacturing, processing, warehousing or packaging such diverse articles as pharmaceuticals, photographic supplies, electronics, laboratory and surgical equipment, autos and automotive parts, tobacco, liquor, and office equipment. The releases point out the tax advantages of doing business in the Free Zone with protection against tax changes guaranteed up to 20 years in contracts between the Zone and foreign companies, with no local or municipal taxes or taxes on invested capital with exports of products manufactured in the Zone exempt from all taxes for 25 years. In addition to a specific forecast of steadily escalating growth in the Free Zone the survey-study also noted a major impact on Panama's national economy to be expected as a direct result. The study estimates that the contribution by the Free Zone by 1981 to the nation's Gross Domestic Product will approach \$75 million - an increase of approximately 100 percent over the current figure. An even larger contribution is expected toward the balance of payments where an increase is predicted of approximately three times the current figure or \$120 million by 1981. Currently the Free Zone accounts for about 4% of all Latin American imports of the products that it handles and this share is expanding. The survey predicts that the Free Zone's market share will probably increase to 5.5% by 1981. This implies a rate of growth of exports from the Free Zone to Latin America of 11.7 percent.

PORTUGAL

Casa de Portugal's Portuguese language Noticias e Factos was issued 242 times in 1972 and contained short news items on current events distributed to radio stations, libraries, schools and private individuals. The English language News and Facts was also disseminated by Casa de Portugal in 14 issues throughout the year. These issues were primarily reprints of letters or speeches by prominent Portuguese officials. An October issue contained a speech of the Portuguese Foreign Minister in the United Nations in repudiation of a resolution approved by the United Nations Security Council criticizing activities in Portuguese territories: "The conclusion to be drawn from the manner in which the anti-Portuguese campaign has been conducted in the United Nations is that it is sought not to secure the self-determination of the populations of the Portuguese overseas provinces in Africa, but to impose on Portugal, under the pretext of self-determination, a policy which is equivalent of having the matter determined by foreigners." The development of the overseas provinces in the past decade in Angola and Mozambique is highlighted: "Laws governing foreign investment in the overseas provinces are the same as those which apply to metropolitan Portugal. Among the advantages offered for new investment are tax exemption for up to ten years, exemptions from customs duties on capital goods and raw materials, and a high priority for transfer of capital and profits."

Portugal An Informative Review, a monthly magazine on economics, politics and the overseas provinces, featured:

Pollution: "Portugal is one of the twelve European countries to sign the Oslo agreement to prevent sea pollution by planes and ships. The pact was signed by Germany, Belgium, Great Britain, Denmark, Finland, France, Iceland, Holland, Portugal, Spain, Sweden and Norway and it covers both the territorial waters of the signatories and the high seas."

Mozambique: "With a population of about 7.5 millions and a land area of 784,000 square kilometers, Mozambique is potentially economically rich as regards raw materials and possesses natural conditions which favor the development of transports and tourism. In these respects the province is richer than in population resources."

African Provinces: "The Portuguese overseas territories cannot be considered colonies or distinct units intended to serve as the traditional economic exploitation; they are in fact integral parts of the same Nation, subject to the same sovereignty and having a common destiny to fulfil. Contrary to what has been widely stated Portugal does not reject the principle of self-determination. To reject it would be to deny the essential dignity of Man, and Portugal has always shown the greatest respect for the human being."

Other booklets issued by Casa de Portugal include: Portugal - Any More Questions?, Portugal - Today, Portugal - A Decade of Progress, Cabora Bassa On the Move and Portugal's Reasons for Remaining in the Overseas Provinces.

Downs & Roosevelt, Inc. on behalf of the Overseas Companies of Portugal disseminated publications entitled: Portugal: Mainland and Overseas and Fact Sheet on Portugal. These publications report on major political, social and economic changes in Portugal and the provinces such as a new lower middle class, working families with motor cars, better fed and better dressed people, increased educational and social services, new manufacturing and service industries, and a notable increase in political expression. In Portuguese Africa some of the advances reported include the development of Angola oil and iron ore, a 400 per cent rise in exports, the Cunene River hydroelectric system and a 500 per cent rise in primary education and in Mozambique, Africa's largest dam Cabora Bassa on the Zambezi River will be the fifth largest hydroelectric power system in the world and "will have tremendous impact on the economic and social development in opening up untapped mineral deposits in the interior and offering cheap power to surrounding countries. Concerning an alleged "slave labor" complaint in the African province filed by Ghana, the January issue of Mainland and Overseas reported that the commission appointed by the International Labor Organization to investigate the charges reported "no evidence to substantiate the complaint but it drew attention to the far-reaching changes which had occurred in Portuguese policy, legislation and practice."

