In that false income tax return, he stated that his taxable income for the calendar year was \$30,394, and that the amount of tax due and owing thereon was \$4,019. In fact, as he then and there knew, his taxable income for the calendar year was \$182,410, and the amount of tax owing to the United States of America was \$62,425.

All in violation of Title 26, United States Code, Section 7201.

COUNT THREE: (26 U.S.C. § 7201 - Tax Evasion)

On or about April 17, 2007, in the Northern District of California, the defendant,

HUGH LESLIE BARAS,

then a resident of Berkeley, California, did willfully attempt to evade and defeat a part of the income tax due and owing by him to the United States of America for the calendar year 2006, by preparing and causing to be prepared, and by signing and causing to be signed, a false and fraudulent U.S. Individual Income Tax Return, Form 1040, which was filed with the Internal Revenue Service.
