This presentation will cover the production of black tar heroin in Mexico, transportation methods to Charlotte, the operation of heroin cells in the USA, efforts to dismantle these cells, and the heroin situation throughout Western North Carolina. Additionally, how heroin abuse attacks the community beyond the users themselves and a snapshot of Charlotte heroin trends highlighted by a case study and crime analysis techniques that have provided the best results in federal and state investigations.
