Proof of Identification and Social Security Number Required at §341(a) Meeting of Creditors

Beginning with cases filed on March 1, 202, the United States Trustee requires bankruptcy debtors to provide, at the meeting of creditors, satisfactory proof of identity and proof of social security number. Debtors will need to bring both picture ID and proof of social security number to the §341(a) Meeting of Creditors.

Individual debtors must bring to their meeting of creditors 1) a photo ID and 2) proof of their social security number. The following **original** documents are acceptable:

Photo ID: Original Documents Are Required

- (1) a valid driver's license
- (2) a government ID
- (3) a state picture ID
- (4) a student ID
- (5) a United States passport
- (6) a military ID
- (7) a resident alien card
- (8) Mexican consulate card ("matricula consular")

Proof of SSN: Original Documents Are Required

- (1) a social security card
- (2) a medical insurance card that includes the debtor's SSN
- (3) a pay stub
- (4) a W-2 Form
- (5) an IRS Form 1099
- (6) a Social Security Administration report.
