20 **I. PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE DAMAGE TO GOVERNMENT PROPERTY**

16 **G. Count Seven: Crater Lake National Park**

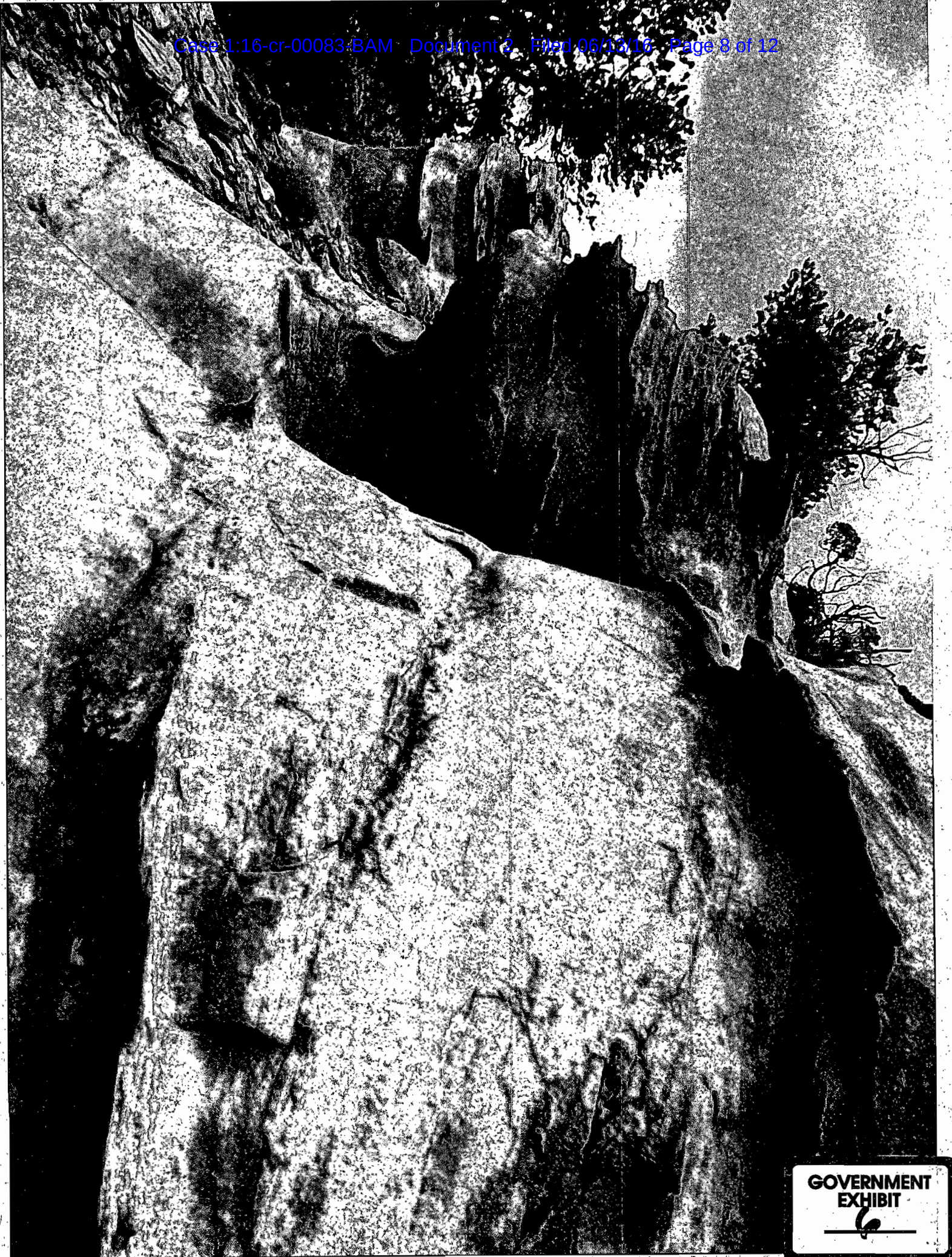

