INFORMATION

The defendant having waived in open court prosecution by Indictment, the United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey charges:

From in or around June 2021 through in or around July 2022, within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the United States, and elsewhere, the defendant,

SAVIER CERVANTES,

who was arrested in the District of New Jersey within the meaning of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3238, did knowingly and intentionally conspire with others to import into the United States, from a place outside thereof, including Colombia, a mixture and substance containing a detectable amount of cocaine, a Schedule II controlled substance, contrary to Title 21, United States Code, Sections 952(a), 960(a)(1), and 960(b)(3).

In violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 963.

FORFEITURE ALLEGATION

Upon conviction of the controlled substance offense in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 963, the defendant,

SAVIER CERVANTES.

shall forfeit to the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853, any and all property constituting or derived from any proceeds the defendant obtained directly or indirectly as a result of the offense charged in the Information, and any and all property used or intended to be used in any manner or part to commit and to facilitate the commission of such offense.

SUBSTITUTE ASSETS PROVISION

If any of the above-described forfeitable property, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

- (a) cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
- (b) has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third person;
- (c) has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the Court;
- (d) has been substantially diminished in value; or
- (e) has been commingled with other property which cannot be subdivided without difficulty,

it is the intent of the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p), to seek forfeiture of any other property of the defendant up to the value of the above-described forfeitable property.
