**FACTUAL BASIS** 

The defendant, KEISHAN WILSON, has agreed to plead guilty to embezzling mail she was entrusted to handle and process at the New Orleans distribution center during her employment with the United States Postal Service.

Should this matter have proceeded to trial, the United States would have proven, through the introduction of competent testimony and admissible evidence, the following facts, beyond a reasonable doubt, to support the allegations in the indictment.<sup>1</sup>


Overview of Offense

In July 2020, Postal Police at the New Orleans Processing and Distribution Center notified the United States Postal Service, Office of Inspector General ("OIG") that greeting cards were rifled through and discovered discarded at the processing center. In response to the Postal Police complaint, OIG set up a covert surveillance operation at the New Orleans mail processing and distribution center on or about July 23, 2020.

During the surveillance operation, KEISHAN WILSON ("WILSON"), a postal employee and mail handler, was observed removing greeting cards, she had been entrusted to

handle, from letter trays placed in the induction system for processing and distribution. The surveillance operation confirmed WILSON was responsible for embezzling, rifling through, and then discarding greeting cards at the processing center.



In summary, all of the evidence introduced at trial would have established the elements of the offense and proven the defendant's guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