Fact Sheet covered such subjects as "Relations between the Government of the United States and Portugal have reached the most favorable level in recent years since the signing of the new agreement on use by the U.S. Air Force of the air base at Lagos in the Azores." "The coffee plant in Angola long grew wild and unrecognized before it finally was identified by the Portuguese as a plant which had been under cultivation in Brazil since 1727. The growth of coffee production was rather slow throughout the 19th century but the export figure reached 11,066 tons in 1895. However, as a result of overproduction of Brazilian coffee and the increase in production of Angolan rubber, coffee exports declined to 3,204 tons in 1916. Since then coffee exports have increased gradually but steadily."

Rhodesian Viewpoint is a 4 page monthly newsletter disseminated by the Rhodesian Information Office on behalf of the Government of Rhodesia commenting on among other things, Rhodesian independence, economic development and the sanctions which have been imposed on Rhodesian exports. Much of the material in this publication consisted of quotations from British and American newspapers citing in its January 18, 1972 issue the Sunday Mail (Great Britain) statement of British Prime Minister Edward Heath that Rhodesians should be left alone while they expressed their opinion about proposals to settle the constitutional dispute which has persisted between Great Britain and Rhodesia for the past six years. Concerning democracy in Africa its March 14, 1972 issue quoted an excerpt from the San Francisco Examiner which suggested that "the plight of the blacks in Rhodesia would command more sympathy if the death rate of democracy in the rest of black Africa was not so high If Rhodesia's blacks were granted the dream of one-man-one-vote it would not be likely to result in government of the people by the people. The sorry history of self-government in Africa is one-man-one-vote-one-time and then one-man rule and one-party dictatorship Even Ghana has gone and done it again - the second military take-over in the African nation that was voted most likely to succeed at democracy."

In relation to the embargo the United States placed on Rhodesian chrome, Viewpoint reported a dispatch from the March 3, 1972 Chicago Tribune which stated "The United States is almost alone, among all the nations that joined in the United Nations pact, in its rigid compliance with its terms. Chrome ore is flowing out of Rhodesia, according to reliable reports, to Russia, which is collecting huge profits as a result of the monopoly it enjoys. Japan has substantially reduced its chrome imports from Russia, leading to the deduction that it may be buying from Rhodesia. The embargo has had no effect, politically or economically, on Rhodesia, which is more prosperous than when it declared its independence of Britain more than four years ago."

The November 1, 1972 issue of Viewpoint quotes a Washington Star-News editorial writer concerning United States and the recognition of Rhodesia: "The choice in Rhodesia is not between an authoritarian white majority regime and a black democracy. The choice, if the track record elsewhere in Africa means anything, is between an imperfect regime dominated by whites - and a chaotic situation from which, with luck, a not-too-repressive black dictatorship might

emerge. . . . The time has come for the United States to cut the hypocrisy and recognize Rhodesia. Our diplomats are breaking bread every day with far worse than the likes of Ian Smith."

The September 8, 1972 issue of Viewpoint comments on the Rhodesian Team's ouster from the Olympic Games and quotes an editorial in the Washington Star-News "An unpleasant aspect of Rhodesia's expulsion is that some of the countries that helped bring it about are no paragons of racial tolerance. A spectacular example is Uganda whose government is engaged in the blatantly racist business of kicking out a great many residents of Asian origin. Many other countries that have followed policies unworthy of international respect are unquestioned in their right to send athletes to the Olympics . . ."

In commenting on the United States Senate vote approving the continuance of imports of Rhodesian chrome and other critical and strategic materials, the June 12, 1972 issue of Viewpoint quoted from an editorial in the San Diego Union "Support for the McGee Amendment is based on repugnance at a political structure in Rhodesia which clearly is calculated to limit the role of the black population in the government If we begin demanding that our trading partners run their countries according to the principles of our Constitution, we might soon be trading with no one but ourselves."