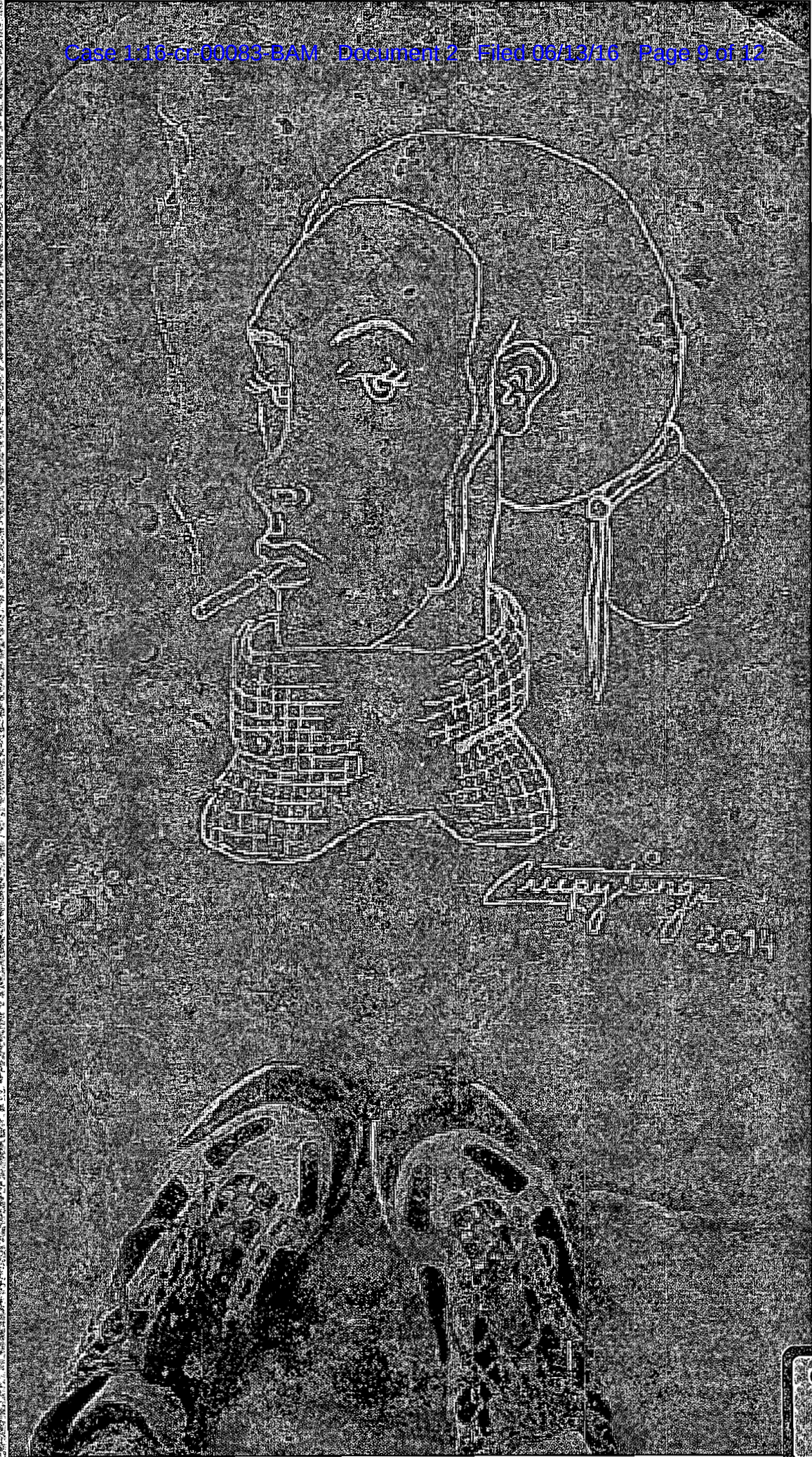

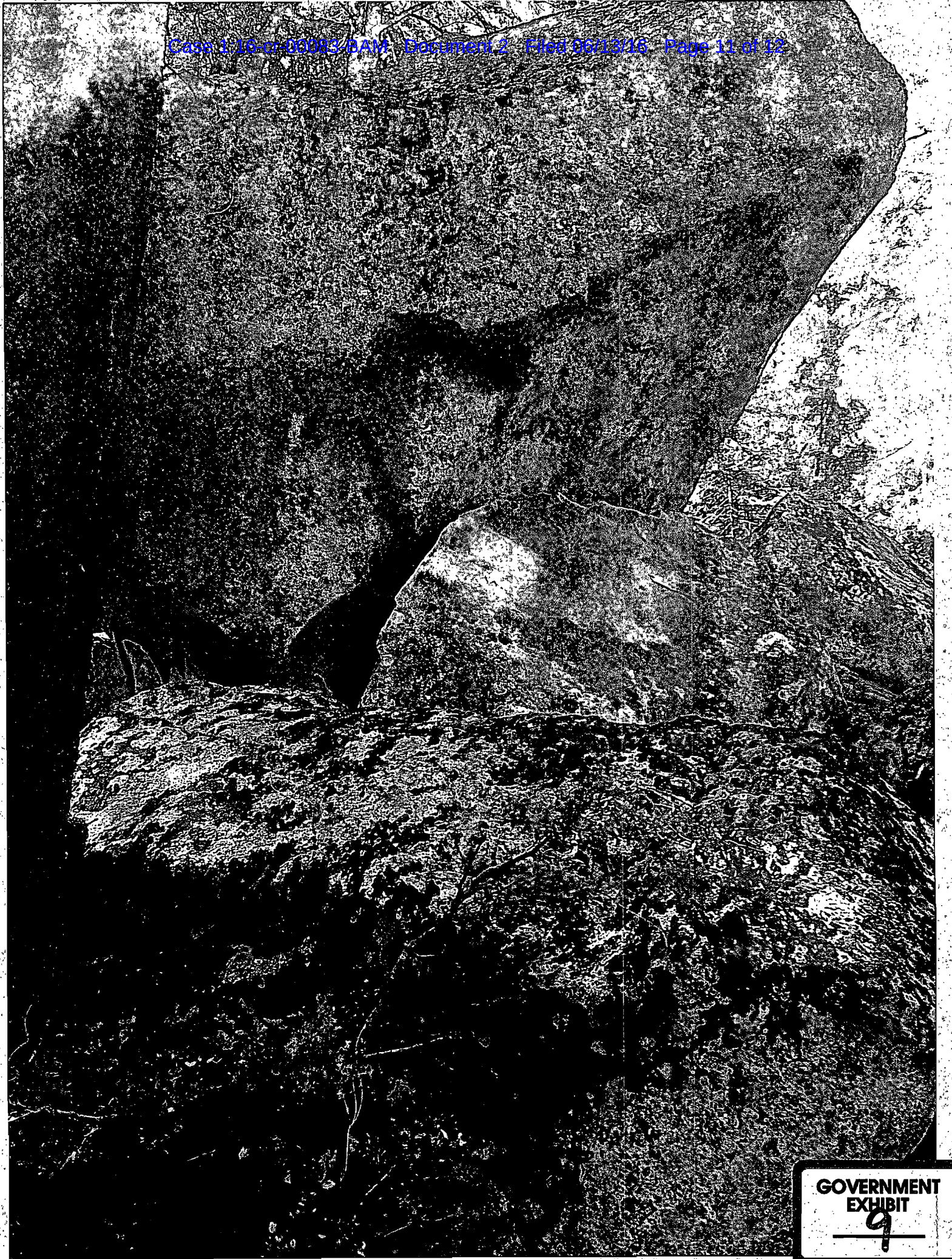
