Dear Mr. Chairman:

This letter presents the views of the Department of Justice on H.R. 728, the "Title VIII Nursing Workforce Reauthorization Act of 2019." As we explain below, the bill raises a constitutional concern.

Section 4 of H.R. 728 would authorize appropriations for fiscal years 2020–2024 for the workforce-diversity program established by 42 U.S.C. § 296m. Under that program, the Secretary of Health and Human Services "may award grants . . . and enter into contracts . . . to increase nursing education opportunities for individuals who are from disadvantaged backgrounds (including racial and ethnic minorities underrepresented among registered nurses)" by, for example, providing "student scholarships or stipends," "pre-entry preparation," and "advanced education preparation." 42 U.S.C. § 296m(a). Because the workforce-diversity program allocates benefits on the basis of race or ethnicity, section 4 would be subject to strict scrutiny. See Adarand Constructors, Inc. v. Pena, 515 U.S. 200, 235 (1995). For section 4 to survive that scrutiny, the Government would need to show that the provision is narrowly tailored to serve a compelling governmental interest. Id. Whether the Government could make that showing would depend, in part, on the legislative record that the Congress developed. We are not in a position to evaluate the legislative record and therefore express no opinion on the ultimate constitutionality of section 4.