Rhodesian Commentary is an 8 page monthly publication of Immigration and Tourism, Rhodesian Ministry of Information, containing articles on developments and events concerning Rhodesia. Some of the topics discussed included expansion of Rhodesia Railways, new tourist resorts, medical care and health services, agricultural production programs, record mining production and sustained progress in the Lowveld.

Also disseminated by the Rhodesian Information Office were copies of speeches made by officials of government in the United States concerning such subjects as "Rhodesia's Independence and the United Nations" and "Report of the Pearce Commission."

The booklets disseminated by the Rhodesian Information Office included discussions of such topics as tourism, recreation, economics, sociology, politics and education: "The Man and His Ways", "Rhodesia in Brief", "Rhodesia", "A Judge's Thoughts", "African Education", "The African Times Special Issue on Rhodesia", "Employment in Rhodesia", "A People's Progress" and "Rhodesian Scene."

The publications of the Information Service of South Africa, on behalf of the Government of South Africa, contained articles on current domestic and international issues as well as historical and background information on the peoples of South Africa.

News From South Africa, a bi-weekly, 4 page newsletter carried news stories datelined at such principal South African cities as Johannesburg, Cape Town, Pretoria and Durban, on such varying issues as the decision to devalue the South African rand "to give South Africa exports a substantial advantage in world markets", the rising toy manufacturing industry in South Africa, the expected sharp rise in world diamond and gold jewelry sales, and the means being undertaken to promote environmental control of waterways, smoke and industrial pollution. News was discontinued with the February 25, 1972 issue and the summaries of events and news were incorporated thereafter in South African Scope.

Scope is a monthly 12 page magazine which carried in more complete form the news-related articles and features of South Africa including articles dealing with: South Africa's First National Trade Fair; Bantu Investment Corporation of South Africa and its assistance in commercial and industrial undertakings; the benefits being obtained from the advancement of veterinary science in South Africa; the expansion of university facilities for increased higher educational opportunities; consumer safety standards; the role of Americans in the early development of South Africa and feature stories on South Africa's leading cities, such as "Johannesburg, the Golden City."

Lantern, a quarterly magazine of cultural and scientific affairs, contained a diversified selection of articles on art, education, music and the theatre in South Africa and also featured stories on famous cities in Western Europe.

South African Panorama, a large monthly full-color pictorial magazine of news articles and features on South Africa, reviewed a variety of subjects including the highway system; educational advancement; wild life reserves; medical and dental advances; the theatre and ballet; industrial development; recreation and travel facilities; African precious gems and the role of South Africans in the sports world.

African Institute Bulletin, a 40 page monthly, focused on the social, economic and political development of the entire African continent. In the July 1972 issue, commenting on Rhodesia after the Pearce Commission's rejection of the proposals made for settling the constitutional dispute between Rhodesia and Great Britain, stated "In sum, the collapse of the settlement between Britain and Rhodesia would seem to indicate that the economic development of Black Rhodesia will not be as rapid as it would have been if the proposals had been implemented and that the political objective of eventual Black rule will be more distant now." The April 1972 issue devoted the entire issue to Malawi and its development, with most emphasis placed on agriculture, and the vast number of projects undertaken and the various countries involved in financing and implementing those projects. The October 1972 issue contained the article "Red Onslaught on Southern Africa" which reports that "Communist China has concentrated on penetration of two militant African states which are key countries in the campaign against Southern Africa. They are Tanzania and Zambia, both of which have governments committed to active support of terrorist movements which they harbor in their capitols." Another article is "Africa's Impact on the U.N." which states that "Africa has changed the United Nations - something probably not anticipated in their wildest dreams by the European architects of that Organization. Today the independent African states (even the poor mini states) are exercising a political influence which is out of all proportion with their real international status They have used their voting strength in concert with those of ideological allies in Asia and, on certain issues Communist countries, to change the make-up of the U. N. radically and to swing the balance on such issues as Red China's admission to the world Organization."

The Information Service of South Africa disseminated numerous other publications throughout 1972 but on no regular basis concerning matters of general importance to South Africa but not necessarily news-related. Included in these publications were books, booklets and reprints covering such subjects as:

"South African Tradition" (survey of culture and art); "Community Development" (accommodations for the underprivileged in the different population groups); "South African Progress" (184 page book on industrial advances during 1972); "Art in Africa (survey of art from ancient rock age to contemporary); "New Era of Bantu Progress" (profiles of Bantu leadership); "Owambo" (full-color book concerning progress against a background of climate and geographical disadvantages) and "A Visual History of South Africa" (150 page yearly record of South Africa's evolving history prepared for students.)

Also disseminated was a reprint of a news article quoting a speech made by former Secretary of State Dean Acheson which concludes with "If the United States does intend eventually to try to coerce South Africa out of South West Africa, it is following a path to high and gratuitous folly."

The Swedish Information Service on behalf of the Swedish Government disseminated several publications throughout the United States in 1972. Some in English and others in the Swedish language. News from Sweden and the Swedish language edition of Nyheter fran Sverige contained articles on current events of general interest, some of which included the following.

Business Upturn "Sweden's economy was very much the issue when Parliament reconvened for the fall session (1972) with varying views as to the nation's business climate Sweden's largest commercial bank observed in a report in late September that the economic upturn is still in an initial stage and that unemployment remains high. It said, however, as a positive feature that the private consumption is relatively brisk and deliveries from the manufacturing industry are increasing, and incoming orders are steadily rising."

The Swedish American Chamber of Commerce, 2-3 page Newsletter contained short, current, economic articles relating to trade between the United States and Sweden. The February 4th issue urges all members of the Chamber "to voice opposition to the Burke-Hartke Bill which would impose a complex network of restrictions on trade and investment in foreign countries. On pollution, the September 22nd issue stated that "United States companies have recently showed considerable interest in acquiring pollution control companies in Sweden . . . Spending for pollution control in Sweden has increased lately partly because of Government subsidies given in order to increase economic activity." Other issues state that Sweden's trade with the United States increased rapidly during January - July period of 1972, and statistics quote a 26 year record from 1946-1971 showing that each year the United States exports to Sweden exceeded United States imports from that country.

Other items of interest to the Chamber were included in articles entitled: "The Swedish Economy", "Hopes High for Stable U. S. Growth", "Fighting Protectionism" and " U.S. Dock Strike."

News-Tibet, published at 2 to 4 month intervals, was distributed by the New York office of the representative of His Holiness, the Dalai Lama of Tibet. The March-June issue contained a statement of the Dalai Lama to commemorate the thirteenth anniversary of the Tibetan national uprising against Communist China: "The past period of over a decade has been a time of great test for the people of Tibet, especially for those who are still the victims of this monstrous and alien onslaught on the very way of life that Tibetans cherished When we see the determination of the people; the national awareness of the youth; and the growing support of our cause, we can see that the future of Tibet is not dark."

Most of the material distributed denounced the conditions under which Tibetans live under Communist Chinese rule: "Scores of people are starving, committing suicide, executed or imprisoned to almost certain death in Tibet while China freshly garbed in its United Nations mantle of respectability continues to harp upon 'peaceful coexistence' and a 'thriving scene of socialism in Tibet.'"

The Office of Tibet also disseminated a statement by the representative of the Tibetan Community in Exile rejecting Chinese statements in the United Nations against India and claims over Tibet and reiterating that the national uprising in 1959 and the resulting exodus of thousands of Tibetan refugees over the Himalayas into India and neighboring countries is wholly due to Chinese action which forced Tibetans to seek asylum elsewhere to continue their struggle for independence. "Whether our Government headed by His Holiness the Dalai Lama enjoys popular support or not by the Tibetan people both inside and outside Tibet can be proved only by an immediate plebiscite in Tibet under impartial and international supervision."

TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

The literature disseminated by the Trinidad and Tobago Industrial Development Corporation during 1972 discussed the investment climate in Trinidad and Tobago and the incentives offered by the Government of Trinidad and Tobago for establishing manufacturing industries and hotels there.

Concerning the establishment of such industries as garment manufacturing and electronics manufacturing the literature states: "For qualified manufacturers the Trinidad and Tobago Industrial Development Corporation offers industrial incentives that include subsidized training programs, duty-free imports, a five-year income tax holiday, etc. Equally important, the IDC serves as a one-step information center on all aspects of a projected operation: factory space, labor recruitment, freight rates, tariff structures, export-import procedures and the location of experienced and knowledgeable local private enterprise or government partners."

Tourist related investments are actively encouraged: "Not only cause Trinidad and Tobago offer the traditional Caribbean appeals of sun, sand and serenity but because it has additional attractive qualities: the creativity and originality of its people and its racial mixture that has been rightly described as 'the world in miniature' . . . and the Trinidad and Tobago Government has designed a number of special incentives analogous to those in the manufacturing field for this type of activity."

The monthly Newsletter contains short news stories of the progress of various companies on Trinidad and Tobago and the assistance given to them by the Industrial Development Corporation establishing and promoting the development of small businesses as well as major industries. The Newsletter also focused on obtaining foreign investment as "Trinidad and Tobago is in the strongest position for economic growth of any Caribbean nation" and such items as the new discoveries of oil and natural gas off the southeast coast.

Moscow News, a small sized weekly 16 page English language newspaper contained articles on all topics of current interest to the Soviet Union and tells "Everything about the life of the Soviet people, the achievements of Soviet economy, science and engineering, about Soviet foreign policy, and cultural and sporting events, about the USSR's multiple contacts with foreign countries, and many other things" The full texts of the more important official documents on questions of the foreign and home policies of the USSR, speeches by Soviet statesmen as well as theoretical articles on various problems are published in supplements to the Moscow News. The following are representative of the important articles published in the 1972 issues of Moscow News.

Summit Meeting "The talks between the Soviet leaders and the President of the United States Richard M. Nixon during his visit to the USSR from May 22 - 30, 1972, and the joint documents signed in the course of the talks, are of great international significance and constitute an essential step in the development of Soviet-American relations, promoting the principal of peaceful coexistence of states with different social systems, the peace and security of the peoples."

Soviet-Syrian Relations "The problems of Soviet-Syrian relations and the prospects for developing them further in Party, political, economic, cultural and other spheres, as well as up-to-date problems of the international situation of our times were discussed and considered in an atmosphere of friendship and mutual understanding."

Soviet-Egyptian Relations "The Soviet side shares the opinion of Egypt and other Arab states that in conditions of Israel's stubborn rejection of a just political settlement of the Middle East conflict on the basis of the Security Council Resolution No. 242 the Arab states have every reason to use every means at their disposal for the liberation of the Arab territories seized by Israel in 1967 and ensuring the legitimate rights of the Arab countries and peoples, including the Arab people of Palestine."

Bangladesh "The Soviet Union firmly sided with the liberation struggle of East Bengal from the very outset The people of Bangladesh are not alone in their struggle for a better future. This is illustrated by the Moscow agreements on economic and technical cooperation between the USSR and Bangladesh concerning the construction of industrial and other projects, and also urgent assistance of the people of Bangladesh in the rehabilitation of their vital industries."

Environmental Protection "Major work has been done in the USSR on the conservation of nature The USSR was the first country in the world which laid down the limits on the permissible concentration of harmful substances in the atmosphere. It was forbidden in the Soviet Union to put new industrial projects into operation before the purifying installations were completed."

Vietnam "Loyal to the principles of proletarian internationalism, the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, the Government of the USSR and all Soviet people will continue to give the necessary assistance and support to the Vietnamese people in their just struggle against American aggression, for the freedom and independence of their country."

Middle East "The Israeli military are trying to explain their latest barbaric actions as a reprisal for the tragic events in Munich, at the Olympic Games The connecting of hostilities launched against neighboring countries with an act of terrorism committed in Munich is a gross violation of international law. The new military provocations by Israel provide fresh evidence of the desire of the Tel Aviv 'hawks' to impose their aggressive plans upon the Arab countries and to force them to capitulate."

Decision of the 24th CPSU Congress "The Leninist policy of peace and of strengthening freedom and security of peoples, outlined by the 24th CPSU Congress, and reflected in a number of consistent, practical actions undertaken by our Party and Government, is meeting with ever greater support among the world public."

Sputnik, a monthly paperback digest patterned in size and format similar to the Readers Digest, in 1972 contained among others, articles on such subjects as: "Holiday Making in the Soviet Union", "The Great Trans-Siberian Railway", "Disarmament-Ideal of Socialism", "The Records Come Thick and Fast", "Towards a Classless Society", "How to Keep your Heart Healthy", "Younger Generation in the Soviet", "The Job of a Communist" and "The Russians are the Best Trading Partners in the World."

Soviet Film is a color illustrated monthly magazine devoted entirely to the Soviet Film Industry.

Soviet Military Review, a monthly magazine in its 7th year published articles solely about the Soviet military, its past, present and future.

Soviet Union is a monthly magazine covering political, economic, cultural, medical, sports and other topics.

Other publications from the Soviet Union distributed by various registrants included Pravda, Izvestia, Soviet Woman, New Times, International Affairs and Twentieth Century and Peace.

China Books and Periodicals, as an agent of Xunhasaba, Hanoi, Vietnam, disseminated during 1972 four publications about Vietnam on a regular basis along with various booklets.

Vietnam Courier formerly a weekly newspaper published in Hanoi was published monthly beginning in June 1972 and reported current events in Vietnam and world happenings as they affected Vietnam. The central theme of all literature distributed was the war in Indochina: "Over the past four years, the valiant and undaunted Vietnamese people have stepped up their just struggle on the military, political and diplomatic fronts and have recorded unprecedented victories, especially since Spring 1972, thus inflicting a very important setback on the 'Vietnamazation' policy"; "The Thieu Regime on Trial-Corruption is rampant in the army, especially among the top brass. . . . In the provinces, officials levy their own agricultural taxes and to this end go on regular tours of inspection Thieu has always been and will always remain the performer of a policy conceived and elaborated in its smallest details by Washington. When he opposes peace, this means that Washington wants to continue the war."

"South Vietnam - Military Situation July 1972. On the battlefield never has the Saigon command seen its troops so demoralized: desertions, surrenders and mutinies have multiplied in crack divisions of the Saigon strategic reserves, whole units have refused to fight, taken to flight or surrendered at first contact with the liberation forces."

"Vietnam - Chile. The movement in Chile of support to Vietnam has grown even stronger since the American bombing of Haiphong, Hanoi and other populous regions of North Vietnam, and the mining of territorial waters. The decision of the Chilean Government to establish diplomatic relations with the DRVN at this time is a precious support and encouragement to the Vietnamese people."

Most of the articles published in Vietnam Pictorial included photos of various phases of Vietnam activity in the war in Indochina and in such general topics as education, political activity, farming, mining and other industries. The war was the major theme.

"Building Roads - When they heard about old militiamen at Hoang Hoa shooting down American aircraft, the old folks here decided to emulate them by building a road."

"Vietnam's agriculture is developing - The achievements recorded by North Vietnam's agriculture stem from the Vietnam Worker's Party's correct line and the imaginative guidance of the DRVN Ministry of Agriculture. They would surely be much bigger, had it not been for the U. S. aggression. In the difficult years of the Vietnamese people, Vietnamese women were not only excellent farmers, but valiant defenders of the Fatherland as well."

South Vietnam in Struggle is an 8 page bi-weekly published in Hanoi by the Central Organ of the South Vietnam National Front for Liberation. Its articles during 1972 concerned the war in South Vietnam: "So long as the U.S. pursues its 'Vietnamization' of the war policy, the South Vietnamese people are resolved to frustrate it and the neo-colonialist policy of the U.S." Other articles published during the year included such statements as ". . . if the American side does not want meaningful talks and intends to cancel what has been agreed on and start again from the beginning its dirty aggression, the Vietnamese people will carry on their battle until independence, freedom and peace are achieved." "Our entire nation is a block of iron will. We are fighting successfully . . . our people will conclude the war with still higher gains."

During 1972, five volumes of booklets were distributed on behalf of Xunhasaba, Hanoi and included:

A Historic Victory of the Lao Patriotic Forces

They Work and Fight: Vietnam Federation of Trade Unions

The principal purpose of Congress in enacting the Foreign Agents Registration Act was to require public disclosure by persons engaging in propaganda activities and other activities for or on behalf of foreign governments, foreign political parties, and other foreign principals, so that the Government and the people of the United States may be informed of the identity of such persons and may appraise their statements and actions in the light of their associations and activities. The emphasis of the Department of Justice in its administration of the statute has been toward the achievement of this purpose. In performing its functions, the Department has continued to rely upon its normal sources of information and upon the investigative efforts of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Registration under the Act does not imply recognition by the United States Government either of the de jure existence or legality of the foreign principal, nor does registration indicate approval of the United States Government of the propaganda material disseminated or of the activities of the registered agent.
